

Plan for Supporting Safe Collection and Disposal of Waste Devices (July 2017)

As Required by California Public Resources Code section 47115-47116 and Minnesota Statutes Chapter 286

Biogen is recognized as a sustainability leader and is committed to acting as a responsible corporate citizen in all of its activities. Biogen supports the proper disposal of syringes, needles, and other sharps generated in a home setting to mitigate potential public health risks. We take this responsibility seriously and work to educate patients about how to safely handle and dispose of our products.

Biogen submits the following plan describing how we support the safe collection and proper disposal of waste from self-injected at home medications that include sharps for three (3) of our products − AVONEX®, PLEGRIDY™ and ZINBRYTA®.

AVONEX, PLEGRIDY and ZINBRYTA

- Biogen provides written information detailing the proper disposal of injector pens, needles and syringes to all AVONEX, PLEGRIDY and ZINBRYTA patients in our AVONEX, PLEGRIDY and ZINBRYTA Instructions for Use ("AVONEX, PLEGRIDY and ZINBRYTA Instructions").
- The AVONEX, PLEGRIDY and ZINBRYTA Instructions direct patients to dispose of used injector pens, needles and syringes in a puncture resistant container.
- The AVONEX, PLEGRIDY and ZINBRYTA Instructions advise patients that there may be state and/or local laws
 regarding the disposal of used injector pens, needles and syringes, and patients are further directed to
 consult their doctor, nurse or pharmacist to obtain instructions on how to dispose of their used injector
 pens, needles and syringes.
- The AVONEX, PLEGRIDY and ZINBRYTA Instructions are readily accessible electronically on the Biogen website.
- The Biogen patient services call center staff have been trained to relay the information contained in the PLEGRIDY and AVONEX Instructions to patients that seek information regarding the disposal of their Injector Pens and Sharps.
- Each new AVONEX patient that participates in our starter kit program is counseled regarding the safe disposal of syringes.
