3M Monrovia is a small facility representing the worldwide organization of 3M. 3M Monrovia, consisting of 28 employees, manufactures specialty coated fabrics and adhesives. Through year-end 1998, 3M operations worldwide have cut solid waste 16.2% since 1990, as well as cut the rate of waste generation 32% since 1990. 3M's P program, created in 1975, encourages employees to prevent pollution rather than treat it after it is generated. 3P results since 1975: 1.5 billion pounds of pollution prevented and \$810 million in cost savings to 3M. Life cycle management processes are increasingly used in new-product development to help 3M manage environmental, health and safety issues at all stages of a product's life cycle, from design and manufacturing to customer use and disposal. In 1999, 3M Monrovia diverted 127 tons of various materials including paper, wood and metals. 3M Monrovia may be only a small link within the worldwide organization, but through determination and perseverance this company strives to be one of the first 3M companies to reach zero generation of landfill waste.

3M Optical Systems - Petaluma, CA

The 3M Petaluma facility cuts precision tooling and manufactures products which include Press-On Lenses, Vanguard Lenses, and Light Control Film, which is used in privacy applications (computer and ATM privacy screens). The goal of the facility is to have no more than 37% of the material that leaves the facility end up in landfills. At the end of the first quarter of 2000, the 3M Petaluma plant had only 21% of its materials leaving the plant as waste and was recycling 44% of its materials. Projects begun in 1999 have resulted in a 275% increase in the sale of manufacturing byproduct (an increase of over thirty thousand dollars per year) with the facility recycling almost 100,000 pounds of material each month. The 3M Petaluma facility recycles everything from cellulose acetate butyrate to cardboard to PVC. In fact, no new packing peanuts have been purchased in the facility in the last two years. Packing materials received with incoming product have been reused. The 3M employees have learned that it is every bit as easy to put material in a box heading out of the plant for recycling as it is to put material in the garbage can.

A Fresh Look

A Fresh Look conducts the business in a way that prevents consumption and waste. Every effort is made to reuse what is on hand to avoid consumption. New products are purchased only when necessary from companies, which use recycled materials in their production and packaging. A Fresh Look reuses paper and packing materials, along with household goods. They also recycle all paper, plastic and metals, which come into the office. A Fresh Look prevents waste by donating to charity and selling at flea markets. They conserve energy by careful scheduling of client appointments and errands, and by turning on electrical equipment only when needed. They also encourage their clients to reuse and recycle. A Fresh Look promotes protection of the environment in the press.

Adcock Manufacturing Corporation is a "precision slitting" facility. The company slits substrates such as paper, film, foils, plastics, polycarbonates and other materials. The materials processed are used in a wide variety of manufacturing requirements. Even one of its clients uses plastic made with post-consumer content for their product. Adcock Manufacturing Corporation has been in business for over 46 years and in the past 3 years has taken strides to recycle the majority of the waste produced from the manufacturing process. Adcock has recently acquired a plastics recycler who is transporting nearly 100% of the plastic scrap generated during processing. Another 70 tons per year in tag and office paper is recycled along with nearly 4 tons of cardboard and 10 tons of rolled tab end paper. That's a lot of recycling for this company of less than 40 employees.

Agilent Technologies has established recycling centers at each of its two major campuses in Sonoma County and will be including one in the design for the new Airport Campus that is under construction. The local operations have implemented a successful desk-side-recycling program making it easy for employees to recycle materials. Programs for recycling food wastes from cafeterias are also being implemented. During 1999, the local operations diverted over 1,164 tons or 63% of the solid waste generated from its manufacturing operations from the Sonoma County landfill. Some of this material was donated to local non-profit organizations. Agilent Technologies would have spent at least an additional \$163,000 in landfill disposal costs during 1999 if they had not had this diversion program in place. Agilent Technologies California Avenue Site conducts research, development, and manufacturing of analytical chemical systems and software development for lab network server systems. Agilent Technologies CAS donated 11,500 lbs. of excess and by-product materials to the RAFT (Resource Area For Teachers) program in San Jose in 1999 and achieved substantial source reduction and a \$250,000 per year saving by replacing software manuals with CD-ROM's. HP CAD's waste reduction program has decreased the amount of solid waste sent to landfill from 152 tons in 1995 to 69 tons in 1999. Customer savings through waste reduction is a major focus with emphasis on reusing rather than discarding. Nearly all parts and packing materials in All Laser Service products are reused or recycled. Each remanufactured toner cartridge represents as much as 5 pounds of non biodegradable waste diverted from landfills and provides as much as 50% cost savings to the end user. Allied Food Distributors recognizes environmental management as one of its highest priorities. During the last three years, it has taken unprecedented steps to significantly reduce its garbage shipments to landfill sites. Through collective efforts, management and operational personnel have established a variety of creative programs to virtually eliminate all unnecessary waste shipments. Such programs include (1) utilization of fiber made from recycled material, (2) recycling of fiber, plastic wrap, tires, cans and food byproducts and (3) rebuilding wood pallets used for shipping product. Allied Food Distributors believes strongly in establishing and maintaining programs which protect the environment. In addition to conserving valuable materials and natural resources, the Company's programs are economically justified because they are less expensive than the utilization of landfill sites. AmeriCold Logistics/Kraft Foods (Dry D.C.) distributes Kraft and General Foods products to Southern California, Phoenix, Las Vegas, Utah and 22 export countries committed to reducing the environmental impact of its activities. When food products cannot be sold to customers due of code date requirements, AmeriCold Logistics/Kraft Foods (Dry D.C.) will donate the product to the Food Bank instead of taking it to the landfill. When the product cannot be donated, whenever possible, the product will be sent to a hog farm for feed. In 1999 AmeriCold Logistics/Kraft Foods (Dry D.C.) donated 350,000 lbs. of product to the food bank and hog farms eliminating the need to go to the landfill and avoiding the potential cost to the company of \$9,000.

Amro Fabricating Corporation

Amro Fabricating Corporation manufactures fuel tanks for the space shuttle, outer shells for rockets and aircraft tooling for aerospace. Amro recycles 6,000 lbs per year of paper and cardboard and 210,000 lbs per year of metal scrap. The company repairs, reuses and recycles 272,000 lbs per year of pallets and wooden crates. Amro purchased a metal chipping machine for \$3,000,000 to facilitate metal recycling/reuse on site.

Amtrak (National Railroad Passenger Corporation)

The National Railroad Passenger Corporation, commonly known as Amtrak, operates the United States inter city passenger rail system. In California, Amtrak operates 48 trains per day on four rail corridors, all of which serve growing population and economic centers and parallel congested highways. Indeed, the very nature of train travel serves to keep cars off the road, thereby reducing harmful emissions, and improving air quality. Amtrak employs about 2,500 people in California, primarily at major offices, maintenance facilities or crew bases in San Diego, Oakland, Los Angeles, Sacramento and Riverside. Employees who work in all facilities and on the trains are actively involved in waste reduction and prevention activities and programs, including paper and liquid recycling and reuse. Each month, Amtrak facilities recycle upwards of 50,000 lbs. of newspaper, cardboard, white and color paper; 1,500 lbs. of batteries, 130 lbs. of aluminum cans and plastic bottles and substantial quantities of paints, oils and other liquids. The amount of recycling is steadily increasing due to an aggressive incentive program. One-half of the revenues generated by recycling are reinvested into the recycling program (ex. purchase recycling receptacles or for education) and one-half is provided to employees as an incentive to recycle. Amtrak is currently implementing a recycling program that encourages its guests to recycle, by providing recycling receptacles at stations and phasing in new equipment that will encourage recycling on the trains. Amtrak recently won recognition from WasteWise, an award sponsored by the IPA and granted to organizations for their superior recycling and waste reduction efforts. Amtrak is committed locally, regionally and nationally to continuing to develop and incorporate environmental policies and programs in the company's normal business processes, and strives to be the leader in the railroad industry on environmental issues.

Anderson Valley Brewing Company

The Anderson Valley Brewing Company is located in a remote, albeit breathtakingly beautiful part of rural Mendocino County in northern California. As most of its employees are drawn to living here because of the abundant natural resources and spectacular vistas, many feel strongly that protecting the environment and minimizing any negative impact on it is as important as the product they make, and they will apply ecologically sound practices throughout each step of the brewing process. One particularly innovative practice is their effluent system for waste water treatment, a series of ponds through which excess nutrients and other by-products of the brewing process are filtered out, until the water can be used to irrigate and water vegetation growing AVBC's 30 acre property. Another example is the donation of their spent-grain to local livestock ranchers who use it as a nutritionally rich supplement for their animals' feed. They also mix their spent yeast into the grain after first thermally killing any active organisms, adding a proteinaceous ingredient to the feed that has been rendered safe for the livestock. Anderson Valley Brewing Company disposes of at least 30,000 tons of this spent grain per week in this manner that otherwise would be composted and piled up creating an environmental nuisance, if not a hazard.

The brewery recycles over 97% of its byproduct and wastes and now is the only ISO 14001 certified brewery in the U.S. The Anheuser Busch Fairfield brewery is a 4 million-barrel beer production brewery located along I-80 in Solano County. The brewery recycles over 97% of its wastes and byproducts (over 96,000 tons/year) with over 100 billion BTU's of energy recovered from a closed loop heat recovery system. Some recycle/reclaim examples are as follows: the brewery reclaims alcohol and spent grain from byproduct operations for off-site recycling and reuse; in 1999 over 73 million gallons of waste liquor was processed to produce 307,349 gallons of ethyl alcohol for off-site fuels blending; and 93,744 tons of grain and related grain products reclaimed/reused for use as cattle feed; the brewery also collects beechwood chips for off-site composting or use as a cogeneration fuel with 252 tons of beechwood chips sent offsite for reuse as compost or for energy recovery.

During 1999, the facility converted fluorescent lighting to more environmentally friendly lamps with 80% less mercury than standard fluorescence. The new bulbs developed by Phillips pass the US EPA toxic characteristic leaching procedure (TCLP) and need not be disposed of as hazardous waste. The 3,000 fluorescent lamps in the facility have been totally converted to the new Alto T-8. The plant will be exempt from new Universal Hazardous Waste regulations regarding fluorescent lamps. Occupancy sensors were installed in office areas to turn off lighting when vacant and 400-watt metal halide lamps were replaced with more efficient 360-watt high output bulbs. Equipment energy audits have resulted in replacing old energy consumptive drives with new electronic variable speed drives. Many inefficient V-belt applications have been replaced with less power demanding belts. Ball Metal Beverage Container Corp. initiated an Inventory Reduction Committee to identify obsolete, over-stocked and duplicate parts and other inventory reduction alternatives. This committee reduced over \$40,000 of obsolete inventory maintained in stores, deleted unnecessary stocked items maintained onhand by \$10,000, and made over \$10,000 worth of excess inventory available to other Ball plants for purchase. Committee members meet monthly to review specific projects or areas of concern within the plant. The facility participates in the Non-Firm Power Structure with Pacific Gas & Electric. An agreement between parties requires the plant to cease operations during periods of peak energy demand, or when PG&E declares an energy shortage. This practice returns approximately 5.5 megawatts of available energy to the system. Power may then be reliably supplied to 1,000 residential customers for air conditioning and cooling, or to 500 homes for normal energy supply.

Although highly regulated by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA), which limits the capability of the facility to recycle and reuse most of the raw materials, packaging materials, and recyclable wastes, the facility has successfully managed to operate a recycling center that captures and collects cardboard, tyvek suits, gall, all types of paper, toner cartridges, and scrap metals. The facility also disposes of wooden pallets, fiber drums, metal drums and fluorescent bulbs to recycling companies for reuse. They have gradually converted the lighting in their winery from incandescent bulbs to energy efficient compact fluorescent ones. All grape pomace is hauled away by one of their growers and is used for garden compost. When it comes to effective and creative recycling and waste management, Frog's Leap staff members strive to be proactive. All paper and containers are reused and recycled. In their office they have a kitchen and laundry facility eliminating their need for paper and plastic products such as cups, paper towels, and utensils. They buy all of their paper products as recycled including letterhead (a cotton/linen blend made from T-shirt scraps) and wine labels. In fact, they supply one of their restaurant accounts with our extra wine labels to use as coasters. All garden and landscaping waste is composted on-site and returned back to the garden. They make use of previously used lumber in the construction of their new barrel cellar. Cooling and humidification systems are designed to be resource efficient, including making use of night cooling and ventilation. They have a frog pond on-site that is a high volume, low pressure system, which contains 13,000 gallons water, all biologically filtered, and runs on only a 4 hp motor. This utilizes less than 10% of the energy of standard pools, and uses no chlorine. At each flush through up to 300 gallons of biologically charged fish emulsion is produced. They use this in their on-site organic vegetable gardens and orchards.

Guided by the humane ethic, The Marin Humane Society protects animals from neglect, abuse and exploitation, advocates for their interests and welfare, and inspires awareness and compassion for all living things. The Society solicits and uses discarded newspapers and shredded computer paper from the public and local businesses to provide clean bedding in the daily accommodation for over 150 cats, dogs, kittens, puppies and other small companion animals. The Society also actively solicits used pet food from deceased companion animals and broken/damaged bags of pet food and cat litter from the area retail stores for their SHARE Program and is shared with other less fortunate animals. It is estimated that they reuse upwards of 11 tons of these products. In 1999/2000 they used medical supplies from the Rotary's Rotoplast Program that was outdated for humane use, however, was still useable for animals in their Veterinary Clinic. These medical supplies were destined for area local landfills. In addition the Society reduced waste by over 35 tons in office paper and cardboard products alone. Additionally, the Marin Humane Society recycles compostable debris, all hazardous materials, and all glass, plastic and aluminum consumed by their 60 staff and 435 volunteers.

We felt it was not only environmentally prudent, but was also economically sound. The uses of grass clippings, shrub trimmings and tree cuttings are unlimited. This raw material (when dried, ground up into small particles and mixed) is aged through the composting process and becomes an excellent "all natural" planting mix. Even before its final stage as compost, there are several stages where these raw materials can be incorporated into the landscape. Some specific examples of how our maintenance operations have put green waste back into the landscape are: FROM OUR TREE MAINTENANCE DIVISION: Within our Arboriculture Operations several by-products are generated. Whether the crews are thinning, lacing or shaping trees, the natural green waste generated is leaves, branches and tree trunks. This operation includes processing the raw material on-site through a "chipper", resulting in the material being chipped or ground down into 1"-4" size pieces. The combination of leaves and wood in this material makes it ideal for large open green areas or horse trails. We are currently using this end product for the many horse trails throughout the Nellie Gail Ranch trail system. FROM OUR TURF MANAGEMENT OPERATIONS: After an in-depth review of our turf management, we felt our best investment was to purchase "recycling" type-mowing equipment. This action reduces our out-take to the local waste facility and permits positive benefits to the lawns. Within our master plan of aeration, dethatching and moisture control, we note that by using this type mower we achieve the recycling of nutrients held in the cut blades of grass. Nitrogen is being returned to the turf, not available when using a conventional grass catching operation. Turf moisture can also be held for longer periods of time, reducing the amount of irrigation required. At present, The City of Orange, and locally, The City of Dana Point are enjoying the benefits of our recycling mowing operations. FROM OUR SHRUBS & GROUND COVER MAINTENANCE OPERATIONS: Due to the nature of this operation, the maintenance generates the largest amount of green waste. It becomes an infinite mixture of materials (shrubs, groundcovers, weeds and possibly even Rose bush cuttings). This material goes to the green waste recycling center. Once the raw material is ground-up, aged and segregated, it becomes available to the company and the public as planting mix, groundcover mulch and even weed control. Our commitment to recycling is such that we will not use any bagged planting material, only bulk end products from green waste recycling operations. In closing, the residents of Dana Point take great pride in their green waste recycling program. Their program is integral to their City contract and to the many private homeowner associations for whom they are privileged to provide landscape services. They commend any effort to promote the use of green waste materials by the private sector and/or public agencies. The Soto Company saves over \$600 per month using a green waste facility.
