WRAP evaluated the waste reduction, procurement, and education activities in the internal business practices of the applicant, not its services or products.

In addition, Fox Studios has implemented its intranet with great success. By eliminating hard copy phone directories and implementing on-line reporting and email, Fox has reduced paper consumption by more than 800,000 sheets a year with a conservative cost savings of more than \$18,000 per year.

A Fresh Look is a unique decorating service which helps its clients redecorate their home by creatively rearranging furniture and artwork they already own. Because A Fresh Look's clients rediscovered the charm of possessions they already own, over \$50,000 in unnecessary purchases were avoided in 1998, saving precious resources. A Fresh Look delivered over fifteen car loads of household goods to needy charities, preventing useful items from piling up in landfills. **Achievement House, Inc.**

More than 375 tons of textiles have been diverted from the local landfill during the first 18 months of the textile recycling program begun by Achievement House, Inc. (AHI) in 1997. AHI, a non-profit organization providing jobs and job training for adults with disabilities in San Luis Obispo county since 1957, recycles all soiled or damaged shoes, clothing, and other textiles that do not sell in its stores. AHI also helps 20 other organizations to recycle. A new program was created on July 1, 1998 to recycle unsaleable hardbound books and ends of paper rolls used by printing companies. "We expect similar positive results for the environment as well as the addition of new jobs with this program," said AHI Executive Director Russell Bower.

Advanced BioTech, Inc. develops and internationally markets unique biotechnology formulated products for solving numerous soil, crop, waste and odor challenges. The firm helps companies around the world reduce the amount of waste previously sent to landfills by composting solid waste and degrading sludge from wastewater. Bioremediation has also been used to cleanup many wastes on sites, eliminating the need to haul contaminated soil to landfills. An ongoing-in-house recycling program of plastic product containers and other supplies has saved Advanced BioTech approximately 14 percent annually in new packaging costs.

AMD produces microprocessors and related peripheral, memories, programmable logic devices, and circuits for telecommunications and networking applications. Whenever possible AMD donates surplus equipment, software, and other supplies to nonprofit organizations, schools, churches and government agencies and programs. AMD has reduced waste going to landfill by approximately 674.6 tons, earned approximately \$85,000 by recycling various items, and saved more than \$5 million dollars by reusing test wafers.

**Advanced Sterilization Products**

Advanced Sterilization Products, a subsidiary of Johnson & Johnson, manufactures Sterrad Sterilizers for the medical device industry, utilizing patented hydrogen peroxide gas plasma technology. ASP met the goal for non-hazardous waste disposal by reducing landfill waste 95 percent since 1994, representing \$2,800 in annual savings. The quantity of office paper used was reduced by 21 percent compared with 1996, representing another \$2,800 saved. All of the paper used in 1997 was recycled paper, emphasizing ASP's commitments to recycling with a "Buy Recycled" program. Packaging avoidance of 21 percent saved \$35,750 in 1997. Total savings from these programs are \$42,600 annually.

**Aerojet - Sacramento Operations**

Aerojet continuously evaluates and seeks methods to improve its waste reduction program. Aerojet has recently expanded its cardboard recycling program to a total company-wide effort. Multiple collection centers were set up throughout the company which notably decreased the volume of waste going to the county landfill. Wood pallet collection is also underway throughout the company. Aerojet is actively involved with other companies in the community through the BRAG coalition, and shares waste reduction successes and methods with other companies and helps them start waste reduction programs.

HP CAD donated 25,000 lbs. of excess and by-product materials to the RAFT (Resource Area For Teachers) program in San Jose in 1997 and achieved substantial source reduction and a \$250,000 per year saving by replacing software manuals with CD-ROM's. HP CAD's waste reduction program has increased the percentage of solid waste recycled from 49 percent in 1995 to 70 percent in 1997.

All Laser Service repairs laser printers and remanufactures toner and inkjet cartridges, OPC drum units and other laser printer supplies. Customer savings through waste reduction is a major focus, with emphasis on reusing rather than discarding. Nearly all parts and packing materials in All Laser Service products are reused or recycled. Each remanufactured toner cartridge represents as much as 5 pounds of non biodegradable waste diverted from landfills and provides as much as 50 percent cost savings to the end user. All Laser Service was also a recipient of the 1997 Business Solid Waste and Recycling Award from the City of Sunnyvale, CA

This trimmed waste by 17.5 percent and saved approximately \$1,000.

Allergan, headquartered in Irvine, California, is a global provider of specialty therapeutic products. Allergan recycles a variety of materials, ranging from paper and plastic to the ink toner cartridges used in computer printers and copiers. On occasion, excess chemicals from laboratories are collected and are donated to local high schools to be used in their chemistry classes. Currently enclosed with the pharmaceutical products are information inserts made from 50 percent recycled materials. Copier paper consists of 25 percent postconsumer content. The corporate Environmental Health and Safety department has initiated the Environmental Achievement Award Program in 1996 which recognizes individual(s) and groups within the company for environmental achievements. This program will make a \$2,000 cash charitable donation to a non-profit environmental organization of the employee's choice for support of environmental conservation.

**Alliance of Motion Picture & Television Producers - Solid Waste Task Force**

The Alliance of Motion Picture and Television Producers (AMPTP) Solid Waste Task Force, which is composed of the major motion picture studios and television networks, is pleased to announce that in 1997 they collectively diverted 50 percent of their total waste from landfills. In 1997, the industry collectively diverted over 17,300 tons of waste from landfills, representing an enormous 700 percent increase over the industry's 1990 numbers of 2,400 tons. The AMPTP's Solid Waste Task Force includes: 20th Century Fox, The Walt Disney Studios, Paramount Pictures, Sony, Universal City Studios, Warner Bros., and the West Coast broadcast centers of ABC, CBS, & NBC. The industry has saved approximately half a million dollars in disposal costs over the past seven years and has generated revenue from recycling.

The Kraft Foods/AmeriCold Logistics distributes Kraft and General Foods dry products to Southern California, Phoenix, Las Vegas, Hawaii, Texas, Utah and 22 export countries. Food products that cannot be sold to customers because of code date requirements are donated to the Food Bank instead. When the product cannot be donated, wherever possible, the product will be sent for livestock feed. In 1997 Kraft Foods/AmeriCold Logistics donated 300,000 of product to the Food Bank and hog farms, eliminating landfilling and avoiding \$9,000 in costs.

Amici's East Coast Pizzeria is a growing chain of upscale pizza and pasta restaurants in the San Francisco Bay Area. Recent computerization has eliminated the use of paper for guest check, company records and employee time cards. Promotion of local micro-brewed draft beers has significantly reduced bottle usage. The reduced paper cost and increased profit margin on draft beers amount to savings of approximately \$22,000 per restaurant annually.

Andrade Architects is an architectural firm that specializes in custom homes and small commercial projects. Andrade Architects utilizes electronic data transfer systems via modem and the internet to send drawings and information to their clients and consultants as opposed to making copies and shipping them. This eliminates paper and packaging material and reduces the use of other natural resources necessary in the delivery process. Andrade Architects also donates old blueprints to local schools for learning, and recycles all discarded paper items. The Los Angeles Brewery of Anheuser-Busch, Inc., located in Van Nuys, California, is the world's third largest brewery manufacturing and packaging twelve million barrels of various malt beverages. Since 1994, the brewery has reduced the tonnage of solid waste destined for landfills by 978 tons, or 61 percent. In 1995, the brewery built a Bioenergy Recovery System which has reduced the outgoing BOD waste water load to local municipalities by 72 percent, saving the brewery approximately six million dollars annually.

Anheuser Busch is a 4 million barrel beer production brewery located along I-80 in Fairfield in Solano county. The brewery reclaims alcohol and spent grain from byproduct operations for off-site composting or use as a cogeneration fuel. Over 73 million gallons of waste liquor are processed to produce 230,000 gallons of ethyl alcohol for off site fuels blending and 93,000 tons of grain and related products for use as cattle feed.

Ball Corporation operates three 12-ounce aluminum can manufacturing lines, producing cans for the West Coast beer and beverage markets. Implementation of new waste treatment technologies and chemical process product substitutions resulted in declassification of wastewater treatment sludge from hazardous to non-hazardous. This reduced material going to class I landfills by more than 500 tons. Filter cake material generated is now being used as a daily cover on the working face of a landfill, and receiving recycling credits. Annual savings are over \$200,000 in disposal costs.
