



Plan for Supporting Safe Collection and Disposal of Waste Devices

Currently, the requirements of California Public Resources Code Section 47115, apply to two of our products – Twinject[®] (epinephrine injection, USP 1:1000) auto injector, Adrenaclick[®] (epinephrine injection, USP) auto injector and an authorized generic similar to the Adrenaclick[®]. Outlined below are the actions Shionogi Inc. has taken to date with regard to our products.

- Shionogi provides written information detailing the proper disposal of needles and syringes to all Twinject[®] and Adrenaclick[®] patients in the patient leaflets.
- The leaflet instructs the patient to replace the cap over the needle, and to replace the injectors back into the holders.
- The leaflet instructs the patients to consult with their Healthcare Provider regarding the proper disposal of units.
- The Twinject[®] and Adrenaclick[®] leaflets are readily available on the Shionogi Inc. website. The website also contains an instructional video on the proper use and disposal of the products.
