Sit access will be restricted for future illegal dumping if the cost to restrict access is within the scope of the grant, dependant upon each individual site. Project Summary: The Sutter Co. RCD is seeking funding for the clean up of illegal refuse on property in Sutter Co. owned by Charles Roberts. Before Mr. . Roberts bought the property in 2001, it was owned by the Kellogg Family, who spread refuse around the property including: within several ditches and intermittent creeks, near an old barn, on the foundation of an old building, and around an old abandoned house. The type of refuse that needs to be removed includes: old rusted oil barrels (some partially filled); old rotting wood; a large pile of rusted scrap metal (including cables, barbwire, and tin); an old refrigerator , shopping cart, wheelbarrow, and manual lawnmower; a broken, gutted fuse panel; old automobile tires and batteries; and old glass bottles and aerosol cans. Some of the refuse is concentrated in piles and some is scattered around several acres of the property.

Project Summary: The Imperial County Local Enforcement Agency (LEA) has reviewed a request submitted by a farm property owner for the reimbursement of costs associated with the cleanup of illegally disposed waste on property jointly owned by Grizzle Farmland LLC and Tyler Family Property LLC. The property is designated as agricultural land and the current use of the property for stacking hay is consistent with use as farm land. The LEA has determined that the removal of illegally disposed household wastes, wood pallets, waste tires, and green wastes from the site is eligible for funding under Title 14, Chapter 4.5 of the California Code of Regulations. Therefore, the LEA is submitting an application for consideration of funding the completed remediation of the property. The cleanup of the farm property was completed in February of 2007.

Project Summary: The Pinoleville Pomo Nation wishes to clean up existing dump sites on three parcels located within the historic boundaries of the rancharia. At each site, construction automotive, household, and agricultural waste will be collected, sorted, and re-used, recycled or disposed of in an appropriate facility. In two sites, drums - with potentially hazardous contents - will be disposed of by licensed contractors. Once cleaned, each site will be landscaped with trees and shrubs, and posted as a `no dumping` site.

Project Summary: The County of Santa Barbara is applying for a Farm and Ranch Cleanup and Abatement grant to cleanup an illegal dumping site off of Refugio Road in the Santa Ynez Valley of Santa Barbara County. Material has been illegally dumped for a number of years at this site and the area impacted is approximately 10,500 square feet. Material dumped consists of household trash, furniture, appliances , vehicles, a horse trailer, and various other items. The total cost of the remediation project, including revegetation, is \$68,321 and the County is willing to pay for all costs exceeding the grant request of \$49,823.

Upon grant approval, the Tehama County Sanitary Landfill Agency will coordinate with TRI-C to reuse salvageable tires, recycle the rubber off of unsalvageable tires, and property dispose of any materials that are not recyclable. The proposed grant would remove approximately 400 tractor and grader tires from one site.

Project Summary: This frontage on Tomki Road, a county road, has been an illegal dumping trouble spot for many years. An absentee owner took no action to protect the 480 acre property. With the purchase recently by new owners, there is a willingness to protect it. This grant project would reimburse certain expenditures already made by the owners to clean it up, and fund construction of 1.3 miles of fencing and gates to stop future dumping.

Project Summary: Remove a large piles of tires (8,500+), various scattered trash, couches , and abandoned cars from the Vino Farms property. The removal is critical because the property is located on the flood plain between the Cosumnes River and Deer Creek. Because Deer Creek is not leveed, some flooding exists almost every year. Debris is likely to be carried downstream. Water also collects in the tires and serves as a breeding ground for mosquito.

Project Summary: This project consists of the removal of approximately 1000 illegally dumped tires from two sites in Shasta County. Both sites are currently in agriculture use, one being a dairy and the other a cow calf operation. Both sites are privately owned. WSRCD field crews will clean and load all tires into trailers supplied by the waste recycling contractor, Waste Tire Products or Waste Recovery West. After the tires are removed, signs will be posted stating `no dumping` and native grass seeds and other erosion control measures will be used throughout the site on disturbed areas where needed.

Project Summary: The Yolo County Resource Conservation District in collaboration with DH Long Farms requests funds for solid waste cleanup in Yolo County. The site contains a variety of waste material including: concrete, wire fencing, tires, appliances, automobiles, scrap metal, and household waste. The proposed project will remove, properly dispose of and recycle waste material from the site, and repair and revegetate and area disturbed by the removal. Implementing the proposed project will achieve the landowner's goals of making their property free of illegally dumped waste material and enhancing the habitat value of Oat Creek and it's tributaries that became a historic dumping site on their property. The restoration will restore one site, totaling about 300 feet of creek-bank, that passes through the parcel, which is Parcel #054-020-17-1.

Project Summary: the Imperial County Local Enforcement Agency (LEA) has initiated a substantial solid waste cleanup and abatement project in collaboration with the California Integrated Waste Management Board to remediate up to fifteen illegal disposal sites on agricultural lands within the Imperial Valley to protect public health and the environment. In an effort to assist these rural farmers that have been victimized by illegal dumping, the LEA is submitting an application for the consideration of funding to reimburse farm property owners that have taken proactive steps to remediate their properties and to protect their land from future illegal dumping. The cleanup of the farm properties has been initiated by the owners in response to LEA requests, and the reimbursement grant monies will be used only as authorized by Title 14, Section 17992.2 of the California Code of Regulations to partially or wholly offset the costs of the cleanup projects that have been completed by qualifying property owners. Each completed project will be submitted to the State for review and approval prior to the issuance of reimbursement payments. No costs that are deemed ineligible will be reimbursed.
