The Waste Reduction Awards Program (WRAP) was administered by CalRecycle (formerly the California Integrated Waste Management Board) from 1993-2011. WRAP provided an opportunity for California businesses and nonprofit organizations to gain public recognition for their outstanding waste reduction efforts and lets the community know the business takes waste reduction seriously. WRAP evaluated the waste reduction, procurement, and education activities in the internal business practices of the applicant, not its services or products.

Fox Filmed Entertainment's Fox Studios is a 54 acre facility in the heart of Los Angeles that creates, markets and distributes episodic television and feature films. Fox Studios has created a comprehensive environmental program that reflects our commitment to a cleaner, healthier environment. In 1996, Fox diverted over 80% of all waste from landfills through aggressive reuse, recycling, and donation programs.

##### **49er Pet, Inc.**

49er Pet, Inc. of Rohnert Park is a locally owned, 17,000 sq. ft. pet superstore. The store rewards customers with a discount if they refill their existing cat litter containers instead of purchasing a new one. This community centered store donates outdated magazines to local preschools for art projects. Since implementing a recycling program several years ago, the company has been able to decrease the amount of trash it sends to the landfills, resulting in both cost reduction and increased awareness for employees and customers.

##### **A Fresh Look**

A Fresh Look is a unique interior design service which redecorates the homes of its clients by creatively rearranging the furniture, artwork, and accessories they already own. Owner Kit Davey writes a column for the San Jose Mercury News called "Decorating on a Dime", encouraging her readers to recycle and refurbish rather than consume new household furnishings. Since January, A Fresh Look has saved each of its 150 clients between \$25 and \$5000 in replacement costs and has kept one cubic foot to a dumpster-full of materials per household from entering the landfill.

##### **Achievement House, Inc.**

Achievement House, Inc., a nonprofit organization, provides jobs and job training for adults with disabilities in San Luis Obispo County. Currently AHI's textile recycling program recycles all soiled or damaged shoes, clothing and other textiles that don't sell in its stores and helps eight other organizations to recycle. AHI Executive Director Darel F. Sorenson estimates at least 105 tons will be diverted from the landfill this year, with an estimated 210 tons in 1998 and 315 tons in 1999.

##### **Adkinson & Baer: Education Opportunities, Inc.**

Adkison and Baer Education Opportunities, Inc. designs and distributes educational products nationally. The company recently revised its K-6th grade curriculum and donated more than 5,000 pounds of viable materials to the Sacramento City School District for distribution to students. To minimize packaging waste, they shred office paper and use it for packaging products for mailing. They also reuse packaging and boxes received from other supplies and "We recycle old boxes" stickers are affixed to the boxes. Their program has reduced trash accumulation and has saved the company several hundred dollars annually.

Whenever possible AMD donates surplus equipment, software, and supplies to nonprofit organizations, schools, churches, and government agencies and programs. AMD has saved more than 5 million dollars by reusing test wafers and by publishing internal and external catalogs on-line to reduce paper usage by more than one ton. AMD has generated approximately \$11,800 in 1996 through recycling efforts.

**Alpineaire Foods**

AlpineAire Foods manufactures freeze-dried/dehydrated foods for outdoor recreation and emergency preparedness. AlpineAire reduces the amount of waste deposited in landfills by recycling tin and aluminum cans, cardboard, catalogs, magazines, phone books, and glass, in addition to donating labels, stickers, cardboard cores and excess food to local schools and/or organizations. The company also shreds paper waste for packing material and reuses boxes. This produces 10% savings over purchasing additional packing materials while reducing additional waste.

**Aluminum Company Of America**

The Alcoa Vernon facility remelts aluminum scrap and produces large-size, high-quality, precision aluminum plate which is used by many fabricating businesses. The dross (aluminum skim) that is produced when melting aluminum, is collected and cooled to a solid. This material is then recycled to secondary aluminum remelting facilities. Approximately 100,000 lbs of dross is recycled each month. This saves landfill space, the company's disposal costs, and more - Alcoa sells the dross for approximately \$0.25/lbs (25,000.00).

**Amgen Inc. Thousand Oaks Facility**

Amgen is a global biotechnology company that discovers, develops, manufactures and markets human therapeutics based on advanced cellular and molecular biology. Amgen currently employs approximately 4000 people in Thousand Oaks. In 1996, Amgen recycled 23% more than the 1995 total of 1,061,131 pounds, and trash disposal costs for 1996 decreased 17% compared to 1995.

**Amici's East Coast Pizzeria**

Amici's East Coast Pizzeria is a small chain of upscale pizza and pasta restaurants in the Bay area. Amici's computerized almost every area of its operation, eliminating the need for guest checks, while storing files on computer disks rather than paper. Changing to fountain soda and increasing the selection of draft beers have minimized Amici's bottle usage. Paper costs decreased 46%, approximately \$45,000 per restaurant.

**Anchor Bay Village Market**

Anchor Bay Village Market is a small grocery store that carries natural and organic foods. Anchor Bay Village Market has received the highest praises by the Mendocino Health Department for Health and Safety. They use electronic data transfer systems via modem and the internet to send drawings and information to their clients and consultants as opposed to making copies and shipping them, eliminating paper and packaging material and reducing use of other natural resources. Andrade Architects also donates old blueprints to local schools for learning, and recycles all discarded paper items. These waste reduction techniques have reduced Andrade Architects' trash to just one very small bag per week.

#### **Anheuser-Busch, Inc., Fairfield Brewery**

Anheuser Busch is a 4 million barrel beer production brewery located along I-80 in Fairfield, Solano county. The brewery reclaims alcohol and spent grain from byproduct operations for off-site composting or use as a cogeneration fuel. Over 73 million gallons of waste liquor are processed to produce 230,000 gallons of ethyl alcohol for offsite fuels blending and 93,000 tons of grain and related products are processed for use as cattle feed. Over 340 tons of beechwood chips were sent off-site for composting or use as a cogeneration fuel.

Apple has worked with suppliers to encourage the use of recycled/recyclable packaging and has set up a waste segregation system which recycles or reuses over 90% of the packaging waste generated by the computer assembly process. These efforts diverted over 9 million pounds of trash from landfills last year alone by the Sacramento facility. In addition, Apple Computer Sacramento Operations Center was one of the first sites in the U.S. to receive ISO 14000 registration.
