Re: CARE Update on Proposed Deliverables

Dear Clark:

CARE has completed an analysis of all Plan, Chapter 0, and AB 729 deliverables to ascertain our ability to meet timing expectations. This exercise was catalyzed by the impact of Covid-19 and the realization that many of our operations and initiatives have been interrupted and thus delayed. The attached Table lays out 16 deliverables and shows the original due date and our recommendation for revised dates where applicable. It looks like 5 of the 15 are still doable in the timeframes committed.

Virtually all the requested delays are the result of one or more of the following impacts, many in combination and can be directly attributed to the pandemic impacts on people and operations of CARE, our recycling community and our project partners:

- a) CARE Committee members, responsible for oversight and decision-making, were furloughed during the months of April and May resulting in meetings having to be rescheduled
- b) Recyclers who were forced to prioritize application efforts for the Payroll Protection Program (PPP) to hold on to their employees (April, May, June)
- Recyclers struggling to survive as they reworked business strategies, payment terms, delivery contracts, implement Covid-19 protocols for their workplace and workforce, and many other details (March, April, May, June, July)
- d) CARE contractor executing the Economic Study being unable to access the field (interviews) and key personnel to gather information
- e) Recognition of the complexity of the Carpet Differential Assessment Project and being forced to delay critical stakeholder feedback and SPC engagement
- f) CARE focusing on the analysis of Covid impacts and prioritizing how best to help recyclers survive from a cash flow perspective and to avoid loss of capacity (shutdown) in California
- g) General Covid-19 uncertainties while trying to stabilize a plan to move forward at a time when the economy, markets and recycling world seek some reduction in volatility and a path to reopening society

Therefore, CARE is requesting approval of the documented program revised dates as outlined. In each case, CARE has tried to set dates that are realistic and expects to meet the targets. At the same time CARE will continue to push to deliver results as soon as reasonably possible.
