We'll do our best to answer as many questions as we can in the time we have allotted.

1:27

If you have questions, please put them into the questions pane of the goto meeting and Ray Carranza was also with us. We'll be reading those off as they come in.

And we're going to do our best to answer as many as we can in the time that we have.

1:45

We do have a few that were e-mailed ahead of time rather than jump right into those, in case the person, the people who said that are not quite on yet.

1:54

We will wait for the first question to show up in the question pane.

2:01

And also, now on the screen, you'll see some of the instructions I just mentioned. So yes, you have questions. Please put them into a, we will unmute you if you'd like and you can ask it out loud and we can continue with discussion.

Other than that, let's get ready to go.

There's a bunch of questions. Go?

2:25

Yes, thank you, Chris. Our first question is from Tim Krueger. Tim, I'm gonna go ahead and unmute you, if you'd like to ask you a question or provide some clarifying information. Please remember to state your affiliation and your name.

2:42

If not, I will go ahead and begin reading. Regarding the Section 1 8 9 8 4.1 A 1, 3, Container Organic Waste Collection Service, green container.

2:53

Can that be on, I'm sorry, can that be on call service, or doesn't need to have regular scheduled service? Same question for the section 1 8 9 8 4.1 E 2, blue container.

3:11

I'll go ahead and answer that one.

3:13

So, as regarding the three container to container, I mean, for that matter, the one container system, so, as part of the 13 A three regulations, collection of all materials is required.

3:29

So, I guess, just to ask you some questions, TAM.

3:35

I mean, if there's some scenarios where, if they're self hauling, I don't necessarily need a blur green container.

3:43

But service does, is required to be provided for a collection of all those materials, depending on the system that you are implementing.

3:54

Does that answer your question?

3:57

Yes, it does.

3:58

It was just basically, if a generator object, you have, say, a green container as an on call, and then maybe never calls to pick it up or it gets picked up once every six months or something. Does that still count towards three container service or would they need a regular and picked up clean container?

I see.

4:23

I mean, I guess it would kind of come down to the purchasable factor as well. So as long as that that would be more a conversation with your local enforcement agency to make sure that you're not kind of violating any of those vector issues that may be caused by not servicing a container.

4:39

But as long as the materials are being to avert it, I think there could be some flexibility there, But it does need to be provided. I don't know if that helps clarify it further.

4:50

It does, Yes. Thank you very much.

4:56

Our next question is from Rosie's Salmo.

5:00

Rosaleen asks, Do we fill out the disposal rate calculation and the calculation factor?

5:08

And, Regina, I'm gonna go ahead and unmute you, if you'd like to provide any additional information.

5:15

Yeah. Hi. So, when I'm trying to fill out the ER, these two sections are already filled out for us.

5:22

So, I'm not sure what is the resource and how were they filled out, because they won't let me change him.

5:34

Well, there is some info in the in the calculator that pretty loads like the disposal data for things. What jurisdiction are you looking at?

5:45

I'm sorry, I'm with the city of Modesto, the test. All right. Give me one second to take a look. We don't do medical waste.

5:56

CND is separate than as, Well, oh, those, yeah, those are disposal, credit disposal credits.

6:03

So there's certain things that are approved credits that can be taken away or can be, um, remove from your disposal total.

So I'm navigating over to your ear as we speak, but yeah, there shouldn't be anything in those unless someone else had already gone in and put those in before you saw it.

6:26

Exposure calculation.

6:28

So I'm looking at your, Yeah, so I'm looking at your screen.

6:31

And, let me, I will ship, move this over and share it since I still and presenter.

6:40

So, what you're seeing on this screen is, these numbers are, these, are, these are imported in from the RDR S, the Recycling and Disposal Reporting System.

6:54

And so, that number's already there.

6:57

And so what you would be able to change is if you pressed edit, and let's say you had qualify medical waste, or qualify, and C and D waste or out diverted out of State export waste.

7:10

You could put that number in here and you would fill out the disposal.

7:14

Are the reporting, your disposal modification, certified certification sheet.

7:20

There's a link to it up here in this definition of terms section that also has more expansive definitions for what qualifies for each of these types of disposal reduction credit.

7:32

So you should, I mean, I was able to press Edit, and come in, and they don't have any of those, so we can just leave it as is, Right?

7:42

We, yeah, if you're not, if you're not going to claim any of those credits, you would not need to do anything in this section, OK, similar to the calculation factors, calculation of factors is a little bit different calculation factors, if you were going to claim one of those credits, it would show up here in this calculation factors section, why these boxes may be checked, and something else you may need to do here.

If you had green waste ADC tons you may need to answer additional questions the first question box here, if you had any tons at all and Questions 2 and 3 if you are not meeting your per capita rate Target.

So, since you have no green waste, what all you would need to do on this page? And notice, it's already check green. I did go to live just to see if anything had been entered and those.

8:34

Since you've already answered, no, you would be done with this section, as it is, There. You were The last one, OK, yes, OK. All right, Thank you.

8:49

Thank you, Chris. And as a quick reminder, this presentation is being recorded and will be available online once it is made ADA Accessible.

Next question is from Alison ..., they are asking about Alameda County's ear and how it should be structured, or it makes more sense to be structured as a regional agency ear. Can you please demonstrate what a regional agency ear looks like including pointing out which pieces of the report are specific to SB 13, 83?

9:20

and you are unmuted, Alison?

9:33

Chris, you want to pass me a presenter or do you want to drive?

10:00

Sorry, I was talking, and I was muted, sorry about that. So, the difference between a single jurisdiction and a regional agency and or a designated reporting jurisdiction, like, in this case, Garden Grove is, we're actually recording for 2, 2 jurisdictions, both regarding Grove and the Garden Grove Sanitary District.

10:21

What you'll see in a lot of these sections, such as procurement or in this case, collections systems, when you come in for each entity you are reporting for.

10:35

So in this case for Alameda, I'd say, right now, all you see right here would be Alameda Incorporated, but if we were to add guessing like Catched or Valley Sanitary District, what you would end up seeing on each of the places where you need to has more than one reporting entity showing, you might have Alameda unincorporated here.

10:54

Then the district in the County Cache Valley, right here.

And then for however many other jurisdictions you're reporting for, you would see those as a line item entries throughout the year in any place where that type of reporting makes sense. Same thing here with procurement. You would see.

11:14

Yeah, more than one jurisdiction listed.

11:17

Allyson, does that answer your question?

11:32

Allison, we can't hear you, if you are speaking, You are muted.

11:37

OK.

11:40

OK, I'll take silence for confirmation. Our next question is from calling weeks.

11:47

Coleen points out that they noticed a sub report error when printing the EHR and it is always in the commercial section. Are you working on this issue?

11:58

I think maybe Coleen will need to elaborate a little bit more on what issue. It is still calling you are now unmuted on our end. Please state your name and affiliation.

12:10

Hi. Can you hear me?

12:13

Great, OK. In several cities, so Alice listed as they're taking several cities. And when we go to put the generator and all the different things in different sections, for example, when I print out for barstow, every single time, when you go to do a print, it shows you nothing for that session will do residential. But it doesn't do for the commercial and done it for more than one city now.

12:45

So every time you go to print, it does not show up that you just clicked on the screen. So for example, if you go to bar so, lists Barstow.

13:01

You will see that ..., you're saying like in the commercial program, section plus 1 whole 9 yards, but when you go to print it, none of that shows up there and the Sri shows up in the backend, but you don't get the category, the material collected. You don't get any of that message each time And it says, Some Record error and it's not just on Mercer is, every single one of the cities we're working with the report summary, is that correct?

That's correct.

13:41

Um, well, I don't, are, Andrew, are we working on this one? Is this part of one of those other errors that someone mentioned in the last week?

13:50

I'm not familiar with this happening yet, so this might be the first, I'm hearing about it, that day.

13:57

Yeah, that sounds OK. I've heard of it.

14:00

You can actually do it, where you said, you can go back into it, where it's off the list. You just put, the year 20 21, so I see how you say the report summary there. I didn't do it from there, but you know, how, like, if you're on the logic setbacks, and you're on bar so.

14.19

You do need to ask you before this screen, you know, when you're on the screen before this, before you go into the details, and you play for pretty, you know, another way to get a PDF on the report.

20 21, and every time it does, it is a seminar always way to. Go to your right, correct.

14:49

Ah, Huh. Uh, no, I think this is the first we're hearing about that.

14:55

I wasn't aware there was that different, because I was looking at the PDF I just voted. I was like, I don't know it seems like there's stuff.

Just yeah. Oh wait, wait, I see you're right here, OK. That's the thing I get every single time, but the sridhar show up in the end. It just look at this, this, I think this is the first time we're hearing about this, this particular thing. So thank you, that's a No.

Alright, our next couple of questions come from CD called us. So, SAIDI, I'm gonna go ahead and unmute you right now so that you can ask both of them.

Satie unmuted on our end.

Thank you. I just wanted to check in on the Collection System tab.

15:54

In a previous webinar, I thought we were supposed to include the count of generators for the waiver, and the different, like three container to container programs, but it doesn't look like it in the ear. So, I just wanted to see if I misunderstood.

16:09

Or we are supposed to include generators with waivers in that tab, which jurisdiction?

16:18

This is for class accounting?

16:25

OK, and you are saying on the which tab the waivers and Exemptions tab Now under that collection system.

16:44

And you were saying you wanted to include the waiver number.

16:52

Like right, right.

16:55

Right right here you me?

16:56

Now up a little bit holler, holler up a little higher where there's it has the different type of program. I can break.

17:06

Yes right here OK, are we supposed to include the number of Generators with the waiver when we put the numbers here?

17.25

Andrew, do you want to take this one?

17:28

You're more familiar with this screen than I am.

17:31

I do believe it is the generators that have service, is what we're looking for here because the waiver section is a little different.

17:40

Yeah, I mean your question is, really do I put the waved generators in this number of generators?

17:47
Box is the question.
17:49

Yes.

17:51

In addition to where you already specify the number of waivers?

17:57

Yes, yeah.

18:00

And they provided no service at all, or do they have a waiver from just one particular container?

18:06

We have generators wave waivers.

18:10

Also have service.

18:14

OK, so, I would include them in your numbers for the service you're providing, because they still are pin that container system, sorry, I'm not using my words very well. They are still included in generators that are being provided service.

18:34

Waivers column are the waivers and exemptions section, your report, where they have the waivers from. So, there's nowhere in here to kind of specify it unless you wanted to include additional anything in the additional details box.

18:47

As far as, the number of generators that may be waived and what they're waived from.

18:54

OK that sounds great and I have a couple other questions on this same tab if you scroll down to where you list the hallmark names.

19:08

That organic waste haulers, I just wanted to add to make sure that if we have the same programs we can just listed under one polar name. I think what I have an exclusive franchise polar.

19:26

Can we put something like that and just do our totals? We only have to break it out by color, or different programs, is that right?

I guess, that is fine. We designed it so that if you did have different collection systems between the haulers, you'd be able to provide that level of detail. But if they're all the same system, then you can just do what you've done here.

19:49

And one last question on the enforceable mechanisms and ordinances TAM.

20:00

It asks about changes to our ordinance or contact information.

20:06

If we adopted an ordinance or made any changes to our ordinances before the April report initial jurisdiction report, can we just mark no for the changes?

20:19

I mean, is this sense the April report?

20:23

Or it's their flight 6.05 22 time period.

20:31

I mean, I'll Andrew, I'll take that one.

20:34

So the ordinances, everything else why that was stuff was due in April.

20:40

We know a number of jurisdictions ended up resubmitting the ordinance, maybe in some cases and more than once because they had to make some kind of change to add an enforceable mechanism to it or add some other kind of language to make it compliant.

20:55

So they could receive grant money earlier this year.

20:59

If you had sent that ordinance in between, you know, after April, pretty much some more still wrote in a week ago.

21:06

If you'd send that ordinance and we have a copy of it and I think we're generally OK with it because pretty much any ordinance changes that have been happening in the last few months, we're should be aware.

21:19

So if you if you e-mailed it into the SLC female box any time since April, we have a copy of it. So I think you could probably say that there's no changes.

Next year, if you make another change, and we don't have a copy, that's where you would want to say, yes, we changed it, and then upload a new version.

21:38

OK, great, thank you very much. That's a really good question because a lot of folks have been changing ordinances over the last few months.

21:52

Thank you, SAIDI, did that answer all of your questions?

21:55

Yeah, thank you. Alright, perfect.

21:59

Next up we have Susan Strand.

22:04

Susan asks regarding edible food recovery total pounds of edible food recovered by food recovery organizations and services, is this in regard to new excess edible food recovered? Or pounds of all edible food recovered by all food recovery organizations within the jurisdiction?

22:26

Susan, you are unmuted on our end.

22:36

I think it makes sense.

22:37

So it seems like the question is aye.

22:41

What do you report, And, Chris, can you, can you pass me presenter, please?

22:47

Just highlight those areas so everyone can see what we're talking about.

22:52

Yes?

22:57

You're present.

23:01

Right, yeah, yeah.

Don't feel like I'm showing my screen. Hold on. 23:11 Yeah, we see it from screen. 23:13 There it is, OK. There we go. 23:15 OK, so we'll just jump into I'm going to use you add onto it, because it's all kind of the same sections here. 23:23 So in edible food, I'm assuming you're asking about this question here. 23:28 The total pounds of edible food, recovered by food rueckert. Yeah, OK, good. 23:33 OK, so let me reread your question just to make sure, caption it correctly. 23:37 So in this field, you are going to report the total pounds of edible food recovered by all food recovery services and organizations located within your jurisdiction. 23:49 Is that answering your question? 23:52 Yeah. 23:54 Yeah, I was wondering if it was just the new excess edible food that was recovered or just total pounds recovered within the jurisdiction. 24.05

So, so it's everything. It's not just the new access.

24:10

Yeah, right, The total pounds that were recovered. So, I don't know the ..., the word excesses kind of confusing me. Where you're going to want to explain that part a little bit more. Yeah. So SB 13, 83 requires jurisdictions to collect the access edible.

24:30

Make sure that there's resources to collect access edible food.

Millimeter, which we are working on.

24:38

Um, so I was wondering if you're just interested in knowing our success, or what's going on already, without R, help.

24:55

Got you.

24:55

So I think this would just be the data that has been reported to you from the food recovery.

25:04

Organizations and services of the total pounds of edible food that's been recovered for this particular report, the period of January first to June 30th, 2022.

25:18

OK, great, Does that answer your question? Yes, it does, OK?

25:28

Thank you.

25:30

Next question is Caitlin Lillis mispronounced that can cal Recycle staff pull up the parts of the ear? We are discussing seen it would be really helpful. I think that's what we've been trying to do.

25.44

But we'll go ahead and take note of that.

25:49

Next up we have Margaret Toshiba in the Collection Systems tab when adding a hauler for the collection container systems.

25:58

The system is required requiring data to be entered for both the residential and commercial sectors but our Commercial haulers Only Service Commercial Generators and the City only services residential generators.

26:11

Right, We got this question asked one time before, and in the upcoming year, we'll add a little bit more functionality that you can specify between, commercial, and It doesn't really matter which one I go to will go to more park here, My gosh, I'll show you what we said previously.

26:38

So in this collection container system grid, um, you can, if you want to describe them in a certain way and say, Commercial Haller, one, or whatever it may be, you can add that here.

Specify that.

26:55

Collection, or sorry, here, Oregon, Commercial, Sorry, I'm going the wrong way.

26:58

So enter the number of generators that are receiving that commercial service and then since the residential part is still requiring you to make an entry, select other, you can put zero here.

27:12

And then just in the additional notes columns, say all my commercial haller, or something along those lines. If you want to provide a more detailed explanation, you can, but that's going to be the solution for this particular reporting cycle, since it is requiring you to make an entry.

27:29

But we've made note of that, and we will have a fix for that on the next reporting cycle.

27:36

Didn't answer your question.

27:42

Margaret you're unmuted. yeah, yes it does. Thanks Sandra.

27:47

Um, I had a couple more questions on this page too.

27:52

Ah like under organic waste hauler is at the bottom.

27:58

Do you want us to report just like on our, um, large commercial hollers that provide free services or do you want us to also include like small haulers that only do CND or one-time, like roll off dumpsters and not regular service.

28:19

Um, for that section I do have an answer for you and I want to bring up my notes to make sure I answered correctly here.

28:28

Millimeter hm OK, because they're going to be includes lumber.

28:33

And that's organic waste would fall under that, but we weren't sure.

Yeah, so on the approved Toddler's section, so I guess for those watching. We're talking about this last grid here, organic waste haulers.

28:48

And I can open It up so you can see specifically.

28:54

So it's to authorize all hollers that are hauling solid waste. So that could be franchise haulers could be permitted haulers could be hollers, such as 1, 800 got junk are hauling, would mature only.

29:05

And then I'm missing my notes, kheraj.

29:10

I know there's something specific about CMB.

29:13

Exclusions are I'm sorry, Do you mind jumping in there for me? Yeah, so um jurisdictions are not required to for Sandy Hollers or Community Composters. they're not subject to the requirements in Article seven, C and D Hollers. Right, are going to be subject to the Cal Green Building requirements and so that's how you're addressing ensuring that Sandy Hollers are properly recycling. Does that help answer the question?

29:49

Yeah, yeah?

29:54

Did you have any more questions, Margaret?

29:57

Um, So Then I guess these go back up to the collection container systems.

30:04

Then we wouldn't include the CND and smile, John calling Haulers up Here, either for the the generator numbers and collection systems.

30:19

Not if they're not providing one of these collection container systems specified.

30:24

If they're just kinda one-time haulers of materials like 1 800 got junk, you wouldn't include them up here. OK?

30:33

All right, thank you.

I can ask question if that's OK, but it's not related to this page.

30:48

Now, that's fine, that's why we're here.

30:51

It's under the education and Outreach tab.

30:59

So it says, what type of education our interests provided taller generators including SL CP more MCR Sri.

31:09

Then it further breaks it down to the number of generators that received SL CP material.

31:17

So Fred, when I'm quantifying the number of generators, um, it has LCP, and then it also covers all of them, So I'm not sure if you only want numbers for, or SB 13, 83 education or everything.

31:37

Or if I should just break it down further in the description box.

31:44

Yeah. So, we're doing it, we're trying to do a few things here, and tried to simplify the Education Outreach section.

31.50

So, the reason we have everything included, and I suppose I'll just highlight the name of the grid, here, is the, so you can report on all education outreach you're doing, and since the focus has kind of shifted through the years from what you need to do for a particular law and more on a material focus. Or kind of recognize that there's a lot of overlap between these programs.

32:15

So this grid, what it's trying to accomplish is you're just kinda reporting on the education outreach that you're doing to divert materials.

32:24

It doesn't need necessarily be specific for each law, OK, so then as far as the number of generators, requirement, that's only a 13 and through your SEP reporting requirement.

32:37

So we recognize that it may include everyone, but as far as the reporting requirements are concerned, you're only required to report the number of ... generators that receive that material.

32:51

OK, OK, that makes sense.

All right, thank you.

33:01

Right next up, we have Sean Graham.

33:04

Sean has a question regarding the disaster waste section for Plymouth County.

33:10

John, you are unmuted on our end.

33:14

Hi, my name is Sean Graham. I'm up from this county. Well, when I first put that on the box, it was just, I only had a question regarding that, but realistically. I feel like I could take up this, this whole webinar ask questions. So for the disaster waste section, I guess that is in disposal rate calculation. I guess, I was somewhat confused this type. What that means because, you know, as many of You might know, the Dixie Fire did largely occurrence in this county and so lots of waste was hauled out but that was hot out sort of by the state. So I don't know the numbers on that, like how much how much waste was pulled out of the county.

34:00

Is that something that I need to basically try to find out and then report in this section here? I was just, I was just confused by that category.

34:11

This is Chris. I can take this one.

34:13

So as Andrew is so conveniently hovering over the the tool tip on this one, Disaster waste was a previous category.

34:22

That was something you could deduct from the total if you had it.

34:27

Due to changes in the Earth's system, both disaster and class to waste are no longer or are no longer supposed to be reported in R D R S by jurisdiction of origin.

34:39

So, it's not gonna necessarily be in your disposal total.

34:43

So, as you can see on this screen, I don't think this is necessarily clueless, but that 21,000 ton, that total report, year disposal amount.

That should not include any class two or disaster waste.

34:55

Just so it looks like you actually are on my screen where we, OK.

35:01

Yes. This tiny screen.

35:03

Yeah, I mean, there shouldn't be any disaster wasting that total. If you think there is yeah, you would want to contact RD R S OK. That changed.

35:11

But generally, I haven't heard of any. Yeah, this was something we thought might happen, but I haven't actually heard of anything where it's like, oh, I know all this disaster wastes got reported chatting.

35:25

Stories have been good about keeping disaster away from the jurisdiction of origin, OK. That's kind of what I assume since, you know, like I said, the other state handled handle that cleanup, OK.

35:36

I'll try to hit these sort of rapidly, because I know other folks have questions on the collection systems. So Plymouth County does have the rural exemption.

35:51

But as I understand it, that that exemption really only is an exemption for like commercial, organic pickup.

36:01

So, yeah.

36:04

I'm somewhat confused by this interface, because it has Haller name, right? So Plymouth County has two different franchise areas.

36:13

But, none of the residential, because of the the rural exemption, none of our residential, like generators, it applies, So, what I then basically, no, indicate rural exemption, and then go to, for residential systems, go other than the number of generators basically.

36:35

I mean, I can, I asked the hollers for number, the number of accounts, basically, is that sort of what this tab is looking for?

Um, yes, that's what it's looking for, but when you have a rural exemption, you select this box, hmm, hmm, even though it appears that there's required fields, you can just hit save and it bypasses the whole thing so there are no reporting requirements for you there.

37:05

Residential or commercial.

37:07

Oh, OK.

37:08

So, then I think that would apply to that the compostable plastic bags as well.

37:15

Yep, any anywhere checkbox shows up, you just click that, Save at Bypass at all.

37:22

Well, OK, because of that, there's other areas where the, the, for example, under procurement, says, recovered, organic, waste, product, procured. There's a Rural Exemption tab.

37:37

I wasn't aware that that exempted us from anything involving procurement, I mean, I guess I could just be wrong in that regard. So, is what you're saying is that in any of these tabs, where there's the rural exemption box, just ticket, save.

37:51

And that's that.

37:55

Yeah, I'll go a little bit more in detail on procurement because we did combine a few things here. But, yes, in this box, you click Rural exemption because there's no 1883 recovered organic waste product procurement requirements.

38:06

If you have the rural exemption yet, at least through 2026, however, except for you do still have to procure the 30% recycled content paper.

38:18

It does not from that, but there's just no reporting requirement on paper procurement, OK?

38:25

And then down here and this recycled product procurement area, this has elements of AB 939 as well as 1983 got ches.

38:37

So, you'd want to select the ones that apply for 939, OK, So, Probably as an example, right.

Yeah. Well, it's weird the question box. Only up here for, For some.

38:56

Yeah. These were just intended to be tool tips if it seemed unclear.

39:00

Whereas, we felt that the recycled content paper, and with the explanation and parentheses kinda provided that extra tool tip already, and we just didn't think it needed.

39:10

But we'd love to know, if you think it does, we can always add additional tool tips.

39:16

Gotcha. And because here, it's, it's not really showing any quantity.

39:19

So is this, if we were able to procure sort of any percentage within these categories, then we just kick that off.

39:30

Correct. Yeah. There's no requirement to report quantities in this checkbox section.

39:35

Understood? OK, this is Kara.

39:37

I just want to add also that there's no requirements at all to report on quantities of recycled content paper, OK?

39:48

Yes.

39:49

Okey doke. Let me just go down the list, for OK, under the education and outreach.

39:56

I think this is the prior person, kind of clarify this, for me. But I just wanted to be sure.

40:02

I produced basically, SB 13, 83 Outreached material, and distributed it to all of our tier one and tier two generators. Either electronically, a few we had to do via direct contact.

40:21

But the fact that there's sort of two different boxes here is what confuses me, the SLC P one, that says commercial edible food generators is like the second sub box.

Will I will the answer, basically be the same fer, for both?

So, to start, there's two grids, right?

one for kind of your overall SEP NCR, more Sree and H H W E education outreach, and then the second one which will put in that blue box here for commercial audible food generators, education outreach.

So, what ..., I see what you're saying.

So, the, the material that I produced and distributed that that's what I'm reporting on and that the second category for your particular case, you're not reporting up here on that. You're reporting on more MCR Shree ...

and this upper grid then as far as the numbers are concerned and if I heard you correctly, you would report your numbers of the commercial edible food generators that received the SLC P education outreach in the second grade. So there'd be no numbers. You need to report and the first grid, because you have the rural exemption.

Gotcha. It's down here. There's no option for that. Rural exemptions are required to report down here.

OK, and I guess my last question before I hand it over, my apologies. I've. I'm cognizant of the time I've used under the facility section. Is this as straightforward as when it says briefly Describe the program says lino. Landfill Transfer Station, compost facility, biomass, et cetera.

Do I literally just describe, you know, that the county has one landfill that's active, one that's closed, and then six odd transfer stations basically just list them and discuss them.

So, this sections, 100% AB 939, and his program codes are related to that law, in particular. So, these are elements that you have selected in your source reduction recycling element a long time ago. And the main purpose of this section and that checkboxes to make sure that this area is up to date and current.

As far as the briefly, to Scott scribe that you're talking about as if you want to provide any additional information.

So, there's no, really, I guess I'm talking about the facilities section, are we looking at analytics, It will go back the other way, so you share it the other way. I just wanted to show you the program details.

OK, so, this is the facility section, Yes. If you edit here, and you select this, I clicked on the hyperlink. That's what you just saw.

Yes, so here, all you need to do is go through, check the box, and by checking the box, you're saying that the program details that I just showed you. I won't go to it again. And so It will slow.

Are up to date and current.

43:41

If you would like to provide more information about your, the specifics of what you're doing at your landfill diversion programs, you can provide that explanation here, but there's no requirement to put any text here, OK, understood, yes, I think that's it for from me. Thank you.

All right, Thank you all. The next question is from Robin Nelson asking, how can we get the population changed for our city?

44:21

You know, you can't really I mean, you can take that up with the Census Bureau, like this, or the Department of Finance, where we get the population number from your population, whereas 2696 and 2018, 26, 4 8 9, and 2019, 26, O six, and 2020, and 25, 3 8 3, 2021.

There's sort of, a slight downward trend there, the last three years, but also the last couple of years.

44:54

The Census has done every decade, and so the numbers at the end of the decade, our extrapolations at the Census done 10 years before.

So the number that you have this year for your populations, that is correct is it's going to be, we don't really have any control over that number.

If you'd like to follow up, and if you have some more information, you'd like to add to that as to why it should be changed, That's fine. I just don't think that's something within our purview.

Robin, you are unmuted, if you'd like to add anything to that.

45:37

OK, and I just when I looked at information on the City website, and then, also online, I came up with a higher population number, and we have been struggling lately to figure out why we're over target. And so, I didn't know if that might have anything to do with why we're over our pounds per day target.

Um, so, that's why I was asking Thank you.

46:09

Thank you. Next, we have query Joan's asking us to please cover how to report an adjusted procurement target.

Sure. So, they just hit Procurement Target.

46:26

Yeah.

46:28

I'll just go to it.

46:31

So really quick, one thing, getting back to the question of alcohol. And they're being over target, looking at your disposal numbers before RDS and what you currently have.

46:42

I think you might want to check with any facilities that are reporting disposal than your name, because it's it, like, doubled and tripled since our DRS started. So that would probably be your first spot to look not population.

Thanks, Chris.

47:01

So for the adjusted, recovered organic waste, product, procured grid, if you want a new target you say yes to this question, what activates it?

And then you're going to enter your total transportation, fuel, total electricity, total gas use for heating applications. For the previous calendar year, and this doesn't have to be organically derived.

It is all all the usage for for these different categories.

47:38

Does that answer your question?

47:41

I think Cara added regulation sections as well.

47:46

Andrew, I just wanted to add that I wouldn't expect to jurisdiction to report on this in this annual report. They would actually report on it when the report is due on August first, 2023, which will cover the entire year of 2022.

Korey, you are unmuted on our end.

48:10

You'd like to add any more or confirm that, that answered your question?

That didn't, thank you.

48:24

Can we take one more question from the question list? And then we have something that's so CP Inbox, some that were mailed ahead of time that we should get to as well.

Yeah, and I think, Andrew, we need it.

48:35

We've had two questions on what gets recorded for what year, 20, 21 and 20 22 Can we go over that, please?

Yes.

48:46

So for AV 139, which is here, Sri and HH WMA report on 2021 status.

For SB 1083, you're going to report on the period between January 1, 2022 to June 30th, 2022.

49:03

And I think there was a little confusion on MCR and more, so let me bring up my note on that.

49:13

OK.

49:16

So, previously, we were stating for NCR and more report on the most current data through June of 2022.

49:26

And that is one option you can do.

49:31

As far as the reporting requirements concerned firms, here are more.

49:34

You only have to report on 20 21 numbers and the The reason we made that statement before and we're requesting those numbers up through June 20 22 is that it helped show progress.

49:54

And so, if you're deciding to report the same numbers for MCR more and 1383, then we would expect those numbers to be up through June of 2022.

As a visual aid.

50:08

Let me go to that section, Or is it?

50:17

So we have the three separate grids, There's the SLC P back to read Moore and NCAR.

50:27

So, if you only have numbers for Morn, MCR, for 2021, report those numbers.

50:31

And then, ..., you can report just on the period from: January first of 2022 to June 30th, 2022.

I don't know if that helps clarify that, But what we're asking to be reported care. Ashley, do you want to add anything else?

Yeah, you covered it.

So or what we're referring to is the collection systems grid.

Get a little specific on things we're going to use ... Incorporated as an example here. So the scenario is a total of 100 commercial generators are provided garbage service through color.

51:51

A recycling inorganic services, through hauler be questions about this scenario.

51:59

Should the jurisdiction enter 100 in just one row for holler A are also enter 100 and a second row for hauler B Or should the jurisdiction use the three containers box or the other box for holler and or haller?

52:19

I know that's probably hard to see.

52:24

Sorry, hold on. Let me just one moment here.

52:32

They're just getting a little feedback there.

52:33

OK, so, I'm going to rephrase this example just slightly.

52:39

So we'll say Haller, A Has it is providing a three container service.

And we'll just say it's consistent for both residential and commercial.

52:56

So, if they are providing that three container service to 900 of that one thousand, you would enter 900 here.

53:06

And then for the 100, that are only receiving.

53:12

Just trash service will say just resident, commercial, I guess, makes little more sense.

53:20

Select other enter that 100 here.

53:24

And then in the additional Details box, just provide an explanation of why you checked the other and what's going on there.

53:30

So, on our commercial generators, receiving I can't spell and talk at the same time, Trash service only.

53:45

Then when you get to the holler B you do the opposite of this.

53:50

So you'd go and we'll say hauler B also has one thousand total generators providing three container collection systems.

53:57

So you'd enter the 900 entered, the 100 over here, but then say 100 commercial generator's receiving blue and Green container service.

54:10

That helps if, and this is from Lisa Kolo, hopefully, I didn't butcher your name, I don't know if you're on, but if there's anything else you wanted us to clarify.

54:27

Um, thank you so much. That helps a lot. And that actually kind of leads to a follow up question.

54:33

We have some scenarios where a hauler is only providing the blue and green service and we don't quite know what's happening with the garbage service if it is a shared service. Like, a property manager is providing shared garbage service, but for the local franchise. You know, the holler has to

provide blue and green service. Would we indicate something like this similarly, or do you have any recommendations?

55:01

Yeah, I would enter it similarly.

55:03

And, just go with the numbers. You know where the number of generators that are being provided service. And then just providing that additional detail of, there's, you know, 50 on known accounts were so actively working, to sort out how they receive, you know, they do have all three containers, but we're not sure who's providing the trash service, but they do have all three containers. That help clarify it.

55:27

Chris? You have another one in the CPA inbox.

55:38

Actually got a bunch.

55:40

Yeah, well, we've got two minutes left, let's do what we can.

55:46

OK, one from Ted Ward from Delaware County Solid Waste Management Authority. He's got a question saying that he's got inputs that exceed the character limits.

55:58

I thought we set that at like 10000 characters or something extremely long.

56:03

And in a lot of cases, as far as what you would do, two elaborate more than you are already able to your suggestion is you do a cross-reference document that you uploaded the documents section.

56:18

Sure, that's probably it.

56:22

When we set up a lot of these new fields, we did test the character limits on the lot, and it's like, well, I think what we ended up doing was, slightly in the in the tree program section.

56:32

I think we test is like, more than an entire page of a Word document could fit into each box. So, depending on how you did it, that's already quite a bit of text.

So, that would be the best way to handle answers that exceed the character limits of any boxes.

56:51

Another question from Ted is he would like us to describe the sources of the numbers and the disposal rate calculator describes circumstances and procedures for adjusting these disposal numbers if they don't match the facility challenges.

57:04

We've gone over the calculator in previous webinars more extensively, so I don't know if we're going to have time to just step by step through all of that.

57:13

But the numbers that are in the calculator are from the DRS Recycling and Disposal Reporting system and reported over directly the day that year opened or the day before the year opened. So there are current in RDS as of June 14th.

57:29

So, any numbers that you would want to change as far as what was reported and disposal, you need to first get changed in RDS.

57:36

And so once they are changed over there, then you would submit a disposal modification form, noting that the data is changed in our DRS and you are, then you would also change the number in the ear to match the DRS data. Further question at what percentage discrepancy in these numbers is it worth correcting?

57:58

That is completely up to you. It depends on how much time you want to spend, you know, getting one ton change tier there.

58:04

If it's a significant amount, probably worth changing, but we've definitely had folks that say, per capita rate, is going to be the same with or without this 2000 tons. So it's not worth the trouble that we've had at that.

58:18

So that would be, it's up to you as far as what is it worth changing discrepancy wise.

58:26

We have another question from Cynthia, van Whole regarding the city of Rolling Hills States That has a little population waiver. I cannot figure out how to complete the first section.

OK, The report is asking me to fill in all questions, regardless of what is in page 20 that I do not need to do.
