Project Summary: Remove the mechanical assistance and hand labor approximately 2,000 tires and 40 cubic yards of miscellaneous debris. Tires will be removed and recycled by Waste Recovery West and the metals and other recyclable materials will be brought to Marin Sanitary Service for resource recovery. Labor will be provided by the Marin Conservation Corps and a private contractor.

Project Summary: Remove with mechanical assistance and hand labor approximately 7,000 loose tires and 80 cubic yards of miscellaneous debris from ranch at 3599 Dillon Beach Road, Tomales, CA 94971 (Assessor's Parcel Number 100-100-13) in Marin County. Tires will be removed and recycled by Waste Recovery West and the metals and other recyclable materials will be brought to Marin Sanitary Services for resource recovery. Labor will be provided by the Marin Conservation Corps and a private contractor.

Project Summary: Protect an illegal-dumping 'hot spot' alongside the environmentally -sensitive Eel River by erecting a tall wire fence along county road frontage of this 112-acre property. Reimburse property owner for ongoing illegal dump disposal and recycling fees for cleanup he has carried out from January 1, 2005 through the completion of fence. Grant project will allow property owner to proceed with development of tree farm.

Project Summary: We are proposing to clean up an estimated 400 + cubic yards of piled and scattered wastes in the Jackrabbit Flat and Rocky Ledge areas outside of Burney in Northeastern Shasta County on timber production lands. California Conservation Corps crew members will pick-up wastes from surrounding land and place in bins. Once illegally-dumped wastes are removed, large rocks will be strategically-placed to block unauthorized access along Burney Creek to discourage dumping. A public education outreach component will consist of signs that encourage land stewardship and proper disposal which will be installed in the project areas and informational handouts will be available.

Project Summary: This project encompasses two different geographic areas, site 1 is located in Tulare County and site 2 is located in Kern County. Site 1 (Zaninovich is located off of Cecil Ave 8 miles East of Delano, site 2 (Rab) is located at the East end of Ave 380 (15 mi NW of Visalia). Both of these sites have varying amounts of waste impeding grazing, wildlife habitat and farmland production. With grant funding for waste clean up and education the repeated illegal dumping and its subsequent health hazards and negative aesthetic value can be abated.

Project Summary: The Yolo County RCD, in collaboration with Helen McCloskey and Eberardo Garcia Mendez, property owners, requests funds for solid waste cleanup of four historical dump sites on three parcels in Yolo Co. the sites contain a variety of waste material including: household waste, appliances, automobiles, tires, scarp metal and agricultural waste. The proposed project will remove, properly dispose of and recycle waste material from the four sites and repair/revegetate the area disturbed by the removal. Implementing the proposed project will achieve the landowners' goals of making their property free of illegally dumped waste material and enhance the habitat value of the waterways. The habitat restoration will be part of a larger planning and implementation project to enhance wildlife values of those properties.

The proposed project will remove, properly dispose of and recycle waste material from the site, and repair and revegetate the area disturbed by the removal. Implementing the proposed project will achieve the landowner's goals of making his property free of illegally dumped waste material and enhancing the habitat value of the Chickahominy Slough the was a historic dumping site in the middle of his property. The restoration will restore at least four sites, totaling about 200 feet of creek bank, along the half-mile portion of the slough that passes through the parcel, which is Parcel # 050-150-03.

Project Summary: Remove and dispose of concrete, asphalt and contaminated dirt from tribal member's property on the Cabazon Reservation. This was an illegal, open dump site located at North Avenue 50, very close to the Wash area. The materials will be disposed of at Western Environmental, which is a municipal solid waste recycle business located in the Cabazon Recycle and Recovery Park.

Project Summary: Local resident and active environmentalist George Waegell owns property that neighbors an area landfill. Recently, more than 300 tires have been dumped on his property by unknown individuals. One pile obstructs an access road, the other pile sits on the bank of a canal. The tires are filled with rainwater and are a potential mosquito breeding ground if not removed by Spring. Interested parties are concerned about contaminants leaching from the tires into the canal and other nearby waterways. Vehicles using the access road must drive onto the shoulder, possibly eroding the banks. Mr. Waegell has reason to believe that whoever is responsible for the tires is also responsible for other vandalism to the property, including damage to the access gate and the shooting of trespassing signs.

Project Summary: The County of San Diego will conduct a cleanup of a property located at 6965 W Lilac Road in Bonsall, CA 92003 to remove nearly 2,000 illegally disposed waste tires, metal, construction and demolition materials, appliances, and household trash. The cleanup will take during fiscal year 2005-2006. A CIWMB registered tire hauler will transport removed tires to a recycling facility. The appliances, metal and construction and demolition materials will also be transported to recycling facilities.

Project Summary: This project will enable the cleanup of 11 illegal dumpsites on public (US Forest Service) and private lands throughout Trinity County, which is over 80% federally managed, primarily for timber production. This project includes for the first time illegal dumpsites in the Mad River and Lower Trinity Ranger Districts. These identified sites are zones for timber production and pose a significant health hazard to downstream residents and wildlife. Funds will be used to clean these sites up, block access where possible, and to educate the public on the negative effects of non-official dump sites.

Project Summary: The Humboldt County LEA is applying to the State of California Integrated Waste Management Board Farm and Ranch Solid Waste Cleanup and Abatement Grant Program for reimbursement on behalf of a private property owner, Green Diamond Resource Company. Green Diamond hired a contractor who remediated an approximately 300 cubic yard site known as the Holmes-Davis Dump between September 2003 and September 2004. The total cost to Green Diamond was \$51,071.00; this application requests reimbursement of \$50,000.00.

Project Summary: The illegal dumpsite is located in a very steep ravine located at the headwaters area on Hurlbut Creek, a tributary to the Russian River. Due to the very steep slopes, an excavator and crane will be used to access the upper portion of the disposal site. Probation Camp supervised Adult Crew hand labor will be utilized to pick up and deposit debris into boxes, which will be winched to an off road vehicle, for cleanup of the lower portion of the dumpsite. Debris will be brought to a staging area where scrap metal, unpainted wood, hazardous waste, waste tires and refuse will be sorted and segregated for proper storage, processing, recycling and/or disposal. Erosion control/site restoration measures will be implemented.

The waste in this area continues to grow at an exponential rate, however with funding we can stop the negative effects to the environment and limit access to this site.
