10	§ 17988.1. Scope and Purpose.
11	This Article establishes an administrative certification fee schedule and clarifies
12	administrative procedures related to payments and submittal and resubmittal of proofs of
13	certification to the department as set forth in sections 42281.5, 42282, and 42282.1 of the
14	Public Resources Code. These regulations are designed to facilitate the process by which
15	reusable grocery bag producers provide proof of certification to the department and
16	ensure that the required administrative certification fee sufficiently covers the
17	department's reasonable costs to implement its responsibilities under the law pursuant to
18	Chapter 5.3 (commencing with section 42280), Part 3, Division 30 of the Public
19	Resources Code.

23	§ 17988.2. Definitions.
24	(a) The definitions set forth in this Section and in Chapter 5.3 (commencing with
25	section 42280), Part 3, Division 30 of the Public Resources Code, shall govern the
26	construction of this Article.
27	(b) "Aesthetic change" means a change in decoration-to a reusable grocery bag that
28	does not affect the material composition, color formulation, size, or construction or the
29	results of the chemical or physical tests of a certified reusable grocery bag, pursuant to

30 sections 42281 and 42281.5 of the Public Resources Code, and does not constitute a

31 change that creates a new type of reusable grocery bag. <u>An aesthetic change includes.</u>

32	but is not limited to, a decoration color formulation that uses the same inks, or
33	pigments <u>in any proportion, or any combination or selection from a suite of inks, dyes, or</u>
34	pigments in any proportion for the type of reusable grocery bag that was previously
35	submitted in a proof of certification.
36	(c) <u>"Appropriate washing equipment" means the washing equipment employed to</u>
37	clean postconsumer recycled material by removing physical and/or chemical
38	contaminants so it is suitable for use in manufacturing a reusable grocery bag.
39	Appropriate washing equipment includes, but is not limited to, dry and wet washing
40	technologies.
41	(d) (e) "Certified Reusable Grocery Bags and Producers List" means the list of
42	reusable grocery bag producers from which the department has received the payment,
43	required by section 42282.1 of the Public Resources Code, and a proof of certification for
44	each type of reusable grocery bag that $\frac{1}{2}$ the producer offers for sale or distributes in the
45	state of California, as required by sections 42281, 42281.5, and 42282 of the Public
46	Resources Code.
47	(e) <u>"Color formulation" means the inks and dyes, in any propertion, that meet the</u>
48	requirements of section 42281 of the Public Resources Code and are used to
49	manufacture a single type of reusable grocery bag.
50	(e) "Decoration" means the coloration and/or treatments applied to a reusable grocery
51	bag using inks, dyes, pigments, decals, or other methods.
52	(f) "Fabric Weight" means the weight of the fabric used in the construction of a
53	reusable grocery bag reported in units of grams per square meter. Fabric weight may be
54	measured based on a single sample or based on an average of the weights of one sample
55	taken from each of the following locations: the handles, reusable grocery bag opening,
56	and body of the reusable grocery bag. Samples may include more than one layer of fabric,
57	based on the construction of the reusable grocery bag.
58	(g) (f) (d) "ISO/IEC 17025" means the International Organization for
59	Standardization/International Electrotechnical Commission "General requirements for the
60	competence of testing and calibration laboratories."
61	(h) (g) "Point of sale" means the place where items are purchased in from a store,

62 such as at a checkout counter or via an online payment transaction. "Point of sale"

63 includes any location where a store fulfils an order to its customers as part of an online64 transaction, a phone order, or by similar means.

(i) (h) (e) "Proof of certification" means a document (or multiple documents) submitted
by a reusable grocery bag producer under penalty of perjury to the department via the
Reusable Grocery Bag Reporting System. A proof of certification shall demonstrate that
a reusable grocery bag sold or distributed to a store in California, as defined by section
42280(g) of the Public Resources Code, is compliant with the provisions of this Article.

(i) (i) (i) (i) (i) Reusable grocery bag" has the same meaning as in section 42280 of the
Public Resources Code, and includes, but is not limited to, a reusable grocery bag made
with plastic film, compostable plastic film, or with natural or synthetic fiber, including, but
not limited to, woven or non-woven nylon, polypropylene, polyethylene-terephthalate, or
Tyvek.

(k) (j) (g) "Reusable Grocery Bag Reporting System" means the department's online
 database established to receive proofs of certification from reusable grocery bag
 producers for reusable grocery bags.

(I) (+) "Third-party certification entity" means an independent laboratory that is
 ISO/IEC 17025 accredited, and performs applicable testing and certifies that a reusable
 grocery bag meets the requirements of section 42281 and 42281.5 of the Public
 Resources Code.

(m) (+) (+) "Type of reusable grocery bag" means a reusable grocery bag manufactured,
 imported, sold, or distributed by a certified reusable grocery bag producer that has is a
 different material composition, decoration <u>color formulation</u>, or size, or construction or has
 different results for chemical or physical tests than another reusable grocery bag
 manufactured, <u>imported</u>, sold, or distributed by the same certified reusable grocery bag
 producer.

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91 § 17988.3. Submittal and Resubmittal of a Proof of Certification.

92 (a) A reusable grocery bag producer shall submit a proof of certification to the
 93 Reusable Grocery Bag Reporting System for each type of reusable grocery bag that it
 94 manufactures, <u>imports</u>, sells, or distributes in the state and provides to a store for sale or
 95 distribution <u>at the point of sale</u>. <u>The proof of certification shall</u> have been <u>be completed</u>
 96 <u>by a third-party certification entity within three months</u> prior to<u>-of the date it is submitted</u>
 97 to the department and it shall include an accreditation number confirming the third-party
 98 <u>certification entity is an accredited ISO/IEC 17025 laboratory.</u>

<u>A</u> The proof of certification <u>shall include documentation in English from completed</u>
 <u>by</u> a third-party certification entity, <u>shall be printed in English and shall include</u> sufficient
 <u>documentation</u> to verify that a reusable grocery bag meets each requirement specific to
 the reusable grocery bag material type, including <u>but not limited to:</u>

- 103 (1) Compliance with the requirements of section 42281 and 42281.5 of the Public
 104 Resources Code, including identification of the test methods <u>used</u>, or a
 105 <u>description of the procedures used to confirm compliance corresponding test</u>
 106 results for the reusable grocery bag, and the following, as applicable:
- 107 (A) Test results for each ink and dye in the color formulation all inks, 108 dyes, pigments, decals, or other methods used in the decoration of 109 a reusable grocery bag pursuant to section 42281(a)(5) of the Public 110 Resources Code. A proof of certification may include test results for 111 a suite of inks (e.g., cyan, magenta, yellow, and key), dyes, 112 pigments, decals, or other methods that may be used in any variation 113 or combination for the decoration of a type of reusable grocery bag 114 and would constitute an aesthetic change.
- 115(B)Images of the complete front, back, and gusset of the reusable116grocery bag that clearly show the handles, style of bag, and the117colors of inks,-and dyes, pigments, decals, or other images printed118on the bag.119aesthetic changes made to a certified reusable grocery bag.
- 120(C)(2) Images depicting applicable of the reusable grocery bag or affixed121tags that demonstrate the labeling requirements pursuant to

122	specified in sections 42281(a)(4) and 42281(b)(1)(D) of the Public					
123	Resources Code. The text for these labelling requirements shall be					
124	printed in English, legible, and may include more than one phrase or					
125	sentence.					
126	(D) Pursuant to Public Resources Code 42281(b)(1), the percentage of					
127	postconsumer recycled material and the numbers used in the					
128	equation to calculate that percentage. The percentage of					
129	postconsumer recycled material shall be determined for each type of					
130	reusable grocery bag using the following equation:

133	W _{PCR} = the total weight in pounds of postconsumer recycled					
134	material used in each type of reusable grocery bag

137	N_{RGB} = the number of reusable grocery bags distributed in					
138	California for each type of reusable grocery bag					
139	(2) Compliance with the requirements of section 42281.5 of the Public Resources					
140	Code, including, but not limited to:					
141	(A) Invoices containing the supplier's name, location, contact					
142	information, date(s), quantities, and type of postconsumer recycled					
143	material (e.g. low density polyethylene) purchased during the					
144	preceding 24 consecutive months.					
145	(B) A table summarizing the names, locations, and total quantities					
146	(pounds) of postconsumer recycled material purchased from each					
147	supplier during the preceding 24 consecutive months. The table shall					
148	include a description for each supplier's source (e.g. irrigation pipe.					

149	hoop housing, bags), location, and contact information of the
150	postconsumer recycled material.
151	(C) Images and diagrams of the equipment and a description of the
152	process of how the postconsumer recycled material is cleaned to
153	remove physical and/or chemical contaminants using the appropriate
154	washing equipment.
155	(3) An accreditation certificate or accreditation number confirming the third-party
156	certification entity is an accredited ISO/IEC 17025 laboratory.
157	(4) All documents shall be submitted to the department under penalty of perjury.
158	(c) On a biennial basis, A a reusable grocery bag producer shall biennially resubmit a
159	proof of certification <u>to the Reusable Grocery Bag Reporting System</u> at the time it pays
160	the administrative certification fee for each type of reusable grocery bag that it
161	manufactures, imports, sells, or distributes in the state that includes all of the applicable
162	information specified in 17988.3(a),-and 17988.3(b), and provides to a store for sale or
163	distribution. and as follows:
164	(1) A proof of certification for a reusable grocery bag that is made from plastic film
165	shall be completed by a third-party certification entity within three months of the
166	date the proof of certification is submitted to the department.
167	(2) A proof of certification for a reusable grocery bag that is not made from plastic
168	film may be resubmitted, if no modifications have been made to a previously
169	certified reusable grocery bag with the exception of aesthetic change(s).
170	Modifications include anything that may alter compliance with requirements of
171	section 42281 and section 42281.5 of the Public Resources Code. Modifications
172	that may require recertification include, but are not limited to, changes in washing
173	methods or equipment, changes in suppliers of inks, dyes, pigments, decals or
174	other methods printed on the bag, or changes in suppliers of postconsumer
175	recycled material.

- 176 (d) The department shall review each proof of certification submitted or resubmitted
- 177 to the Reusable Grocery Bag Reporting system, to determine if the proof of certification
- 178 is complete.
- 179 (1) For purposes of this review, "complete" means that all of <u>the</u>
 180 documentation required by sections 42281 and 42281.5 of the Public
 181 Resources Code has been submitted.
- 182 (2) If the proof of certification is deemed complete, the department shall add
 183 the name of the reusable grocery bag producer to the Certified Reusable
 184 Grocery Bags and Producers List.
- 185 (3) If a proof of certification is deemed incomplete, the department shall
 186 notify the submitting reusable grocery bag producer.

(d) (e) A reusable grocery bag producer shall label or identify any portions of its proof
 of certification it believes are confidential or proprietary that it wants the department to
 maintain as confidential pursuant to section 17988.76. Proofs of certification submitted to
 the department shall not contain redactions. Any portion(s) of a proof of certification that
 are not labelled or identified as confidential shall be deemed a public document.

195 (a) The department shall review each proof of certification submitted or resubmitted to

196 the Reusable Grocery Bag Reporting Seystem, to determine if the proof of certification is

- 197 <u>complete.</u>
- 198(1) For purposes of this review, "complete" means that all of the documentation199required by sections 42281 and 42281.5 of the Public Resources Code has200been submitted.
- 201 (2) Within 30 days of receipt, the department shall notify a reusable grocery bag
 202 producer if the proof of certification is complete or incomplete.
- 203 (3) If the proof of certification is deemed complete, the department shall add the
 204 <u>name of the reusable grocery bag producer</u> and the name and type of bag to
 205 the Certified Reusable Grocery Bags and Producers List.

206	(4) If a proof of certification is deemed incomplete, the department shall notify the
207	reusable grocery bag producer and describe the deficiencies in writing.

210	§ 17988.45. Administrative Certification Fee Schedule.
211	(a) A reusable grocery bag producer shall pay the administrative certification fee, at
212	the time it submits its initial proof(s) of certification to the Reusable Grocery Bag Reporting
213	System. A reusable grocery bag producer then shall then biennially pay the administrative
214	cortification fee, when it resubmits a proof of certification to the Reusable Grocery Bag
215	Reporting System.
216	(b) The administrative certification fee schedule shall be established by the
217	department and shall be sufficient to cover its reasonable costs to implement Article 2 of
218	Chapter 5.3 of Part 3, Division 30 of the Public Resources Code.
219	(a) (c) The administrative certification fee schedule shall be determined in the
220	fellowing manner-implemented using Tables 1-3 as follows:
221	(1) For the July 2019 administrative cortification fee, the department shall
222	determine its startup costs and operating costs through Fiscal Year 2020-21
223	to implement the requirements set forth in Article 2 of Chapter 5.3 of Part 3,
224	Division 30 of the Public Resources Code. The department will divide its
225	startup costs equally among the total number of reusable grocery bag
226	producers published on the Certified Reusable Grocery Bags and Producers
227	List. For future biennial time periods, the department shall determine in
228	advance its operating costs to implement the department's statutory
229	responsibilities for the subsequent two fiscal years.
230	(2) The administrative certification fee shall be rounded to the nearest dollar and
231	calculated as follows:
232	certification fee = <u>CalRecycle 2 year operating cost</u> number of certified producers
233	(3) Before July 1, 2019, the department shall give public notice of the initial
234	administrative certification fee for approval at a public meeting. After approval

235	of the initial administrative certification fee, at or following the public meeting,
236	and no lator than July 1, 2019, the department shall publish the administrative
237	cortification fee amount on its public website. All reusable grocery bag
238	producers on the Certified Reusable Grocery Bags and Producers List at the
239	time the administrative certification fee is published shall pay the initial
240	administrative certification fee within 30 days from July 1, 2019.
241	(4) A reusable grocery bag producer not included on the Certified Reusable
242	Grocory Bags and Producers List that submits a proof of certification after the
243	initial fee is posted in 2019, and prior to the establishment of the next
244	certification fee in 2021, shall pay the initial administrative certification fee in
245	offect at that time.
246	(5) No later than July 1, 2021 and on a biennial basis thereafter, the department,
247	after giving public notice and consideration at a public meeting, shall publish
248	on its public website the administrative certification fee amount for the
249	following biennial period. All reusable grocery bag producers on the Certified
250	Reusable Grocory Bags and Producors List shall pay the administrative
251	certification fee within 30 days of July 1.
252	(1) All reusable grocery bag producers who submit proof of certification shall
253	biennially <u>pay a base fee, as follows:</u>
254	(A) From July 2019 through June 2021, the base fee shall be
255	<u>\$12,000.</u>
256	(B) From July 2021 through June 2023, the base fee shall be \$6,000.
257	(C) <u>Beginning July 2023 the base fee shall be \$6,000.</u>
258	(2) For a reusable grocery bag producer that manufactures, imports, sells, or
259	distributes reusable grocery bags made from plastic film the administrative
260	certification fee shall be the sum of the base fee and a tiered quantity fee, as
261	shown in Tables 1-3. The tiered quantity fee shall be determined based on
262	either:

287 § 17988.56 Procedures for Submitting Payment to the Department.

- (a) <u>All reusable grocery bag producers on the Certified Reusable Grocery Bags and</u>
 <u>Producers List on July 1, 2019, shall pay the administrative certification fee by July</u>
 <u>31, 2019 in order to remain on the list.</u>
- 291 (b) A reusable grocery bag producer not included on the Certified Reusable Grocery Bags
- and Producers List that submits a proof of certification after July 1, 2019, shall pay the
 administrative certification fee in effect at that time.
- 294 (c) <u>All reusable grocery bag producers on the Certified Reusable Grocery Bags and</u>
 295 <u>Producers List shall pay the administrative certification fee on a biennial basis</u>
 296 <u>thereafter.</u>
- 297 (d) A person submitting proof of certification documentation shall use the reusable
 298 grocery bag reporting system or other system designated by the department for
 299 making payments, or providing other information required pursuant to this article.
 300 <u>Payment shall be romitted via the Reusable Grocery Bag Reporting System</u>
 301 <u>accessible on the department's website.</u>
- 302 (e) (a) Reusable grocery bag producers shall submit payment to the department. All
 303 financial transactions shall be reported and recorded in currency of the United States
 304 of America ("dollars"). Where the actual transaction is made in foreign currency it shall
 305 be converted to dollars for reporting and recording at the prevailing exchange rate at
 306 the time of the payment.

- 307 (f) (b) Administrative certification fee payments shall be deposited into the Reusable
 308 Grocery Bag Fund by the department. Moneys in the fund shall be expended by the
 309 department to implement Article 2 of Chapter 5.3 of Part 3, Division 30, of the Public
 310 Resources Code, and may be used to reimburse-make repayment to other funds that
 311 financed startup costs of the department's activities pursuant to this chapter.
- 312 (g) (c) Reusable grocery bag producers with delinquent accounts will be removed from
 313 the department's Reusable Grocery Bag Reporting System and Certified Grocery
 314 Bags and Producers List until fees are paid in full.

315 (d) Delinquent payments shall accrue interest from the date the payment was due.

- 316 (h) (e) Administrative certification fee payments are not refundable.
- (i) (f) Failure to comply with the requirements set forth in this article will result in
 immediate removal of the reusable grocery bag producer from the department's
 Certified Reusable Grocery Bags and Producers List, pursuant to subdivision (b) of
 section 42282, of the Public Resources Code.

- The department shall maintain the confidentiality of information submitted to the department as required by the California Public Records Act (Chapter 3.5 (commencing with section 6250) of Division 7 of Title 1 of the Government Code), section 40062 of the Public Resources Code, and Title 14, California Code of Regulations, Division 7, Chapter 1, Article 4 (commencing with section 17041).
