If you ride VTA trains, you may have noticed a new "Green Rails" advertisement in some of our cars. And if you live in a home along the Vasona Line (from San Fernando to Winchester stations), the sound of trains rushing past may be quieter than in other rail-hugging neighborhoods.

When VTA constructed the Vasona Line extension in 2001, we placed recycled tires under sections of track between San Jose and Campbell. This new use for discarded tires – called tire-derived aggregate (TDA) – was developed with help from the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) to minimize the noise and vibration that occurs in surrounding homes as light-rail trains pass.

In the ten years since its placement, TDA has proven extremely effective. By using TDA, our agency saved \$1 million and found a creative new use for 100,000 waste tires that may have otherwise ended up in landfills.
