

Plan for Supporting Safe Collection and Disposal of Waste devices (June 2014)

As Required by California Public Resources Code section 47115-47116 and Minnesota Statutes Chapter 286

The statutory requirements of California apply to three (3) of our products – AVONEX® (interferon beta-1a), ALPROLIX™ [Coagulation Factor IX (Recombinant), Fc Fusion Protein] and ELOCTATE™ [Antihemophilic Factor (Recombinant), Fc Fusion Protein] although ELOCTATE is not yet available in California. Outlined below are the actions Biogen Idec has taken to date with regard to the foregoing products:

AVONEX

- Biogen Idec provides written information detailing the proper disposal of needles and syringes to all AVONEX patients in our Medication Guide (“AVONEX Guide”).
- The AVONEX Guide directs patients to dispose of used needles and syringes in a puncture resistant container.
- The AVONEX Guide advises patients that there may be state and/or local laws regarding the disposal of used needles and syringes, and patients are further directed to consult their doctor, nurse or pharmacist to obtain instructions on how to dispose of their used needles and syringes.
- The AVONEX Guide is readily accessible electronically on the Biogen Idec website.
- The Biogen Idec patient services call center staff have been trained to relay the information contained in the Guide to patients that seek information regarding the disposal of their Sharps.
- Each new AVONEX patient that participates in our starter kit program is counseled regarding the safe disposal of syringes.

ALPROLIX AND ELOCTATE

- ALPROLIX and ELOCTATE are self-administered hemophilia therapies (ALPROLIX is approved for use in patients with Hemophilia B and ELOCTATE is approved for use in patients with Hemophilia A) through licensed specialty pharmacies and home care pharmacies.
- Biogen Idec works with these pharmacies and our own Patient Services Group to provide patients with Sharps containers and disposal programs in accordance with California medical waste requirements.
- We have informed all of our specialty and home care pharmacies in California of the relevant regulations to ensure that they have proper and effective Sharps disposal procedures in place.
- To improve patient education on this topic, we have structured our ALPROLIX and ELOCTATE websites to include instructions on proper Sharps disposal.
- We have also provided patient guidance on the proper disposal of Sharps in the Instructions for Use (“IFUs”) with each ALPROLIX and ELOCTATE product package.
