Addendum No. 2
To the Request for Proposal

1. Attached is a list of all businesses who have expressed an interest in the contract to date (Attachment 1).
2. CalRecycle is issuing Addendum 2 that includes a revised RFP dated November 12, 2020 due to the significant number of changes. The RFP has been revised with corrections where text additions are displayed in **bold** and underlined and text deletions are displayed in strikethrough text (i.e., strike). This RFP will replace the previous RFP in its entirety.
3. The following questions were received during the Questions and Answers period.
 - Q1 When hazard trees are cut, they typically break apart (branches, main stem, etc.) and do not leave distinct logs. On pages 63 and 64 of RFP, there are requirements to "track each log to a specific truck" or "track each log to an end-use facility." If the logs don't exist, will CalRecycle please explain expectations? Typically, the trees on a given lot, cumulation of trees, can be tracked to specific trucks and the trucks to end-use facilities. Is that sufficient? This is not a typical timber harvest for logs so the tracking should reflect tracking the ID of hazard trees (the cumulation of unique IDs can be tracked to a list of trucks then the trucks to the end use facility – but not by "log").
 - A1 It is the Crew Leader's responsibility to track trees felled and other tree material from beginning to end per Attachment J. Exhibit A., (p.63) Item (6.)(H.), Hazard Tree Removal Function, D. 1.) "CLs (Crew Leaders) will be responsible for keeping hazard trees felled on ROWs and private properties (APNs) separate throughout all phases of the operation including felling, hauling, processing and end use. The slash from these two sources of trees must also be kept separate and reported as such...2)The CL will document...all hazard trees removed, to include the following items:...d)Truck number on which each tree was placed and transported to the Log Storage/processing Yard or End Use Facility."
 - Q2 On the price bid sheet, the two asterisks indicate a not-to-exceed amount per category (for most roles, i.e. "... will only pay... up to the respective Project Costs... for each bid item."). Does CalRecycle expect the contractor to request a change order to increase that amount of a bid item amount prior to exceeding or is CalRecycle expecting the

winning bidder to complete the work even if the amount has been exceeded? That would indicate a “lump sum” bid using T&M rates. Not clear in the RFP. Please clarify expectations and ability to increase. Please clarify if a bidder is being held responsible for completing the project even if the contract amount has been exhausted – or – if this means the bid items should be tracked closely and increased as necessary.

- A2 CalRecycle does not express or guarantee the quantities of services or goods specified in the Cost Proposal Sheet. These quantities are estimates provided for cost and proposal comparison purposes only
- Q3 Regarding water trucks – p. 78, #5 – Water truck rate is conflicted between requesting an hourly rate or a daily rate. The bid sheet indicates an hourly for a 10-hour day (why is an hourly rate compared to a 10 hour day?). Please confirm if you want a DAILY RATE for a 10 hour day or an HOURLY RATE with no min or max number of hours per day.
- A3 Water trucks will be paid on a daily rate for use throughout the project area as needed for an estimated two week period and DAILY water truck rates should be provided. The DAILY rate is per truck per day for a 10-hour working day. Partial daily rates will be compensated for the days the water trucks are utilized less than full days.
- Q4 Regarding resumes – p. 12, #4 – Requests resumes for the bullet list of defined staff. Please confirm exactly how many resumes per role. There is no clear indication how many resumes are required for the proposal.
- A4 At minimum, proposers must provide 1 resume for each position specified in Section III, Proposal Submittal Requirements, Methodology Item 4, except Area Leaders (1 per County), TRAQ Arborists, Certified Asbestos Consultants, Key Archaeologists and Biologist which will be dependent on the Branch being bid.
- Q5 Regarding key personnel – p. 13 – “Logistics Unit Leader” role is not provided in the bid sheet. Given the numerous logistical items, will CalRecycle add this role to the bid sheet?
- A5 Logistics Unit Leader position will be removed from the list of resources/ personnel for this RFP.
- Q6 The bid sheets have unclear bid items for lab costs per chain of custody (Soil/Water/Asbestos). Asbestos could be analyzed for solid and air samples. Page 78 explains about a fee per chain per property per sampling event. This could cause much confusion due to the vague explanation and how few or many samples could be placed given a multitude of circumstances. It is suggested the bid items be removed and lab be reimbursed directly with no markup. Assume the labor rates include any necessary markup for lab support.
- A6 CalRecycle will reimburse the Contractor for laboratory services for samples collected on a chain of custody basis. The chain of custody transmittal form will be filled out documenting samples collected from a property for which soil or air samples are

collected (typically between 1 and 12 samples represented per chain of custody sheet). One Chain of Custody form per property, per sampling event. The Bid Schedule line items for these laboratory costs is inclusive of all laboratory costs, including but not limited to, sample containers, packaging, sample preservation, shipping, handling, preparation, processing, conducting all analysis/analyses reporting of results, and any other costs. The Contractor shall ensure laboratory sample analysis reporting turn-around-times do not exceed seven (7) days from the date of sample collection.

Q7 Please clarify what water samples may be collected and for what analyses?

A7 The parameters include but are not limited to general minerals, metals, volatile organics, and other parameters as directed by the CalRecycle CM and IMT. The Contractor agrees to comply with all applicable standards, orders, or regulations issued pursuant to the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended, 33 U.S.C. Sections 1251 et seq.

Q8 Please clarify what air samples will be needed for what analysis in the Air Monitoring Equipment rate. There is a separate line item for asbestos samples per chain of custody. So if air samples are analyzed for asbestos, would that be the flat rate for a "per chain of custody"? Unclear.

A8 Community air monitoring samples will be analyzed for asbestos, heavy metals, and dust for the duration of the Operation or until such time that the Debris Group Supervisor (DGS) or designee determines that air monitoring may cease. The locations of the air sampling stations will be approved by the DGS. Only non-airborne asbestos sampling will be compensated at the laboratory costs-asbestos rate. Also see answer #44 for more details.

Q9 Regarding the three asterisks in the bid sheets, if the "average" time to complete an arborist strike team assessment is 4 hours, then that implies half the lots would be over 4 hours and would require pre-approval (half are less, half are more... average is near the middle). Right off the bat, half the sites would require pre-approval. This would be time a costly time-consuming activity to request, obtain, and track. This could also possible cause delays and inconsistency with the runway of sites. Will CalRecycle consider increasing that number to a maximum of 8 hours and to assess and anything over 8 hours would need pre-approval?

A9 This footnote has been deleted from the Cost Proposal Sheets.

Q10 As a follow up the solicitation referenced above, is the solicitation inclusive of the environmental monitoring, assessment, sampling (air/soil), and geotechnical assessment or will that be on a separate solicitation. I briefly perused the document and it seemed more contractor focused rather than consulting services. Any clarity to this would be greatly appreciated?

A10 Yes, this solicitation includes environmental monitoring, assessment, air and soil sampling, and GIS work. See Attachment J, Exhibit A, and particularly note the following language in Item (6)(H): "The Contractor shall provide IMT Staff to support the

established State IMT in implementing the...Structural Debris Removal Special Provisions (attached as Exhibit H), at the discretion of the IMT:...2)Environmental Permit preparation and implementation support, 3)Collect background soil samples and prepare a Cleanup Goals Plan for each operational area within the Branch, 4)Prepare community air monitoring plans for each operational areas..."

Q11 Our company is a SBE, DBE, Woman-Minority Owned Dump truck provider and broker, and wanted to know if Cal Recycle is looking for bids specially for dump trucks for the projects?

A11 CalRecycle is not soliciting for dump trucks as part of this RFP. There may be opportunities for a truck provider to work as a subcontractor under the contracts advertised in CalRecycle's Invitation for Bids DRR20058. Q12 For the trucking portion, will man camps be provided as they did for the Camp Fire for this project in respective areas?

A12 No. Contractors are responsible for their own housing.

Q13 Is Cal Recycling looking for hourly rates for the proposals for the trucking specifically?

A13 Hauling and trucking debris will be performed under the IFB DRR20058. For water trucks, please see answer #3 above.

Q14 ITEM: Bid Sheet (all Branches), Paragraph 1: Texty describes the need for "..., personal air monitoring equipment and analysis...". Can personal air monitoring equipment (Personal air pumps) utilized for personal air monitoring be included in the billable line item "Air Monitoring Equipment (including continuous monitoring dust trackers and portable electric generator sets, laboratory costs, and support materials)" in the bid sheets?

A14 Hourly rates shall be inclusive of personal air monitoring equipment and analysis for the Contractor's own staff. Air Monitoring line item in the Cost Proposal Sheet is for community air monitoring.

Q15 ITEM: Bid Sheet, (all Branches), Laboratory Costs (Soil/Water/Asbestos): What is the minimum number of samples required per Chain of Custody?

A15 See A. 6.

Q16 ITEM: Miscellaneous Position/Services, 4: CalRecycle will reimburse "One Chain of Custody form per property, per sampling event". Historically, there has been a need for more than one Chain of Custody required during asbestos site surveys, as dictated by field conditions. Will CR consider a variance in payment for more than one COC if additional COCs are needed?

A16 See A. 6.

Q17 ITEM: Miscellaneous Position/Services, 4: "The Bid Schedule line items for these laboratory costs is inclusive of all laboratory costs, including but not limited to, sample containers, packaging, sample preservation, shipping, handling, preparation, processing, reporting of results, and any other costs." Laboratory costs are also to be included in the bid sheet line item for "Air Monitoring Equipment (including continuous monitoring dust trackers and portable electric generator sets, laboratory costs, and support materials)" Please clarify where laboratory costs are to be included for billing the project?

A17 Air analysis laboratory cost should be included in the "Air Monitoring Equipment" cost line item.

Q18 ITEM: Miscellaneous Position/Services, 4: "The Bid Schedule line items for these laboratory costs is inclusive of ...reporting of results...". How does CalRecycle define "reporting of the results" in this statement?

A18 Laboratory sample results shall be summarized, tabulated and reported to the incident management team via email along with a copy of the laboratory analytical report.

Q19 Can AFS Bid on just the Hazard Tree Assessment portion of the RFP and NOT the Debris Removal portion?

A19 No. The prospective bidder must bid for hazard tree removal and debris removal.

Q20 Can we subcontract on both sides of a project? For example, we are currently working with Arcadis on the Camp Hazard Tree Management Project, and have recently been asked by both prime contractors for the tree removal if we could supply them with PI (Pre Inspectors) individuals to assess properties before the tree removal crews arrive to determine if trees that are not eligible for the program would need to be removed at the contractor's expense to allow for access to remove eligible trees. In addition, they have also asked us to provide some specialized equipment to remove trees that would not be accessible by climbing crews.

A20 No. A company may not work as part of both the "2020 Fire Debris and Tree Removal Assessment and Management Services" (Assessment) contracts and the "2020 Fires; Debris & Hazard Tree Removal Services" (Removal) contracts. In the event that a company working as a contractor or subcontractor on one or more Assessment contracts is included as a contractor or subcontractor on a Removal contract bid, that will be considered a conflict of interest and the Removal contract bid will be disqualified. Furthermore, related entities meeting the definition of a "Parent",

"Subsidiary", or "Otherwise Related Business Entity" per 2 CCR section 18700.2(b) shall be considered a single company for purposes of this analysis."

Q21 We are planning on bidding with Arcadis for DRR20059 and have also been asked to bid with contractors on DRR20058 for debris removal crews. Before I commit to anything, I would like to know what the state's stance is on this?

A21 See A. 20.

Q22 Will Cal Recycle accept a single technical proposal package integrated for the four branches?

A22 See A. 26.

Q23 Can the Cost Proposal Envelopes be submitted in a single cost package which contains the four branches with the respective forms? Does Cal Recycle prefer four different separate envelope in the submittal?

A23 Cost Proposal Sheets must be submitted in sealed envelopes. If submitting Cost Proposal Sheets for multiple branches, the proposer may place each Cost Proposal Sheet in a separate envelope or all Cost Proposal Sheets in a single envelope. Regardless, each individual Cost Proposal Sheet must include the completed and signed Acknowledgement/Authorization section.

Q24 Is it acceptable for awarded contractor to designate CAL Recycle as "Additional Insured" as opposed to adding CalRecycle to "Insured"?

A24 Yes. Attachment J, Exhibit D #16 (d)(1) has been modified to read: The State, its officers, officials, employees and volunteers are to be covered as *additional* insured as respects: liability arising out of work or operations performed by or on behalf of the Contractor; or automobiles owned, leased, hired or borrowed by the Contractor.

Q25 Are proposers eligible to bid as both a prime contractor and subcontractor for different Branches, if ensuring individual staff are not proposed for multiple Branches?

A25 No, a prime contractor may not be a subcontractor for other branches. Furthermore, related entities meeting the definition of a "Parent", "Subsidiary", or "Otherwise Related Business Entity" per 2 CCR section 18700.2(b) shall be considered a single company for purposes of this analysis. However, a subcontractor may provide services to multiple prime contractors."

Q26 If proposing on multiple Branches, should proposer submit one complete technical proposal response that addresses proposed solutions for all Branches? A. If proposing on more than one Branch, should proposer submit a maximum of 2 teams (one primary team and one supplementary team, in case of secondary award possibility)? B. Will the primary team be considered on the secondary area etc. as the proposer doesn't award low bid?

- A26 Per the Award of Agreement clause in Section V of the RFP, awarding multiple branches to a single Proposer will only be considered in the absence of other qualified proposals. While Proposers are encouraged to submit Cost Bid Sheets for multiple branches, the proposal and included resumes need to demonstrate the ability to staff only a single branch (the largest branch being bid). In the event that CalRecycle considers awarding an additional branch to a Proposer, the Proposer will be asked to "demonstrate sufficient additional resources to manage the additional branch simultaneously without compromising the Proposer's ability to perform the work" and will be expected to provide an entirely separate team of similar quality to the staff outlined in the proposal. Such an award is entirely at the discretion of CalRecycle and will not be considered without a rapid and thorough demonstration of additional resources, so Proposers are advised to consider the possibility of such a request if they are interested in working on multiple branches.
- Q27 Due to the large page count of some written work, can Samples of Written Work be provided electronically via USB/flash drive or hyperlink, rather than in hard copy? Samples of Written Work have been allowed to be submitted electronically in previous responses.
- A27 For samples of written work in excess of 100 pages only, CalRecycle will waive the requirement for physical copies to be provided so long as a digital copy is provided in .pdf format with the required electronic copy of the proposal (on USB flash drive). CalRecycle will not accept a hyperlink.
- Q28 References: A. Can the same references be used for all proposed Branches? B. Since NTP is expected on November 19 with a start date of November 20, do the 3 verifiable references still be available during the Thanksgiving Week?
- A28 A. Yes B. No. Section III, Proposal Submittal Requirements, References paragraph referring to references' availability during the Thanksgiving holiday weekend has been removed.
- Q29 Please clarify the makeup of the maximum 15% incentive for DBVE/SBE commitments noted on page 19?
- A29 Section III, Proposal Submittal Requirements, Maximum Combined Preferences and Rules for Award subsection has been rewritten to read, "In combination with any other preferences (SB or DVBE participation) the maximum limit of the combined preferences is \$1000,000.00 per solicitation."
- Q30 Throughout the RFP, services are referenced as structural debris removal and hazard tree removal. Page 12 of the RFP (Methodology item 2) references "structural debris and/or hazard tree removal assessment and management services." Will the State correct this section to state "structural debris and hazard tree removal assessment and management services" to remain consistent with the rest of the RFP?
- A30 No, Methodology Item 2. is referring to experience type, either debris or hazard tree removal experience can be provided as prior experience for the proposers.

Q31 Cost sheet does not discuss the biologist and archeologist that will lead the section 106 work, these positions are discussed within the solicitation. These positions are more senior than the standard in-field biologist / archeologist. Will the State consider adding these positions to Attachment A as "Senior Archaeologist" and "Senior Biologist"?

A31 No "senior archeologist" or "senior biologist" positions will be added to the Cost Proposal Sheet. All archeologists shall be invoiced at the archeologist rate and all biologists shall be invoiced at the biologist rate.

Q32 The RFP discusses the "Certified Asbestos Consultant Lead" position in several places. Cost sheet does not show this position. Does this role require a separate cost line item?

A32 No, a separate cost line is not needed. The word "Lead" has been removed.

Q33 The RFP presents inconsistent requirements for water truck billing rates. Page 78 states that "water trucks will be paid on an hourly rate," while Attachment A states that "daily rate is per truck." CalRecycle has previously used daily rates for water trucks. Should a daily rate be used for this engagement?

A33 See A. 3.

Q34 Miscellaneous positions and cost – Letter Y Number 4 indicates that the Chain of Custody (COC) will be on a per property basis. This paragraph indicates the cost for air samples as well. Air sample costs are included under the Air Sampling Equipment line item. Should air samples be included with the Air Sampling Equipment rate line item or included as soil, water, and asbestos as defined in the cost?

A34 See A. 17.

Q35 RFP page 84, Item 14 indicates that a field office will be required. The hourly/unit rate definition in Attachment A (below) states that "Operation office and/or equipment storage" should be included as overhead, while RFP page 20 (below) does not include office space in the overhead definition. Will the State revise the cost definition in Attachment A to align with the definition on page 20? A. [page 20]: The rate shall be inclusive of all pre-planned shutdowns, non-working days and holidays, straight time, overtime, and double time labor per day, health & safety equipment, personal protective equipment (PPE), cameras, computers, cell phones, navigation devices, tablets, vehicle, air fare, lodging, per diem, travel, overhead, other costs of doing business, and profit for each hour of work, including overtime, indicating the rates of reimbursement for the project. Overhead, as used herein, includes administrative support, fringe benefits, and home office costs and does not include field costs to support the tree removal operations as directed by the CalRecycle Contract Manager, in consultation with the IMT. Rates shall be inclusive of the Proposer's lodging costs. B. [Attachment A]: The hourly/unit rate shall be inclusive of all pre-planned shutdowns, non-working days and holidays, straight time, overtime, and double time labor per day, Health & Safety equipment, personal protective equipment (PPE), personal air monitoring equipment and analysis, cameras, computers, cell phones, navigation devices, tablets, vehicle, air

fare, lodging, per diem, travel, overhead, and profit for each hour of work, including overtime, indicating the proposed rates of reimbursement for the project. Overhead, as used herein, includes Operation office and/or equipment storage facilities, administrative support, fringe benefits, and home office costs and does not include to support the tree removal operations as directed by the CalRecycle CM in consultation with the IMT. Rates shall be inclusive of the Proposer's lodging costs.

- A35 Section 4 (IV) Cost Proposal Submittal Overview, Cost Breakdown subsection, paragraph 5 has been modified to read "Overhead, as used herein, includes operation office and/or storage facilities, administrative support, fringe benefits..." to align with Attachment A, Cost Proposal Sheet.
- Q36 Certified Asbestos Consultant: A. Per language in Attachment J (page 73 of RFP, item K.1), would the State consider revising the requirement of "Certified Asbestos Consultant (CAC)" by adding both "CAC or Certified Site Surveillance Technician (CSST)"? In previous disasters, both were acceptable. B. Does the State define CAC as including both CAC and CSST? C. Page 73, Section K, bullet 2 ("At a minimum, the CAC shall contact and direct the registered Asbestos Removal Contractor debris removal team to properly collect, package, remove and dispose of the verified asbestos containing materials following best management practices for ACM removal.") i. By "directing," is it meant that the CAC will verify that all Asbestos Containing Material identified during the Asbestos Assessment has been removed? Want to be careful not to direct the means and methods of the contractor. ii. If CSSTs are allowed in the question above, please clarify if the CSSTs has the same responsibility.
- A36 The CAC line item will be ammended to include CSST. The role of CSST is described in Exhibit A, Item (7)(K).
- Q37 Typically, Financial Unit Leaders do not enter the field where they can be exposed to hazardous materials. Does CalRecycle require Financial Unit Leaders to be 40 hour HAZWOPER Certified and to provide HAZWOPER certifications within this proposal?
- A37 "Financial Unit Leader" has been deleted from the list of staff required to be 40-hour HAZWOPER Certified in Section III, Proposal Submittal Requirements, Licenses subsection.
- Q38 Page 77 of the RFP regarding third-party DOT commercial truck inspectors states "Provide certifications and resumes indicating their experience as truck inspectors to the CM for approval." Should resumes for third-party DOT commercial truck inspectors only be provided by the successful bidder?
- A38 Yes, DOT certifications shall be provided by the successful bidder after award and prior to the beginning of work.
- Q39 The RFP incorrectly references "Data Management Professionals" as requiring a resume on page 13, rather than "Data/Packet Manager" as detailed in the SOW. Will the State revise page 13 to reference the "Data/Packet Manager" position for consistency with the SOW and cost forms?

- A39 "Data Management Professional" has been replaced with "Data/Packet Manager" in Section III, Proposal Submittal Requirements, Methodology, Item 4.
- Q40 Scope of Work, Letter G – line 13 is missing text – is there specific text that should have been included?
- A40 Item 13 has been deleted from Scope of Work, Letter G, and the numbering updated accordingly.
- Q41 Does the State request validation to be completed on sample analysis, as with previous projects? Validation confirms the accuracy of results and is standard practice in the industry. A. If validation is requested, can CalRecycle indicate what level of data package should be priced in the line items for validation / verification purposes? Should Level 2, Level 3, or Level 4 verifications be completed?
- A41 Per the Special Provisions Exhibit H. Section 6.1, "All soil confirmation samples will go through a Level 2 verification process."
- Q42 Will the State provide the GIS dataset for the parcels that have been affected so that we can review the total square footage of the footprint, etc.?
- A42 The currently available GIS data is available as points only. Links below. The successful bidder will have access to necessary GIS data as it become available:

- Q43 Payments – for a daily use of air equipment, can the samples be used as proof of use for payment purposes? Samples are a direct indication that the equipment was in use and functional, which leads to a more accurate measure of the use of the equipment.
- A43 Yes, and in addition the Debris Group Supervisor (DGS) or designee will pre-approve the air monitoring equipment locations and will track the use of the equipment.
- Q44 Air Monitoring Equipment: A. Can CalRecycle define what specific monitoring will be needed? Should this include equipment for particulates (PM10, 2.5, total), pumps for

sampling asbestos and metals (high or low volume)? These items are needed to properly price these line items. B. Can CalRecycle please indicate what air sample analyses will be required for the Air Monitoring Equipment line item in Attachment A (i.e. NIOSH 7300/7303 for metals and NIOSH 7400 & 7402 for asbestos)?

- A44 The standard air monitoring station will be required to do real-time monitoring of airborne fine particulate matter concentrations (particulates with an aerodynamic diameter of 2.5 µm, PM2.5) and air sampling for CAM-17 metals, excluding mercury and beryllium, (California Code of Regulations, Title 22). Particulate monitoring and metals sampling will be collected from community locations during working hours for the duration of the Operation or until such time the Debris Group Supervisor (DGS) or designee determines that air monitoring may cease. An advanced air sampling station will take asbestos, mercury, silica, and hexavalent chromium air samples as needed. Advanced Air Sampling Station has been added as a line item in the Cost Proposal Sheet.
- Q45 Site assessment equipment is not discussed in this RFP. What level of monitoring will be needed as part of the initial site assessments? Will this equipment be reimbursed by the State, as this is not considered H&S equipment? (i.e. VOC screen, Radiation [alpha beta gamma] Screen, Mercury Screen)
- A45 The proposer will provide the proper equipment for site assessments described in Section 4.1 of Exhibit H., Special Provisions, and account for these costs within the existing line items in the Cost Proposal Sheet.
- Q46 For Air, Water, and Soil samples, can CalRecycle please indicate what analytical methods will be required so that these line items can be priced accordingly? [i.e. soil - 6020 for all metals (including mercury, mercury can also be completed by 7471), Asbestos (EPA 600 and PLM Point Count 400/1000, and CARB 435)]. Each media may have more than one analytical method with varied costs attributed to each of those methods.
- A46 Per Special Provisions, Exhibit H. Section 6.1, soil samples will be analyzed "for Title 22 Metals (antimony, arsenic, barium, beryllium, cadmium, chromium, cobalt, copper, lead, mercury, molybdenum, nickel, selenium, silver, thallium, vanadium and zinc) by EPA Method 6020 and/or EPA Method 7471A for Mercury." For Asbestos analysis, the samples will be analyzed by polarized light microscopy or transmission electron microscopy using the methods described in the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Method for the Determination of Asbestos in Bulk Building Materials EPA/600/R-93/116.
- Q47 Item 4 under Personnel, on page 13 of the RFP mentions a Logistics Unit Leader. There is no Logistics Unit Leader listed on any of the Cost Proposal Sheets?
- A47 See A. 5.
- Q48 Item 4 under Personnel, on page 13 of the RFP calls out ISA TRAQ certified Arborists. The ISA has been providing the TRAQ certification for only seven years, and as such is

not a highly sought after certification, primarily because ISA Certified Arborists without the TRAQ certification can do hazard assessments on all disaster recovery projects throughout the US. On the Camp Hazard Tree Management Project, there are approximately 45 ISA TRAQ certified Arborists. The combined total called out in this RFP would add an additional 210 ISA TRAQ certified Arborists. Is CalRecycle willing to allow substitution of some ISA Certified Arborists in place of ISA TRAQ certified Arborists if we are unable to locate the required number?

A48 CalRecycle will not accept other ISA Certified Arborists substitutions in place of ISA TRAQ certified Arborists.

Q49 To meet the SB and DVBE requirements, can it be one company that is registered both as a CA SB and DVBE? Or do these requirements need met by two different companies, one for each business categorization?

A49 The SB preference and DVBE incentive may be met by a single firm that is certified by the Department of General Services, Office of Small Business and DVBE Services, as both a SB and DVBE.

Q50 How are damages assessed to confirm which contractor is responsible? Who is responsible for determining who is at fault? What is the process for determining who is at fault?

A50 See Exhibit H. Special Provisions "5.21 Damage to Public and Private Property (Contractor, Consultant – monitors and documents)
Damage to private or public property for which the Contractor or a subcontractor is responsible, as part of the Operation, will be repaired by the Contractor at no cost to the State. Responsibility of the Contractor to repair incidental damage, referred to in the ROE, shall be considered and determined by the CM, the DGS and the BD. Damages to such items as roads, road shoulders, trails, and other improvements (including but not limited to gates, fences or signs, etc) damaged by the Contractor will be repaired to a like or better condition as that found prior to the start of work. Repairs may include repairing or replacing drainage control features. Significant damage to existing roads, road shoulders, trails or other improvements, determined to be caused by Contractor must be repaired by Contractor at Contractor's expense within thirty (30) calendar days of notification by the IMT...

5.22 Damage Claims from Public and Private Properties (Contractor, Consultant – monitors and documents)

Damage claims that arise from Debris Removal or Tree Removal operations will be documented by the Consultant(s). After a review of the details, from the documentation, of the damage, the IMT will make a decision regarding the validity of the damage claim and who, if anyone, will be responsible for repairing the reported damage."

Q51 Roles and responsibilities – Y. Miscellaneous Positions/Services (page 77) indicates a daily flat rate to oversee tribal monitoring. Labor hours for this effort would be determined by the quantity of items to oversee. There is no ability to accurately estimate the cost of the oversight of tribal monitoring effort without a defined scope of work.

Recommend adjusting to Time & Material Not to Exceed task, rather than defining a unit rate. Can the State address this issue?

- A51 Tribes interested in Tribal Monitoring as a mitigation measure will enter into government-to-government consultations with CalRecycle. Specific rates will be the result of consultations. Only after consultations have been completed will an exact scope of work be determined. Regardless of the Tribal Monitoring scope of work, Proposers are advised to consult Attachment J, Exhibit A, #6(G) and formulate appropriate "Archaeologist" and "oversight of Tribal Monitoring Operations (Flat Rate) bids for any and all necessary work related to Tribal Monitoring.
- Q52 Will CalRecycle consider extending the due date for proposals due to the complexities of this large RFP?
- A52 No. There is an urgent need to address the immediate threat to public health and safety and the environment. See Section 1, General Information.
- Q53 Regarding Tribes – The RFP states, "Upon final approval of CalRecycle, Contractor shall enter into agreements with Tribes to implement Tribal Monitoring programs, in compliance with Section 106 requirements" however it is unclear how the consultant/bidder will be compensated for reimbursing the Tribe or Tribes. There are no rates for Tribal Monitors. Will CalRecycle reimburse all subcontractor Tribe invoices to the bidder? Will there be a change order required? Will CalRecycle add Tribe Monitor Rates to the RFP? Please clarify.
- A53 Tribes interested in Tribal Monitoring as a mitigation measure will enter into government-to-government consultations with CalRecycle. Specific rates will be the result of consultations. After consultations are completed with the Tribes, compensation, if any, will be provided to the Proposer through a change order to compensate the Tribes' hourly rates.
- Q54 Regarding Tribes – it is unclear how the "Oversight of Tribal Monitoring Operations" is supposed to cover. Will the bidders be able to bill normal labor rates to support the Tribal meetings and setup from the existing roles? Please clarify the intended purpose of the "Flat Rate" and the reason for a daily rate. What if the project exceeds 270 days? Will there be a change order to extend?
- A54 The Archaeologist assisting with CalRecycle's Tribal Monitoring efforts shall be compensated based on an hourly rate. The "oversight of tribal monitoring operations (flat rate)" is intended to cover any and all costs related to Attachment J, Exhibit A. (7)(Y)(1). If tribal monitoring continues beyond the 150 day window, a change order may be considered. Proposers are advised that the current DRR20058 IFB solicitation calls for an anticipated start date of Dec. 1 and an anticipated end date of May 1, 2020.
- Q55 Section 12, page 83 references a "Change Orders" clause in Exhibit D, but we can't find see such a clause in Exhibit D

- A55 Exhibit A item 12.(a) has become item (c), item (c) has become item (d), item (e) has been deleted. and the new items (a) and (b) read as follows:
"a) If the Contractor is directed to perform work outside the Scope of Work of this Agreement or encounters any other situation where it believes an adjustment of costs from the Cost Proposal Sheet is justified, the Contractor must immediately notify the Contract Manager and the IMT of the need for a Change Order. Failure to promptly notify the Contract Manager constitutes a waiver of any claim for additional compensation prior to actual notification to the Contract Manager. This is the only mechanism by which the Contractor will be paid for any costs not included in the Cost Proposal Sheet.
- b) The Contract Manager, in consultation with the IMT, shall notify the Contractor whether to perform or continue the affected work and issue a Change Order if an adjustment to the Cost Proposal Sheet costs is necessary. The Contractor shall promptly provide all information requested by the Contract Manager in support of a Change Order. Upon completion, a Change Order shall be attached to this Agreement through the formal amendment process. A Change Order shall specify the effective date of the adjusted costs, but those costs cannot be invoiced at the adjusted rate prior the completion of the amendment. In order to be approved, the Change Order costs must be reasonable, allocable, and typical of the industry, and the Change Order work must be reasonable for the completion of the project scope."
- Q56 The Standards and Benchmarks section states: The CalRecycle Contract Manager or designated proxy, in consultation with the IMT, will establish a baseline schedule and performance benchmarks necessary to meet this schedule. These details can potentially impact the actual effort to perform the scope of work and not having that detail in the RFP may impact the overall costs for the project. Can further details on the potential schedule and performance metrics be provided? If not, will the selected Contractor have the ability to review and agree with the schedule and benchmarks?
- A56 The contractor shall be consulted on the standards and benchmarks and project schedule as the operation processes, but the final determination will be made by CalRecycle's Contract Manager or designee in consultation with the IMT.
- Q57 Standards and Remedies, pp. 81 and 82 – many if not most of these Tasks, Standards, Validation, and Consequences are unknown and/or not understandable during the bidding phase. Further, many circumstances fall on other parties (such as mixing loads) – only the debris removal contractor can truly control the mixing of debris, they are physically in control. If a load is later evaluated and considered to be mixed, that should only fall on the debris removal contractor. How does CalRecycle plan to reduce the strict compliance to achieve a partnering relationship with the bidders? This falls out of the control of the consultant and may not be applicable. Please advise.
- A57 The standard related to mixed loads states that the "Contractor must diligently observe all loading by the Structural Debris Removal and Hazard Tree Removal Contractor, and promptly (within two hours) notify the IMT if unapproved load mixing is observed." The
