Who is supposed to report annually? Is this different than the annual report we submitted for electronic waste in? 4:10 when is the report due? 4:20 Well, let's start with Question one. Where do you access the Electronic Annual Report? It is a Secure Database, one by tau recvcle. 4:28 If you are a jurisdiction contact do, as of two weeks ago, three weeks ago, you would have received a message saying, Here's how to login, and here's what does it require? 4:42 Navigate to the webpage. 4:51 So, if you're on the Cal Recycle website, go to Search and if you type in ear. 5:07 This is the order homepage, but there is a login, So if you go to my logic, there is going to be a direct login here for the electronic annual report. 5:19 And so, when you, like, sorry, Wrong one logic system sign in. 5:26 So, when you come into the page, you will see this and if you have a web pass and you are a authorized contact, you will be able to get it. 5:36 Next question is, who is supposed to report annually, cities, counties, regional agencies, and special districts that provide solid waste collection services? 5:47 Is this different than the annual report you submit for electronic waste? Yes, it is. 5:52 That's a totally different thing. 5:54 What does the report do? 5:56 Most years, it is due on August, first of each year. 6:00 But this year, because it is a special year, in which it's going to combine the 2021 Calendar year report as well as the first six months of SB 1983. 6:12 Short-lived climate pollutants implementation, from January first to June 30th of 2022. This year, the report will be due on Monday, October third, and then next year, we'll go back to being due on August first, each year. 6:35 Katie, you are unmuted if you want to ask any additional questions. 6:40 Sure, thank you. We are regional agency, but I know we report our large venue form as an airport authority to the City of San Diego. So does our information gets put into this system via the city of San Diego? Or is this something that as a regional agency, we need to be reporting on annually, we need to login? 7:02 You're So I'm not aware of any regional agencies in San Diego. Can you elaborate your name and exactly what you are? 7:11 Sure. I work for the San Diego County Regional Airport Authority. We are a regional governing agency that manages San Diego International Airport. 7:21 We report our, our waste data annually to the city of San Diego via what they call like a large venue form. 7:36 But now I'm questioning, if that's, if we're not, if we're not in compliance. And, no, you're fine. You're not a regional agency as you define it for purposes of this report.

7:47 So, yes, you can continue to submit that information to the City of San Diego and they will input that data into their annual report. 7:56 So, that's kinda wondering, I might see, in San Diego told me. 8:04 That's funny, But I'd also like to ask then, with I know with, and by 2024, I think we're, like, I think you call us either like Scope two or Phase two as an as a generator. 8:19 I know the city is going to start collecting are like SB 13, 83 data. 8:24 And so if that's the type of information that will also go into this, like our large venue form doesn't ask about an Annex much. 8:35 OK. 8:38 Possibly they're still using an older form. And this, you know, the law is new sales, if you're identified as a Tier one or Tier two generator. 8:49 Do you know, are you a Tier one, or Tier two? 8:52 I believe Tier two as a, as an airport. 8:55 Tier two. 8:56 OK, so, as far as reporting this year, it's going to be a little different, but that's definitely something you would still coordinate with the City of San Diego on. 9:07 For capacity planning purposes, the county, since they would be apart. 9:14 Yes! 9:16 Thank you! 9:17 All right! 9:21 Next question is: from Sarah Ahearn Sarah asks: can you please go over the additional information and document management page? 9:29 Yes, Sarah, unmute you so that you can elaborate when we get to that page. 9:40 And, Andrew, I'm going to pass this back up to you. So, you can go over the new build on that page. 9:47 Sounds good. Sarah which jurisdiction or a width and we'll go into your report specifically. 9:53 I'm in the Oxnard jurisdiction and mature county. Oxnard: OK. 10:02

So, you only have your reports available but won't go to years.

10:18 All right, So you're asking about additional information? 10:22 And hold on one second. 10:25 Let me, great. 10:27 My little tool up here so that we can all be on the same page, OK? So you're asking about additional information and report management, correct? 10:37 Yes, Correct, OK. 10:38 So this is an optional section, so as soon as you go to it, it kinda gives you the green check mark that you're done and no further information is necessary. 10:49 The purpose of this section has a few different purposes, so this beginning part. Sree and H, HW. diversion, program management, that has kind of the instructions here, which I won't go through all those instructions. But this, the main part of it is this Add New program. So this is specific for AB 939. 11:09 And if you needed to add a new Sri or H H W E diversion program, you'd click this button and go through that process to add that program code to your electronic annual report. 11:23 And that's kinda, these are all examples of those different program codes. 11:27 So, pass that section, specifically, the additional information box. 11:32 We just put this in here as kind of a catch all, if there was something you wanted to tell us. 11:38 Either related to your report that you didn't find maybe necessarily fit appropriately into kind of any of these. 11:49 Section A scroll back up top, real fast, any of these sections. Like if it didn't fit in any of these sections, necessarily, That additional information boxes for you to tell us. 11:58 Whatever you want to tell us, whether you like the new format, don't like the new format, how it can be improved, as examples of what type of information to put there. 12:08 So, that's that text box. And then the document management. This is, we have this document manage of a button located I think, in 3 or 4 places throughout the report. 12:19 Specifically, the disposal section has a document management button, the enforceable mechanisms and ordinances section has a document management button and this is if so the disposal. 12:31 And Chris can I let Chris speak more specifically if that's something that applies to you but there's specific question if you answer questions specifically required like disposal modifications are required to upload information to support, why you have the disposal modifications? And so you click this button and go through the process of uploading those documents in this box down below. 12:53 It's kind of where all the documents that you've uploaded in your electronic annual report will show up, So this is kinda like the master key of your document management area. 13:03 So if you did want to enter any information on this page, same as all the pages, have the back and edit button, You click edit, kind of activates that page, and then you could scroll down. 13:16

You can now see those boxes are white, and you can input that information.

13:20 Whereas this one is just going to populate with documents that you upload, enter your question. 13:39 I'll take the silence as a yes. Do we have another question we can answer? 13:48 All right. The next question is from Billy Miller. 13:51 Under organic waste hauler section, the number of toddlers approved revoked or denied. 13:56 Who does that apply to Franchise hollers or self haulers of organic waste? 14:02 Know that's going to be on kind of their waste haulers, your franchise, haulers, or at least permitted callers if you don't have franchise agreements. 14:16 So the regulations and require jurisdictions to authorize all hollers that are hauling solid waste within the jurisdiction. 14:29 So there are there are some haulers, atypical franchise, toddlers, or other hollers like no hollers that we'd be hauling for example. 14:42 Wood material, um, and I don't know, maybe like a 1 800 got junk, for example. 14:51 The type of hollers that you that are falling through the commercial business self haulers would be landscapers. So that group is handled as Marshall business, self color, but any other haulers that are hauling organic waste do have to be authorized by the jurisdiction. And the exclusions are C and D haulers and community composters. 15:21 So just wanted to add that add to the conversation. Thanks, Sandra. 15:27 Thank you, Karen. 15:33 Your question, but I'm sorry, right. 15:37 Bill, you are unmuted. If you'd like to further elaborate. 15:40 Yeah, that does answer my question. 15:46 So I appreciate the clarification as well. 15:50 But just to clarify even further for this specific reporting section, um, we we would not be listing the commercial organic self haulers, such as landscapers that have been approved within the city, because um, or I'm assuming would it be correct? Correct, correct. Yeah. 16:13 They they fall under that self hall category and not and in the other section on on haulers, OK? Great. Millimeter, sure. 16:29 Alright. Thank you, Carla Del Rosario asks in the collection systems tab under Actually container systems. 16:37 If your jurisdiction as multiple haulers, do you recommend only listing one color name in the name box and any additional names in the additional Detail box? 16:50 And Karla, we will unmute you. 16:55 You are self muted. 17:00 Hello everybody. So I just wanted to re-iterate that question just because it's not. 17:08

I think that particular tab is you know kind of geared towards jurisdictions that have you know only one franchise hauler.

17:17

So one of my jurisdictions has multiple haulers or know, for the commercial sector, and then a different hauler for the residential sector And that box just kinda has room for one name.

17:31

So I just wanted to get some clarification on that.

17:52

Andrew, if you're speaking, you may be muted.

17:56

Thank you, I was, so it's geared to be both right for an individual, haller as well as any number of followers that you may have.

18:05

So the first and I, I would agree with you that this particular grid is a little bit cumbersome just because of its size and it's not necessarily clear of or what, so if I guess. Sorry, I'm kinda stumbled on myself here.

Do your residential and commercial haulers have different collection container systems?

18:28

Yes, is 1 3 container Can you tell me what they are?

18:38

Well, I mean, like we are both sectors, you know, offer a three container system.

18:44

It's just more like, you know, we have a different color for the residential part of the jurisdiction and then, you know, we have multiple haulers for the commercial part, OK? So it's just like that hauler name is kind of how, you know, how many, how many names can I put in that box.

19:07

Yeah, so you can, I mean, and you don't have to say that specific color name. Just wanna make that clear. 19:12

This is just kinda for your purposes to keep your haulers and what you're reporting organized for the residential haller, if they had, And I think you said it, three Container System.

19:23

Hmm, hmm, hmm, Need to select that and enter that number, and if they are only doing residential commercial systems, so we're going to require an entry from you, which, as I talk to you more, I can see maybe how it can make some future improvements to our system.

But I think I'd recommend just going with other if they're not gonna.

19:45

If they don't, if they're only doing the residential and not doing any commercial collection at all, you can just enter zero. 19:52

And then in that additional notes for this hauler, just enter that note.

20:02

Sorry, bear with me as I enter. Hmm. Hmm, so just enter that note.

20:07

And that would clarify that.

20:08

And then, you know, this button for save is kinda locating up to scroll. I just want to point out again that this grid has its own scroll bar.

20:18

That's different than the browser scroll bar. I just want to point that out if you're looking for this Save button over here. So click Save.

20:28

And now that we've entered that information, you go to your commercial haulers.

20:31

So you'd click additional holler and then say Commercial haller one or however you want to describe them.

Millimeter, hmm. And do kind of the opposite if they're only collecting commercially so three container for commercial, residential is going to require entry, which I can see where we can make some future improvements. But unfortunately for this reporting cycle say something in there. 20:57 I kind of do the opposite and say whatever it is they hear, you know, commercial hauler one collects, you know, whatever, whatever you want to say here. 21:09 Gotcha, OK the nor sector or whatever it may be. 21:13 Just to kind of specify that, you know it does not do residential just to make that abundantly clear of why you marked other input zero in the residential systems. 21:26 OK Does that answer your question? Yeah, it doesn't. 21:30 It's, like you said, you know, it'll be just a little bit cumbersome this time around, but hopefully there can be some some changes made to that particular tab. 21:37 Yeah. No, thank you for pointing that out, as I'm kind of going through this process. From your perspective, I'm like, Ah, that's unfortunate. But unfortunately, it's going to have to be for this particular reporting cycle. Yeah. 21:51 And it's not letting me oh, that's why I didn't finish. 21:55 Couldn't figure out why I wanted to see the final entry, just so it kind of showed. 21:59 Couldn't figure out why. 22:01 But, yes, we're kind of aware that that grid needs some work, right? So then you have commercial R one and then commercial or 2, 3, 4, however many you need to add to kind of account for all those haulers. Gotcha, OK. Thank you so much. 22:16 Yeah, thank you. 22:21 While we're on this page, I'm going to jump ahead to Megan Brown. 22:24 And you'll also has a question reporting the collection system. 22:28 Megan, you are unmuted on our end. I'd like to join the conversation. 22:39 I'm here. 22:43 Perfectly, can you hear me? 22:48 Do you want me to read the question? 22:51 It might be easier if I just talk it out versus having to rename lock box. 22:57 It was covered in the last Q and A section, but I wanted to confirm it for checking a box for a three container system. 23:05 The number of generators is R B, The amount of people enrolled in the three container system, and then if you do have any that by the time of this reporting period or not enrolled, you enter that into the comment box and say when you're going to have them enrolled by, is that correct? 23:28

Yeah, and they don't have any waivers and examiners.

Yeah, no waivers at this time. 23:37 Yes, it's like, specifically for food soil are food waste and food, so paper collection that, they have. But, they have the three container service. 23:45 Exactly. 23:46 Or, it should be like, we have a handful of people that might only have trash and recycling stilled, but we haven't determined if they should have a waiver, if they should have this service. 24:01 And so, they still only have trash and recycling by the end of June. 24:07 So, just curious for that number of generators that it's supposed to be just the number of people that are enrolled in trash recycling, organic waste or is it the total number of waste generators in the jurisdiction that are offered that, sir? 24:25 Then enter the number of generators that are provided service, OK, and then yeah, you can add those additional details in that additional Details box. 24:36 OK, Great, anything else you wanted to add? 24:44 Yeah, Kind of On the last point. 24:48 If it is, if all of your haulers offer three Containers System, are you still supposed to break it down by a toddler and how many people they service? 24:57 Are you allowed to just say like commercial, commercial, hollers and list the number of generators serviced by all of them? 25:08

They are all all provide the same service.

25:12

Correct.

25:13

And you just combine all the generator numbers into one box.

25:18

Yeah, Is that acceptable, or would you like it by a toddler?

25:23

No, I think that's acceptable, because you'd have it in your record keeping requirements kind of the breakdown per haller.

25:30

Yeah.

25:33

Ashley, do you have anything else you want to add onto that?

25:39

Andrew eighth, I think you covered it.

25:41

The key is we're looking for, then, number of generators to actually have this service.

25:46

So and like in the example that was provided, there's a few residents, for example, that don't yet have one type of container service. then that should go down in the comments or Notes section and not be included in the total. 26:02

And then your example, like, we don't provide food and paper in the green waste container. So in that case, all of the residents have the three containers, but you don't. You're not yet collecting that particular type of organic waste. So you would make note of that, and that comments note box.

Perfect, OK, thank you so much.

26:32

Next we have two questions regarding procurement, one from Carla, Debra Rosario into Carvell and they are is there or will there be a designated list of approved vendors? That will comply with SB 13, 83 procurement targets. 26:52 And the other is, do we need to include certification invoices for purchased recycled paper when submitting? 27:03 So let's start with Andrew's question and Andrew, are you kinda referring specifically to procuring, compost and mulch? 27:14 He: let's see. OK, he's unmuted now. 27:18 Are you self muted? 27:23 Yeah. 27:28 Andrew, can you hear us, or can you speak? 27:35 Or put it in the chat if you can't speak. 27:39 I mean, the, the, the short answer is no. 27:41 There is not going to be a list of designated vendors that are approved by us, necessarily. That would be. 27:50 The key is that you are procuring recovered organic waste products that were diverted from disposal. 28:03 Does that answer your question? 28:15 I guess while we wait for that response, what was the second question? Oh, sorry. Sorry about that. 28:22 No, yeah, that that answers my question. 28:24 That wishes that there is a specific location that we hear a lot of mulch from already and from the looks of what they have available on their website. 28:35 It looks like it would comply with that target. 28:39 I just didn't know if there was already some kind of list or approved vendors depending on the need 13, 83 policy. 28:49 No, Yeah, No, there's not. And then what was the second question, Joe? 28:53 What do you need to include the certification invoices for? Purchase, which type of content paper? 29:02 Not within the electronic county airport, you do not have to report on paper procurement. 29:08 I would just be, part of your recordkeeping. 29:16 That should answer them. 29:19 OK, Next is calling foster and calling you've got. You've got a few in here, so we'll just unmute you and when you chat your questions. 29:34 Whoops, OK, you should be unmuted. 29:38

Hi, everybody. Going Foster, Environmental Officer City aversion side. I'll have to read a couple of them. But the one I want to start with is actually in relation to the conversation you just had about generators. 29:48

That's pretty confusing when I see the question number of generators, let's pretend we're talking in residential. I'm going to tell you, we've got, you know, 45,000 residential accounts.

30:02

I don't read that as, I'm only going to last 43,000 have service. I think that's kinda confusing. I know not every city is on this Q&A.

30:11

And so, if we're expected to just know what to put in comments or notes, that can be, that can really create some differences between reports, jurisdiction, by jurisdiction.

30:21

The way I read it is, you put, like, if for businesses, if I've got 5000 accounts, but only 4000 businesses have service, I'm gonna put 5000 accounts on that. I'm not going to put 4000.

30:34

I'm just struggling with this generator question.

30:39

Sure. It is a little tricky. I don't disagree with you on that. So the way the regulations are worded is. 30:48

You're reporting the number of generators that are provided service. So that would be just kind of currently provided. And so that we provided that additional sarita for the saying that word again, but the additional details boxes. 31:03

So you can kind of further explain the exact scenario that you're talking about, of, when, you know, 43,000 of the 45,000, have the full 3, 3 container system, if that's what they have and then the other 2000 will have their third container and or waiver based on this. So you kind of explain that verbally.

31:24

But, if I didn't know that, like, there's a regional meeting for San Diego with all the other cities in San Diego attending that I just chose to attend this instead.

31:32

But if I didn't know that, I would just report 43,000 And why would I proactively report that we have a deficiency, if you're not asking about that deficiency, clearly, does that make sense? So, I mean, if 4900 out of, you know, 5000 businesses have of service and the question is, number of generators provided service than I just finance or 4900, and I want to add any additional detail?

32:00

Mean, it will be accounted for in your recordkeeping, kind of really get into the detail and we will be reviewing that and the compliance review to kind of get at the root of that missing 100 in your particular example of why they didn't have service, or why they didn't have a waiver.

32:15

You want it now, there. There's missing. Right? The way the questions are asked of the report, and assuming that not every jurisdiction across the state of California is on this Q&A right now, you wouldn't know, they would just write 4900.

32:28

So that's where I think it's kind of unfair because this section is going to be it's how people answer and it's going to be whether they were all this Q&A or not.

32:36

You're getting into me, it's not.

32:43

Coleen, so this is Ashley.

32:45

So, when we do a compliance evaluation, most likely, we're going to ask other questions before we actually go out in the field and evaluate a jurisdiction.

32:54

And one of the questions, maybe, How many total of generators do you have in your jurisdiction? 33:01

Right? And then we'll be able to use what you reported in your electronic report and the information that you give us with our Request for information to be able to really factor that out.

33:12

So like Andrew was saying, we'll dig even further when we do a compliance evaluation versus what's required to be asked in the electronic inner report, if that helps.

33:26

Just kinda confusing.

33:27

I mean, it should say number of generators provide service because then I would know to tell you 5000, but it does is it says number of generators do anything about services. So it just creates a really gap of information. I don't know if there's a way for you guys to put in the Club at her notes direction, because the way you read this from the outside, it's not obvious.

33:49

I wouldn't know how to report this. I would just go straight number of generators. I've got 45,000 households, residential households, 5000 businesses. That would be my answer I wouldn't even thing you.

34:02

Who's subscribing to service if I read. Yeah. I think that's completely fair cooling. I don't know if there's any helpful hints on this one, Andrew, but we can always, you know, put some in, or at least something later on, if it's already too late.

34:18

But it is Andrew and the team really did try to follow what exactly do the regs say verbatim, which is why the ear is worded, the way it is? But, again, we'll dig in further as we do complaints evaluations. You know, If and when the regs real thing, we can always revisit that question and rewrite it in the regs. But, yeah, I don't know if there's any helpful hints to address. Luckily, it's talking about right now. Or if it's just something that will have to put on our wishlist for next time. Yeah. No cooling, Thank you for the feedback. You know, this is really important.

As we refined, kind of our initial build here, we didn't expect to get it perfect the first time, So we appreciate the feedback. And we'll definitely kinda consider sending out clarifying instructions in particular on the spot that you're noting.

No problem, Thank you, and I know it takes time to get it right. And in this instance, we're on that topic.

35:13

If this really is, is I'm the, manager of my program, I'm going to have a recycling specialists filling this out. So, and a lot of cities may not even however is like that especially as it is filling it out.

35:25

And I think it and try to give some advice to make it so obvious. The other aspect of it is you guys reference the regulatory text in a future edition of this. Can you turn that to a link to the text?

35:37

So I don't have to sit here and have it all printed out, and you have to go find whatever whatever section, you know, 1942 A 1.

35:45

It'd be nice that if we're supposed to answer these questions, and the concept of the text, and it's not clearly explained, it'd be nice just to have it linked right there, I would tell my staff, you have to review the attacks before you even try to answer the question.

36:02

Yeah, It's something we'll definitely consider. We appreciate that, too. I know a lot of times, even with a link, it's not necessarily going in particular to that section. But we'll pursue that with their IT and see how close we can get to know the exact reference within the regs.

36:18

Because, like, for example, this question, I went into realized that the tags to the raga's a number of generators, provided service. Right, I would just read it as number of generators, based upon my 20 years of filling these reports out, so, and then provided service. I assume that doesn't mean offered service, because AB 826, you just had to offer monetary rapport.

36:41

I assume, provided service means they actually have service out on the street, because, you know, we do, we do offer service, and some customers absolutely refuse it all the way to physically refuse it. 36:52

So, what does that, What does that? What does that gray area, right? We provided it to him, and they refused the receipt of the container?

37:01

Sure. Yeah, no, that's one of the bigger differences between 18 26 and SB 1883 is that service for diversion of all materials is mandatory.

37:13

Don't really have the right to refuse the service unless they have a legitimate reason either through a de minimis or physical space waiver for why they do not need an additional container you're trying to deliver to them or can self report self holling in some way.

37:29

Andrea, also to address Colin's question, We got this on the last webinar.

37:34

Quinoline, for example, say, 4500 residents actually have the service and are doing the service, but you still need to provide 100 more the service, or they still, they refused it, or whatnot, You would report on what current residents currently have. So you'd be reporting that 4500, then maybe in your notes section, you'd say 100 either Refuse Service or 100 haven't been.

38:03

We haven't done outreach to those 100 yet, so they're not signed up for service yet. So it's what they currently have. 38:10

OK, great, thank you so much, I'm sorry, I couldn't make the Q and A one before that. So I'll go to the next question is really quickly to give people time.

Um, if I was hearing this correctly and I wish I can memorialize everything of SB 33 but I'm still trying to keep up. 38:29

We have to now.

38:30

Cities have to now have a process to document private haulers and I'm not talking self hall escape.

38:37

I guess I'm a little confused that by that earlier question and stuff that Cara was talking about, where it is smaller cities like my city, my citizen mid-sized city, we have a franchise agreement, we have one approved franchise holler for organics.

38:52

They had a four yard bed at the back. They do not have a residential part system, so the services are actually commercial. So, there's kinda confusion there.

I don't know if other cities airspace, but we're getting a lot of questions around that. People think they get out of it, but they don't really get out of it.
