Awards

In January 2013, CalRecycle solicited grant applications for the HD20 FY2012/13 cycle. Due to oversubscription, all eligible applications were not funded using FY 2012/13 monies. On September 30, 2013, CalRecycle approved using monies from FY 2013/14 to award grants to eligible but previously unfunded applicants. Below is a listing of funded grants.

Project Summary: As part of its Countywide Household Hazardous Waste Management Program (HHWMP), Los Angeles County proposes a multi-language general public education campaign to educate and inform residents of the environmental benefits of disposing of household hazardous waste and electronic waste properly and promote existing programs to the public. The public education campaign will be broadcast over the radio in English and Spanish. Public education for the 10 million residents is essential to capture hazardous waste being disposed of improperly. By educating the residents on the proper management of household hazardous waste, this project will help protect public health and safety, including promoting clean water and clean communities, prevent potential public and environmental toxicity risks, positively change peoples' behavior and improve the quality of life for County residents.

Project Summary: The City of Lancaster responds to over 835 complaints a year with regards to HHW being illegally disposed along the Public Rights of Way or on Public lands. The City of Lancaster is requesting funding to expand their HHW collection activities in order to provide the public with the safe and secure disposal of HHW. In recent years, the City has received enormous support from the public with regards to offering temporary one day Public HHW events. By providing these temporary HHW events, the City of Lancaster will be able to educate the public on the proper disposal of HHW, reduce illegal dumping, and support a program that creates a positive impact within the community. The City of Lancaster plans on using the funds to conduct 3 temporary HHW collection events where trained staff will assist the public in the safe and secure collection of HHW waste; purchase a Prefabricated hazardous material storage unit for the collection of hazardous waste, and utilize funding to provide public outreach and education to the community through flyers, banners, advertisements, and a HHW educational website.
