The Waste Reduction Awards Program (WRAP) was administered by CalRecycle (formerly the California Integrated Waste Management Board) from 1993-2011. WRAP provided an opportunity for California businesses and nonprofit organizations to gain public recognition for their outstanding waste reduction efforts and lets the community know the business takes waste reduction seriously. WRAP evaluated the waste reduction, procurement, and education activities in the internal business practices of the applicant, not its services or products.

##### **20th Century Fox Film Corp**

Summer is here and 20th Century Fox Film Corporation continues to sizzle! Fox increased its landfill diversion rate to greater than 85 percent. In addition, Fox Studios now receives mulch that is produced from green waste on the studio. The studio has increased its landscape areas and as a result its need for ground covering has gone up. So far this year, Fox has utilized 100 yards of mulch that was generated from its own green waste at a savings between 33-50 percent below what they were paying. Fox has diverted waste from a landfill and saved money, too.

##### **49er Pet, Inc.**

49er Pet, Inc. of Rohnert Park is a locally owned 17,000 square foot pet superstore. The store rewards customers with a discount if they refill their existing cat litter containers instead of purchasing a new one. Customers love the large variety of bird foods available in bulk which reduces packaging waste. Since implementing a recycling program several years ago, this company has been able to decrease the amount of trash it sends to the landfills. This has resulted in both cost reduction and increased awareness for employees and customers.

##### **A Fresh Look**

A Fresh Look is a unique decorating service which helps its clients redecorate their homes by creatively rearranging the furniture and artwork they already own. Due to A Fresh Look's clients rediscovering the charm of the possessions they already own, over \$60,000 in unnecessary purchases were avoided in 1999 saving precious resources. A Fresh Look delivered over twenty car loads of household goods to needy charities preventing useful items from piling up in a landfill. The company's principal, Kit Davey, writes a column for the San Jose Mercury News called "Decorating On A Dime" in which she advocates reuse and waste prevention in the home. She encourages the readership (over 200,000) to use what they already have in new ways instead of consuming new products. She also urges readers to get rid of unwanted possessions by donating, selling, or recycling instead of tossing them into the landfill.

Adcock Manufacturing Corporation is a "precision slitting" facility slitting substrates such as paper, film, foils, plastics, polycarbon and other materials. Over the past two years, great strides have been taken to recycle a majority of the waste produced from their manufacturing process. A local recycler diverts usable materials and a chipping machine now allows more compact loads. These procedures give a positive return on the recycled materials and reduce the annual cost of trash hauling. Markets and sources are always in demand since Adcock feels that 100 percent of the materials they process should be recycled.

The firm's products have helped companies around the world bring water discharge into compliance, naturally control algae overgrowth, and accelerate compost operations. Bioremediation has also been used to clean up petroleum hydrocarbon waste on site eliminating the need to haul contaminated soil to landfills. An ongoing in-house recycling program of plastic product containers and other supplies has saved Advanced BioTech approximately 14 percent in new packaging costs annually.

Whenever possible, AMD donates surplus equipment, software and other supplies to non-profit organizations, schools, churches, and government agencies and programs. AMD has reduced waste going to landfill by approximately 675 tons and saved more than \$5 million dollars by reusing test wafers.

In the last four years, it has reduced hazardous waste thirty to forty percent by making changes in processes to eliminate waste by 13.5 tons per year. #### **Advanced Sterilization Products**

Advanced Sterilization Products (ASP) is the global leader in sterilization techniques and manufacturer of medical equipment sterilizers. As a division of Ethicon, Inc. and the Johnson & Johnson family of companies, ASP is committed to the environment and promoting waste and packaging reduction. ASP's values are consistent with the J & J Credo that says, "we must maintain in good order the property we are privileged to use, protecting the environment and natural resources." In May, ASP was recommended by TUV, its ISO registrar, for ISO-14001 certification of its Environmental Management System. In 1998, ASP reduced the amount of non-hazardous waste landfilled by nearly one-half through a comprehensive, employee-supported recycling program. Since 1995, ASP has saved 22 tons of packaging saving the company over \$65,000. Of this, more than 20 tons and \$27,000 was saved in 1998 and ASP anticipates saving more than 37.5 tons, \$50,000 in 1999, and almost 50 tons at a savings of \$65,000 in the year 2000.

#### **Agilent Technologies California Avenue Site**

Hewlett Packard California Analytical Division conducts research, development, and manufacturing of analytical chemical systems and software development for lab network server systems. HP CAD donated 6,000 lbs. of excess and by-product materials to the RAFT (Resource Area For Teachers) program in San Jose in 1997 and achieved substantial source reduction and a \$250,000 per year saving by replacing software manuals with CD-ROM's. HP CAD's waste reduction program has decreased the amount of solid waste sent to landfill from 85 tons in 1997 to 74 tons in 1998. HP CAD recycled 148 tons of excess material in 1998 accounting for a \$36,000 savings in a waste hauling fees.

#### **Albertson's, Inc.**

Albertsons is one of the largest retail food and drug stores in the United States and currently operates over 1,000 stores in 25 states. In the state of California there are nearly 180 Albertsons stores. Over 150,000 individuals are employed by Albertsons company-wide, with over 25,000 of those individuals residing in California. All Laser Service repairs laser printers and remanufactures toner and inkjet cartridges, OPC drum units, and other laser printer supplies. Customer savings through reduction is a major focus with emphasis on reusing rather than discarding. Each remanufactured toner cartridge represents as much as five pounds of nonbiodegradable waste diverted from landfills and provides as much as a fifty percent cost savings to the end user. All Laser Service was a recipient of the 1997 Business Solid Waste and Recycling Award from the city of Sunnyvale.

#### **Anheuser-Busch, Inc., Fairfield Brewery**

Since 1993, the Anheuser-Busch, Inc. Fairfield Brewery employees have diligently worked to reduce solid waste to the landfill and increase recycling awareness. Fairfield Brewery employees' and waste reduction team (SEEers) members considered all possible methods to reduce landfill-related waste. From 1993-1998 the Fairfield Brewery increased the amount of recycled material by 104

percent while reducing waste to the landfill by 33 percent. Since 1995 Fairfield Brewery has managed to keep landfill waste under 2000 tons per year. Some of the reasons for this success are: recycling awareness banners throughout the plant and ABTV (company TV channel) displays and videos; environmental recycling display case and post-consumer content display case; recycling related Green Week activities- educational enrichment; strategic placement of recycling bins throughout the plant; newspaper ads in local newspaper during Green Week- community involvement.

One of Apple Computer's manufacturing facilities is located in Elk Grove, California and performs computer final assembly. Last year Apple Elk Grove struck a deal with one of their major vendors to return their packaging for reuse. In turn the vendor offered a discount netting Apple a savings on each unit purchased. Due to the success of this pilot program, Apple's vendor has implemented the same program with other customers. In fiscal year 1998, Apple Elk Grove recycled ten million pounds of waste and achieved a 94 percent recycle rate for the year. Apple has also recognized hundreds of thousands of dollars in waste hauling cost savings and recycling revenues.

**Arlon**

Arlon manufactures adhesives and film at its Santa Ana division. Certified ISO 9001, Arlon is committed to meeting and exceeding environmental and regulatory requirements. Recently, Arlon installed state-of-the-art equipment to address air and energy issues and reduce gas costs by 50 percent. Waste-wise, Arlon brainstormed with employees to determine potential areas to reduce waste and increase recycling. Five tons of cardboard are recycled weekly and 250 tons of plastic liner and films are recycled each year. Paper cast sheet is reused three times before disposal, but that's not good enough for Arlon- they will continue to search for alternatives to disposal for this material.

Armstrong World Industries, South Gate plant, produces both commercial and residential floor tile products in southern California. Since 1990, the plant has reduced the amount of waste disposed of per year by more than 7,500 tons. In fact, over the past few years, the plant has successfully reduced its material to landfill and hazardous wastes by more than 50 percent. In 1997, the plant saved approximately \$100,000 in regulatory fees, waste disposal fees, etc. By finding alternatives to recycle its industrial solid waste material, Armstrong World Industries reduced disposal and transportation costs. All plant employees benefit in these cost savings with increased gainsharing payouts. Focusing on waste management improves other areas such as production, cost, quality, and employee morale.

#### **Ball Metal Beverage Container Corp. (Fairfield)**

Ball Metal Beverage Container Corp. located in Fairfield, California manufactures 12-ounce aluminum cans for the West Coast beer and beverage markets. The aluminum can is one of the most recyclable products made today. During 1998 the facility implemented an additional cardboard recycling program which resulted in 240 cubic yards not sent to the landfill, and a dollar savings of over \$3000. The vendor supplying aluminum coil stock to the plant agreed to take back for reuse the outer wrapping material protecting the metal from damage during shipping and handling. By eliminating this waste stream from compacted material, approximately \$1000 was saved during 1998. The packaging system was converted to using plastic pallets instead of wood. The new pallets are recyclable and an annual \$5,000 reworking change for wooden pallets has been eliminated. Life expectancy for plastic pallets is five times wooden pallet life. Plastic pallets will not require total replacement every two years, saving the plant over \$10,000.

In 1998 the facility increased the amount of material recycled by over 44 percent compared to 1997. In 1998, an incentive program was established to encourage employee involvement toward pollution prevention. Also, suppliers have reduced the environmental impact of their products by eliminating the amount of packaging material.

Novacor manufactures mechanical heart support systems used to enable individuals to get support while waiting for a natural heart transplant. The best recycling Novacor has ever done is the electronics/computer recycling which has been a big saver in terms of cost to dispose of and metal reduction to landfills. Total recycling has been about 85,256 pounds of materials or 42.6 tons. Recycling has saved the company about \$14,610 in 1998. This does not include any donations made to non-profits, or money made

from selling computers or old office furniture to employees.

Bayer Corporation, Berkeley manufactures biologically-based pharmaceuticals and conducts research on life-threatening illnesses. Bayer completed all the recommendations generated as a result of participation in the Stop Waste program in 1998. Preliminary data suggest that the company's recycling diversion rate may have increased by as much as 10 percent. all metals of various types, including aerosol cans are recycled. Plant process water is reclaimed for vineyard frost protection and irrigation. Grape pomace is laid to drain and is returned to a soils composition company each spring, from the previous year's crush. Cardboard, in excess of 1,000 tons per year, is baled and sold. All glass, stretch film and shipping plastics are also recycled. In 1996 an in-house e-mail system was initiated, reducing the amount of paper used throughout the winery. In 1998 the in-house e-mail system was expanded to all of Korbel's facilities throughout California. Also in 1998, Korbel purchased equipment, which allows them to separate the crown caps and plastic bidules used in the production of "methode champenoise" champagne. The crown caps are then recycled, totaling about 85,000 pounds, and the plastic bidules are reused, totaling around 30,000 pounds annually. With all their efforts over a seven-year period, Korbel has been able to reduce its large container refuse to landfill costs by 50 percent.

Tons of brewers grain are diverted from Humboldt County's landfill and are now used as cattle feed at a ranch close to the brewery, an improvement over composting. Recently the brewery has supplied heavy kraft paper to the United Indian Health Services unique wetlands restoration project, to be used for weed suppression and the re-establishment of native grasses within the Arcata Bottom site. The brewery's specialty coloring and flavor malts woven nylon bags are used in the construction of straw bale projects. Numerous other potential wastes are studied for their reuse value and nearly every other waste constituent is recycled. Typically, the brewery has a partial 40 gallon trash can load of waste picked up each week.

**The Presidio Trust**

The Presidio Trust is a non-profit federal government corporation charged with the mission to preserve the Presidio of San Francisco (a 1400 acre former military base) as a national park, while becoming financially self-sufficient by the year 2013. The Presidio Trust has an in-house salvage team whose task is to remove and reuse equipment, supplies, and materials from the hundreds of vacant buildings on-site prior to renovation. These materials are reused in-house, donated, or sold, saving thousands of dollars monthly in avoided disposal and avoided new costs. Since the inception of its recycling programs in 1992, Warner Bros. has increased its waste reduction rate from less than 7 percent to a current diversion rate of 45 percent, approaching the year 2000 goal of 50 percent. Products are shipped to the Goshen, CA facility from all over California as well as the rest of the country. A wide variety of products are recycled, including such items as: cottage cheese, salad dressing, barbecue sauce, coffee, ice cream, and yogurt. In addition to recycling virtually all of the food byproduct received, Superior AgResource is always looking for ways to reduce, reuse, or recycle the packaging materials that compromise about 20 percent of the total tonnage. Kevin Shore, plant manager, estimates that Kraft Foods saves more than \$35,000 per month in tipping and hauling fees by recycling these products, in addition to profits from the sale of the manufactured dairy feed.
