WRAP evaluated the waste reduction, procurement, and education activities in the internal business practices of the applicant, not its services or products.

Customer savings through waste reduction in major focus with emphasis on reusing and remanufacturing rather than discarding. Nearly all parts and packing materials in All Laser Service products are reused or recycled. Each remanufactured toner cartridge represents as much as 5 pounds of non biodegradable waste diverted from landfills and provides as much as a 50% cost savings to the end user. All Laser Service is currently emphasizing the environmental and cost saving benefits of recycling ink jet cartridges.

The Anheuser Busch Fairfield brewery in Solano County produces the Budweiser family of beers in a variety of packages. The brewery as developed markets to recycle many of the natural products used for brewing and packaging beers. For example, the beechwood chips used to age Anheuser Busch beers take on a second life as compost for local gardeners. The 700 tons of beechwood recycled annually are just a part of the 93,000 tons of waste the Fairfield brewery diverts from the landfill every year. The brewery reuses or recycles more than 97% of its byproducts.

comprised entirely of volunteer employees, including every major department at their site. They currently recycle 85% of their waste, which is an increase of 18% over last years figures. Apple Elk Grove has been able to divert approximately 2,200 compactor pulls, or over 13 million pounds of waste that would have gone to the landfill last year. They have also recognized a savings of over \$700,000 last year in waste hauling costs and recycling revenues.

Auto Service 2000 provides on-site preventative maintenance services for vehicle fleets in Southern California. Auto Service 2000 was selected from among all-such providers in the United States to travel with the 1996 Olympic Torch Relay, providing oil change services for the 70 vehicles that traveled with the Olympic flame through 43 states. Auto Service 2000's proprietary oil change equipment provided for safe containment of used oil and filters until they could be properly recycled and sent for re-refinement. Auto Service 2000's involvement in the 1996 Torch Relay ensured the safety of the vehicles transporting support staff and reduced the need for costly vehicle repairs. Auto Service 2000's equipment storage capacity saved thousands of dollars by eliminating the need for frequent disposal of oil.

Customers are encouraged to bring in paper or plastic sacks from any business and are financially rewarded for returning plastic malt containers for reuse. By reusing plastic malt containers, BeerMakers saves the cost of replacement of thousands of this one item. Other related cost savings are realized such as the fuel, truck/trailer maintenance, and time required to procure the malt containers.

In order to reduce the amount of cardboard sent to be recycled, Buena Vista has worked closely with their suppliers to produce boxes that can be shipped back to the supplier for reuse. Buena Vista also has an ongoing employee education program that highlights current as well as new recycling policies, keeping the idea of recycling fresh in employees minds. Buena Vista's waste reduction and recycling program has decreased the use of additional general waste containers from two to one. This factor alone is a significant source of company savings, given that our waste hauler charges by the ton.

Callaway Golf's overall solid waste recycling program resulted in a 1995 rebate \$29.2K and diverted a total of 431 tons from the landfill. In 1996, Callaway Golf has received a total of \$15.0K in rebates from recycling and has diverted a total of 473 tons of solid waste from the landfill as of June 30, 1996. Through THARCO's "R" line of corrugated stock boxes that are manufactured from 100% post-consumer waste, the small to medium sized user of corrugated boxes is now able to make environmentally pro-active purchasing decisions. Prior to THARCO's introduction of the "R" line in 1991, the small and medium size users did not have the purchasing power to pull through the environmentally pro-active feature of recycled content in corrugated shipping boxes. THARCO was able to bring the product to the market place so that purchasers would not be paying a premium for the aggressive recycled content. The product line has grown to the point that in 1995 THARCO was able to utilize 16,000 tons of post-consumer fiber to produce the 665 sizes that are in their Stock Box catalog.
