Project Summary: Imperial County consists of 4,597 square miles or 2,942,080 acres. Approximately 50% of county lands are undeveloped and under federal ownership and jurisdiction. Approximately 20% is irrigated for agricultural purposes. Imperial County Environmental Health Service is seeking financial assistance for the cleanup of seven (7) illegal solid waste sites on farm property located in Imperial County. It has been determined by Imperial County Local Enforcement Agency that the property owners are not responsible for the illegal disposal of solid waste on their property. That above sites are all located in agricultural areas of Imperial County and due to their remote locations have become an attractive nuisance for continued illegal disposal.

Project Summary: This grant project will involve the removal of large volumes of solid waste from three privately owned sites. In each case, the property owners did not create the violations and none have the resources to remediate the conditions. The health and environmental benefits of the project include immediate protection of nearby bodies of water from point source contamination, removal of vector habitat, removal of community blight, and restoration of the affected lands to their original state.

Project Summary: Debris removal and installation of barrier fencing is proposed on two agriculturally zoned parcels in north San Diego County. Illegal dumping of construction debris, appliances, household trash and tires is occurring throughout both parcels which are located along Pala Temecula Road, a corridor road between Riverside and San Diego counties. Old grove roads on the properties are eroded and pitted requiring the use of skip loaders to gather material and bring to central staging sites. 813 feet of galvanized fence and a drive through grove gate are proposed to deter future dumping.

Project Summary: This project will complete the final phase of clean up of a legacy dump on an agricultural property that is currently leased for a commercial cattle operation and is within the Yolo Bypass which receives winter floodwaters from the Sacramento River. The workplan consists of collection of scattered trash, separation, transportation and disposal/recycling of trash as well as photodocumentation and reporting. The lessee and owner have already disposed of much of the trash and have fenced off the property to discourage unauthorized access. Clean-up of this site will reduce potential hazards to the Yolo Bypass Wildlife Area and Reclamation District 2068's drainage ditch.

Project Summary: Glenn Co. Dept. of Planning and Public Works seeks these grant funds to cleanup a dump site on the MX Ranch property in Glenn Co. because the waste is a nuisance, utilizes livestock grazing ground and can cause physical harm to commercial livestock being raised and grazed on the property. The site is used as a rangeland for raising and grazing cattle for commercial sale. The site is an illegal disposal site and the responsibility party cannot be identified, located or pay for timely and proper remediation. The current use and intended future use is for raising and grazing cattle and horses for commercial sale.

Project Summary: This grant concerns a section of Sherwood Rd beyond that covered by earlier F and R grant in 2003. This remote timber area has been a long-standing, serious illegal dumping problem along a seasonal unpaved county road that crosses two sensitive watersheds. This project would utilize CA Conservation Corp and MSWMA staff, with equipment donated by timberland owner, to remove trash and recyclable waste. Landowner will then donate equipment and concrete rubble to block off access to the areas that were cleaned.

Project Summary: The Department of Environmental Health, Hazardous Materials Compliance Division, in collaboration with the Department of Roads and Airports and District 3, of the County Board of Supervisors, will use awarded grant monies for resolving the Clayton Road illegal dumping problem and install fencing to prevent refuse accumulation problems in the future. The parcels along Clayton Road in the unincorporated areas of San Jose, belonging to the Springer, Furtado, Nguyen, Malik and two Barry families are zoned for agricultural use and are currently subject to illegal dumping at the site. An assessment of the site revealed approximately one hundred and forty (140) cubic yards of solid waste which includes twenty-five (25) large household appliances, over eighty (89) automobile tires, and twenty-five (15) large metal pieces of automobiles, motorcycles, and other miscellaneous materials that will be removed and recycled with the grant.

Project Summary: Removal of approximately 2,500-3000 illegally dumped tires in a gully on one site owned by William and Robin Rich, private agriculture land in Shasta County. RCD field crews will clean and load tires into trailers provided by Waste Recovery West. The Shasta County Fire Marshall will work with RCD staff to minimize fire hazards .

The owner was unaware the property contained tires at the time of purchase. Upon grant approval, the Tehama Co. Sanitary Landfill Agency will coordinate with Waste Tire Products to recycle the tires. The proposed grant would remove 452 tires from one site.

Project Summary: The Yolo RCD, in collaboration w/landowners Robert and Virginia Spurlock, request funds for solid waste clean up of one parcel in north western Yolo Co. The site contains a variety of waste materials including: household waste, empty 50 gallon drums, appliances, and a truck bed frame. The proposed project will remove, properly dispose of, and recycle waste materials from the site as well as repair and revegetate the area disturbed by the removal. The implementation of the proposed project will achieve the landowner's goals of clearing their property of illegally dumped waste materials, and enhance the habitat value of their property. The habitat restoration on the Spurlock's swale is part of a larger planning and implementation project to enhance wildlife habitat of the Spurlock property and that of their neighbors along County Road 45.
