

Tire-Derived Product (TDP) Grant Program

PURPOSE

CalRecycle's Tire-Derived Product Grant Program (TDP Program) promotes markets for recycled-content products derived from waste tires generated in California. The TDP Program provides grants for the purchase of various tire-derived products such as landscape mulch or bark, playgrounds, athletic tracks, sidewalks, sport surfacing, traffic safety products, and more.

ELIGIBILITY

The project must be located in California and use a minimum of 2,500 Passenger Tire Equivalents (PTE) from California-generated waste tires. Truck tire buffings are not eligible for reimbursement due to relatively strong market demand.

Cities, counties, school districts, colleges and universities, special districts, state agencies, and qualifying Indian Tribes may apply.

TDP Grant Program Funding for Fiscal year (FY) 2011/12 is a proposed total of \$3,400,000 (subject to change).

Reimbursement is based on the actual cost of materials, tax and shipping up to \$5 per PTE, with a maximum grant amount of \$150,000.
