Project Summary: This project includes one site that is approximately 2.75 miles in length along Poso Creek starting at a point that is 5 miles due north of Hwy 46 in Wasco, CA along Palm Avenue. Palm Avenue ends at Blankenship, and the site begins approximately 1/4 mile to the north along the same direction. The site is characterized by large quantities of illegally dumped appliances, furniture, domestic waste, tires, construction refuse, vehicles, and various other waste items.

Site 1 (Boydston Site) is located at the corner of Rd 264 and Ave 92 East of Terabella 4 miles, and site 2 (Muller Site) is located on Ave 80 and Rd 272 SE of Terrabella 6 miles. Both of the sites have varying amounts of waste impeding grazing, wildlife habitat and farmland production. With grant funding for waste clean up, outreach and education, the repeated illegal dumping and its subsequent health hazards and negative aesthetic value can be abated.

Project Summary: The Yolo County Resource Conservation District in collaboration with Paddock Orchard requests funds for solid waste cleanup in Yolo County. The site contains a variety of waste materials, including: household waste, appliances, automobiles, scrap metal, and agricultural waste. The proposed project will remove, properly dispose of and recycle waste material from the site, and repair and revegetate the area distributed by the removal. Implementating the proposed project will achieve the landowner's goals of making his property free of illegally dumped waste material and enhancing with habitat value of the 'Little Lamb Valley' Slough that was historic dumping site on the south edge of his property. The restoration will fill a 450-foot gap in a mile-long slough revegetation program underway by the Audubon Landowner Stewardship Program.

Work will be performed by the Marin Conservation Corps.

The site is located next to a private road used by the community. The project will include placement of quarry rock to control erosion once the wastes are removed. This project will eliminate a threat to surface water quality and potable water supplies and remove an attractive nuisance.

Project Summary: The Humboldt County Division of Environmental Health is applying for this grant on behalf of a private property owner. This property owner holds many acres of land in silviculture; illegal dumping is a problem where the public has road access to their lands. This project proposes to remediate 7 sites which occur in four distinct areas: Stafford, Shively, Dyerville, and Kneeland. The property owner will provide company personnel and equipment necessary to remove the waste and stabilize the sites, making this an efficient and cost-effective proposal.

Project Summary: Imperial County consists of 4,597 square miles or 2,942,080 acres. Approximately 50% of county lands are undeveloped and under federal ownership and jurisdiction. Approximately 20% is irrigated for agricultural purposes. Imperial County Environmental Health Services is seeking financial assistance for the cleanup of 6 (six) illegal solid waste sites on farm or ranch property located in Imperial County. It has been determined by Imperial County Local Enforcement Agency that the property owners are not responsible for the illegal disposal of solid waste on their property. The above sites are located in agricultural zoned areas of Imperial County and due to their remote locations have become an attractive nuisance for continued illegal disposal.

Project Summary: Branscomb Road Cleanup Project. Cleanup of illegally-dumped trash between Branscomb Road and the South Fork of the Eel River, a protected California Wild and Scenic River, and erection of gates and barriers to block future vehicle entry to the cleaned-up areas. The Cleanup area encompasses six locations in close proximity. Project includes a public education campaign to discourage future dumping. Project will be exceptionally cost-effective due to use of Parlin Fork Conservation Camp inmates for manual cleanup work at nominal cost, and donation of administration, project management and truck and trailer time by applicant agency.

Project Summary: This project seeks funding to provide for on-farm cleanup, restoration, site security and bilingual outreach to prevent future dumping on private agricultural lands in Monterey County. Illegal dumping is rampant throughout Monterey County, and agricultural landowners and managers are often disproportionately impacted due to the size, isolation and accessibility of their acreage. The sites selected for cleanup and abatement are nuisances to our cooperating landowners and managers, and they pose a range of threats to public safety, the property beneficial uses, as well as sensitive environments through Monterey County. All 8 project sites will include site cleanup as well as installation of security measures to prevent future, recurrent dumping.

Project Summary: Illegal dumping of appliances, household trash and tires is occurring at two sites in north San Diego County. Site A is located in a low lying area with dumping occurring along the roadside. 1,035 ft. of fencing will be installed to deter future dumping. Site B is located 3/4 mile north of Site A and dumping occurs along a 3,100 ft stretch of roadside down steep hillsides. 600 feet of fencing will be installed at in four specific areas. Dumping locations at both sites occur in native vegetation adjacent to citrus and avocado groves and the sites drain down to other active tree crop groves and plant nurseries. Ground water in the area is threatened which is used for both potable and nonpotable purposes.

Project Summary: The two separate farm and ranch properties that are the subject of this grant application have been victimized by illegal solid waste dumping in areas immediately adjacent to perennial creeks, in some instances waste is in direct contact with water. Due to the steep terrain and proximity to the creeks, Probation Camp Supervised Adult Crews will hand remove all deleterious materials from the site to a temporary staging area where materials will be sorted for transport to the appropriate final destination (metal recycling, waste tires, solid waste, household hazardous waste). The cleanup of these two sites will eliminate the health and safety threat posed by the waste to the public, wildlife and the environment.
