CARE's Executive Director's Message

Second quarter results indicate progress continues in the right direction with continuous growth in both gross collections and recycled output. The subsidy changes made and grant programs initiated in October 2015 are beginning to manifest and expected to accelerate in Q3 & Q4 as new capacity and products come on line, both for polymers and backing materials. We are pleased to acknowledge a new Processor, CLEAR, is now operational in NoCal. It should be noted that PET, as expected, is a key driver for recycled output growth due to the subsidy changes implemented.

Our new Double-Green product concept is gaining early traction with new products which contain both post-consumer carpet and another post-consumer recycled material – in this case rubber. Last quarter I stated it will take several months of product development and testing before we know if these new products will be commercially viable and it looks like we are right on track.

CARE achieved its objective to hold face to face visits with 50% of all CA-based carpet retailer visits by the end of 2016 ahead of schedule. The objective was met in July and efforts are now turning to the remaining retailers throughout the Sate and in coordination with new counties coming on line.

CARE's annual audit and annual report were submitted to CalRecycle on July 1st and we are awaiting the assessment at the September 20th public hearing. Due to the complexity of the market and analytical efforts underway, CARE requested a 60 days extension for submission of the new 5-Year Plan. This request was granted by CalRecycle with a new target date of October 15th. CalRecycle will issue their analysis of the new Plan at the December 20th meeting.

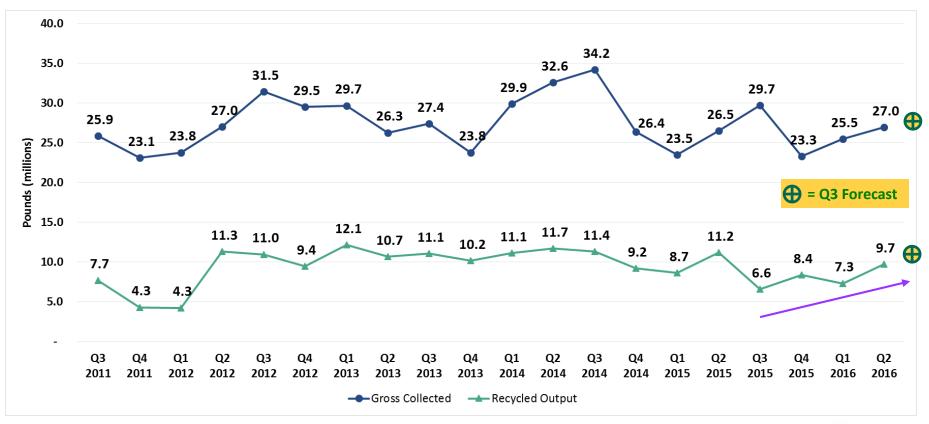

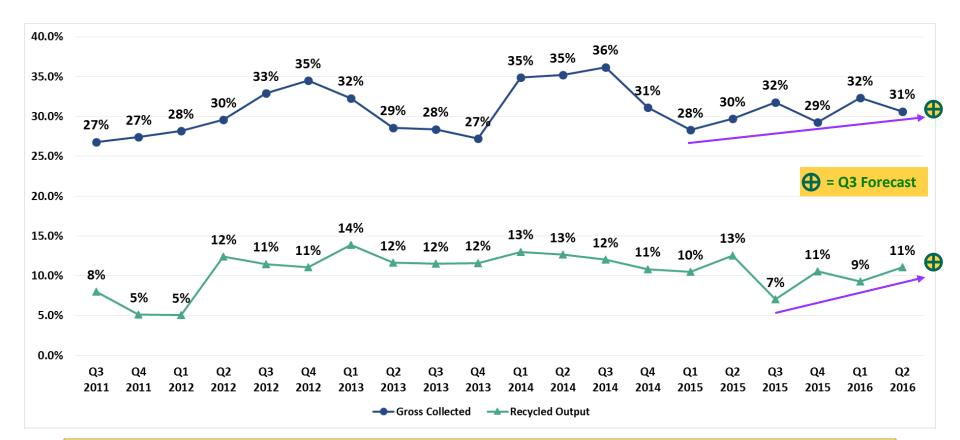


AB 2398 Performance Trends (millions of pounds)





AB 2398 Performance Trends (percentage)



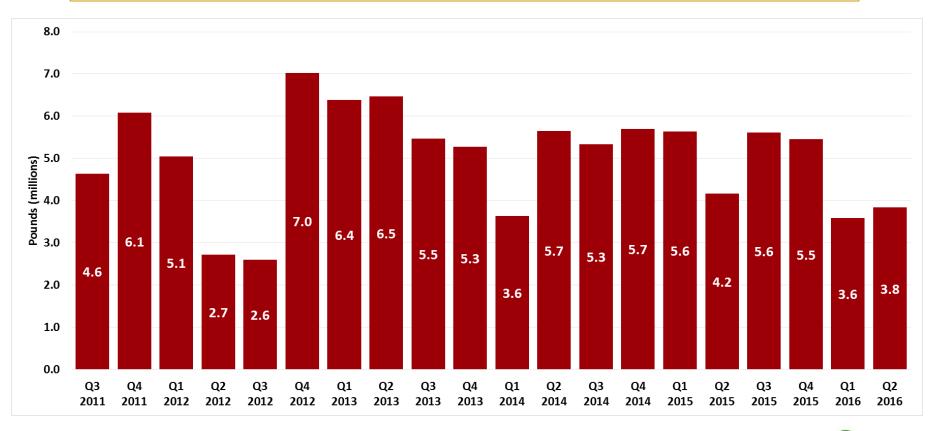
Beginning Q3-2015, adjustments for water content were applied.

Beginning Q2-2015, the discards calculation applies updated variables to the discard formula for R (0.84) and D (0.0051), based on new data from third party firm Market Insights, LLC dated 3/2015. Formula adjustment is presented in 2014 Annual Report. These adjustments result is a reduced discards estimate of (1M) lbs in Q2-2015 and increased RO rate of 0.3%. No retroactive adjustments have been made at this time.



Gross Collected PCC Sent Back to Landfill*





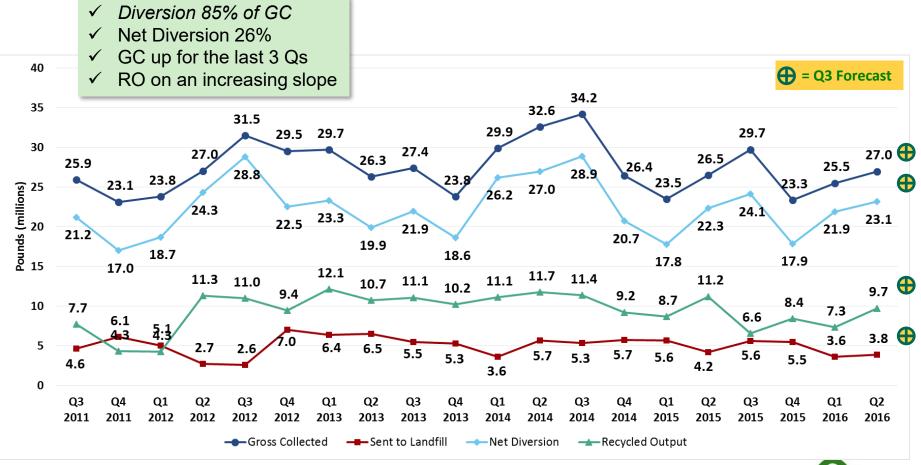
Q2-2016 Gross Collected: 27.0M pounds – 3.8M sent back to landfill Cumulative back to landfill: 100.4M lbs.

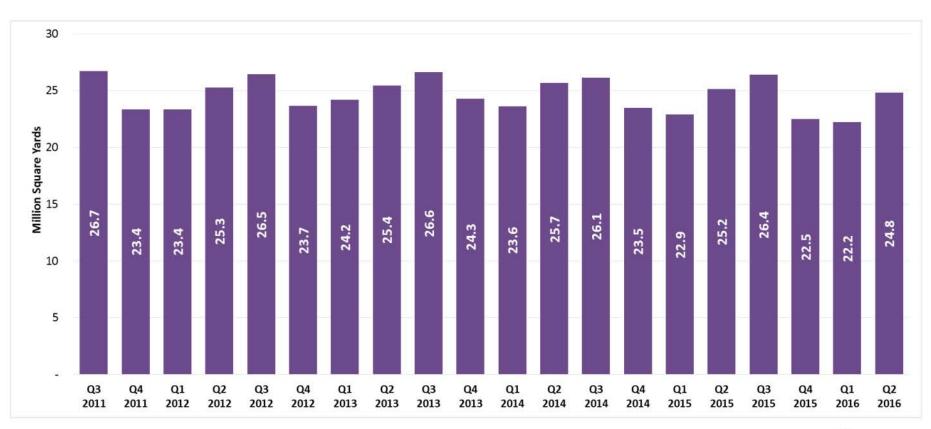

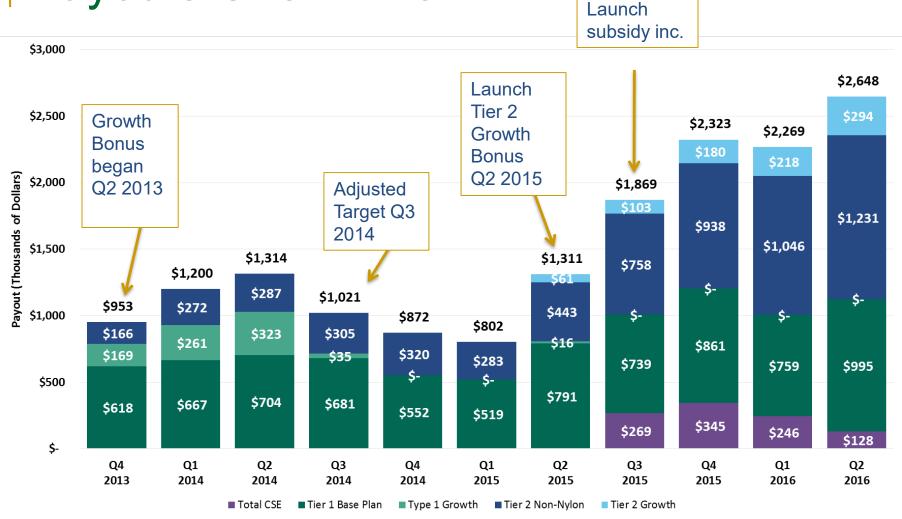

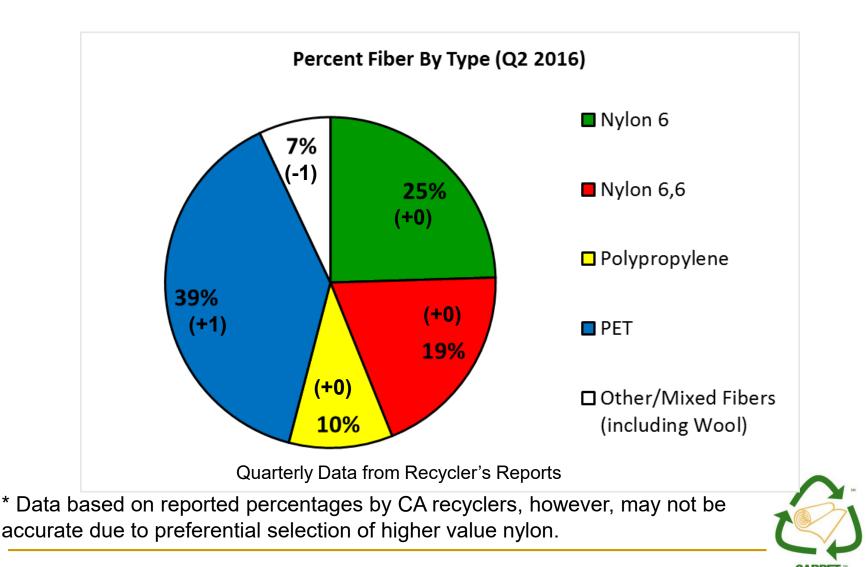

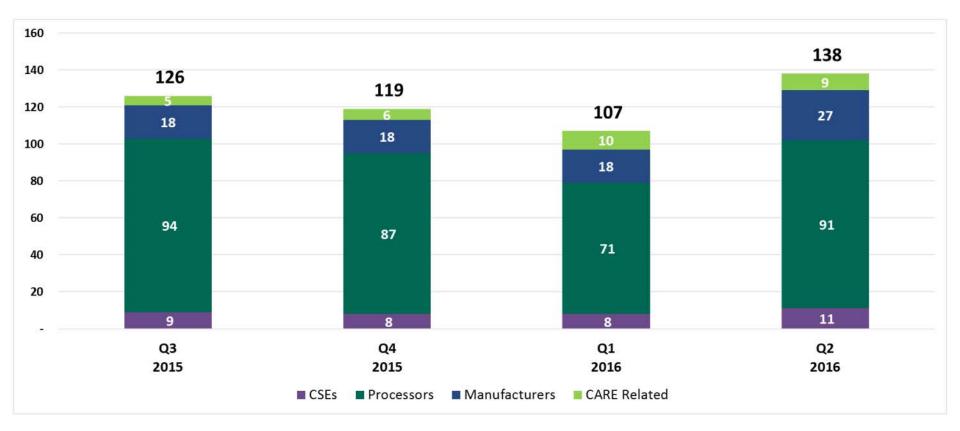

CA Fulltime Equivalents (FTEs)



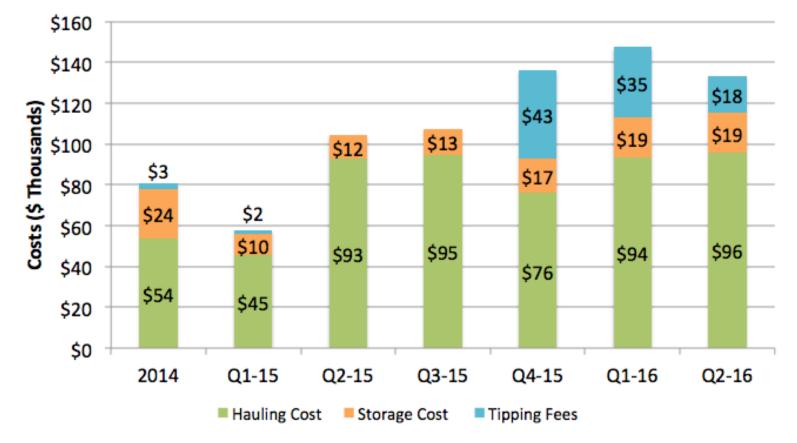


Drop-Off Site / Collections Program Update

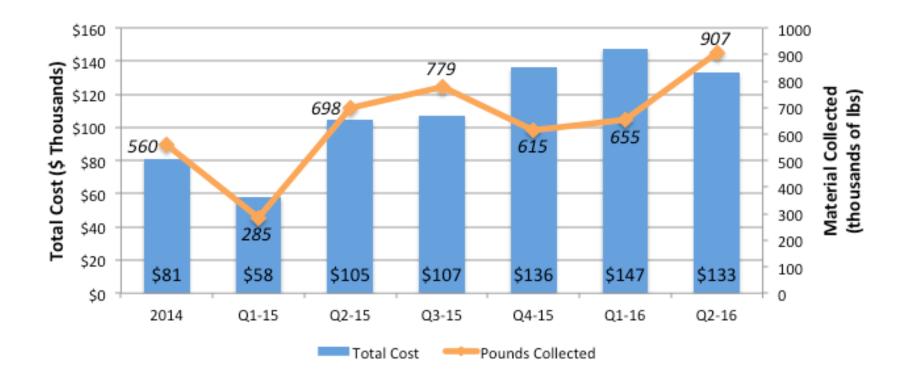
Program Cost Over Time



 Percentage of Q2 '16 Total Cost: Tipping-Fees=13%; Hauling=72%; Storage=15%



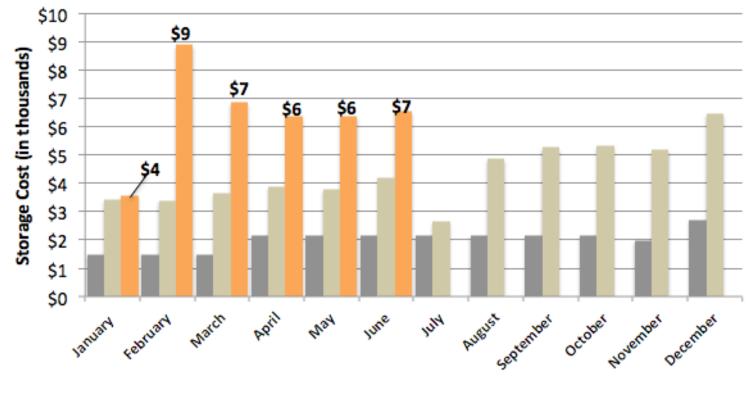
Pounds Collected Relative to Total Cost*

Storage Cost over Time

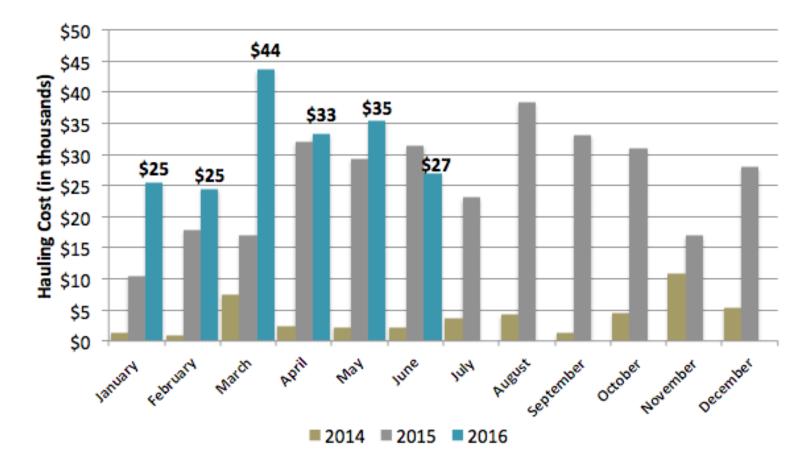
