**Project Summary:** Imperial County consists of 4,597 square miles or 2,942,080 acres. Approximately 50% of county lands are undeveloped and under federal ownership and jurisdiction. Approximately 20% is irrigated for agricultural purposes. Imperial County Environmental Health Services is seeking financial assistance for the cleanup of 8 (eight) illegal solid waste sites on farm or ranch property located in Imperial County. It has been determined by Imperial County Local Enforcement Agency that the property owners are not responsible for the illegal disposal of solid waste on their property. The above sites are located in agricultural zoned areas of Imperial County and due to their remote locations have become an attractive nuisance for continued illegal disposal.

**Project Summary:** The RCD is proposing a waste removal project on the following sites. Site 1 located on the Corner of Excelsior and 26 1/4 and Site 2 is located on 17th and Laurel 3 mi SE of Stratford. The waste would be segregated, hauled off site and recycled. Following the removal of the waste, 2 signs will be installed to deter future illegal dumping. The RCD has decided to incorporate an extensive outreach program, in order to facilitate future waste removal projects. The waste consists of various metal objects trash and tires. The work will be done by experienced personnel of Stonies Sand and Gravel. A loader, excavators and dump truck will be needed for both sites.

Debris currently exists on two properties in five distinct dump sites and consists of everyday household trash, construction debris, appliances and tires.

**Project Summary:** This project encompasses 3 different sites within Tulare County. Site 1 is located on Mentz Ave S.E. of Porterville, site 2 is located on Mtn. Rd 120, and site 3 is located on the Tule River Indian Reservation in a remote location in the vicinity of Chollo campground on the upper portion of the watershed. All three of the sites have varing amounts of waste impeding grazing, wildlife habitat and farmland production. With grant funding for waste clean up, outreach and education, the repeated illegal dumping and its subsequent health hazards and negative aesthetic value can be abated.

Project Summary: The Hopland Band of Pomo Indians will conduct site clean-ups at four unauthorized solid waste disposal areas on the reservation. Sites primarily contain household waste, appliances, tires, and automobiles. Activities will include waste removal and disposal at a licensed landfill, recycling of appropriate materials, slope stabilization (site specific, as needed), equipment rental, excavation and public education.

Project Summary: Remove abandoned vehicles, appliances, tires, and other trash from timberland which is the watershed to City of Fort Bragg's Newman Gulch reservoir. This is a major unit of city's water supply, and has been experiencing increased heavy metal contamination due to runoff from illegal dumping. Place large quantity of concrete rubble to block trespassing, and repair as necessary existing gates to area. Post 'No Trespassing' signs.

Implementing the proposed project will achieve the landowners' goals of making their properties free of illegally dumped waste material.

Piles of dumped materials pose a threat to the general public and may create a health hazard by attracting rodents and snakes. Removal of this waste will protect the environment and wildlife habitat on the ranch.

Methods include; removal and proper disposal of waste materials, returning the gullies to a natural angle of repose, mulching all disturbed areas, and re-vegetation with native tree species.
