- 09:13:13:Presenter: So along staying on procurement while we're here, can you please go into detail about the procurement? Is the prefilled number? If so, where do the numbers come from?

- 09:13:44:Presenter: This is based on the population of your jurisdiction which we provided, I think what your target number is going to be at the end of 2021, beginning of 2022, so quite some time ago.
- 09:13:50:Presenter: We provided that information and that's the number that's prepopulated here. So this is based on your population.
- 09:14:00:Presenter: Anything else on procurement while we're here?
- 09:14:06:Presenter: Mulches and tons correct.
- 09:14:10:Presenter: Mulches and tons, yes, that would be.
- 09:14:14:Presenter: One update that will make max reporting cycle.
- 09:14:23:Presenter: In reference to here too, in the regulations, mulch is only allowed to be reported in tons, not cubic yards.
- 09:14:33:Presenter: OK. And a follow up question to the prefilled one is what about the annual procurement and target?
- 09:14:40:Presenter: The annual procurement here.
- 09:14:47:Presenter: As populated by what you enter into the recovered organic waste product procured grid.
- 09:14:52:Presenter: And I can just show you that real quick, just so you get it.

09:14:54:Presenter: Have a visual aid.

09:15:02:Presenter: So it is based on the calculation factors.

09:15:09:Presenter: Within the regulations, which I believe is 189931 G.

09:15:14:Presenter: I believe is where those conversion factors are listed. So after you enter.

09:15:20:Presenter: Your data in the grid and hit save. It'll populate the annual procurement.

09:15:23:Presenter: Which you can compare with your procurement target.

09:15:28:Presenter: The adjusted procurement target.

09:15:38:Presenter: Is based on rare, let me just do it here since it is on the screen. Is based on the values input into the adjusted recovered organic waste product procured grid.

09:15:41:Presenter: And this would be used.

09:15:52:Presenter: If you wanted to implement and adjusted recovered organic waste product procurement target based on your total energy use if you feel that.

09:15:53:Presenter: Procurement target.

09:16:03:Presenter: Is higher than the amount of products that you would actually use. So the way this would work is you'd say yes here, which activates these cells.

09:16:09:Presenter: And then for transportation fuel, electricity and gas used for heating applications.

09:16:18:Presenter: For the previous calendar year, you enter your total usage, whether they're derived from organic waste products or not.

09:16:23:Presenter: So the transportation fuel would be things such as.

09:16:32:Presenter: Your maintenance vehicles, your police force, your fire, whatever city run programs you have. So you enter that total number here.

09:16:40:Presenter: Your electricity would be for street lights or facilities for the entire city or county.

09:16:48:Presenter: You enter that information there and then same with the gas used for heating application before your total city usage.

09:16:50:Presenter: You had save.

09:16:54:Presenter: And then it populates that number in the top of the grid.

- 09:17:10:Presenter: Hey Andrew, this is Kara. I just wanted to maybe chat a little bit about since this report that's due October 3rd is covering the first six months for 13 three it's.
- 09:17:23:Presenter: Possible that stakeholders may not have any procurement to show they may end up reporting in the report that's due next August. Do you want to talk a little bit about that and what to do?
- 09:17:31:Presenter: In that situation and it's a OK to have zeros here. Thank you for bringing that up. So yes, so this.
- 09:17:33:Presenter: For this reporting period.
- 09:17:41:Presenter: For the SB1383 reporting requirements, we're covering the period of January 1st, 2022.
- 09:17:43:Presenter: To June 30th, 2022.
- 09:17:49:Presenter: So if you have not procured anything yet in that six month period.
- 09:17:56:Presenter: You're still required to put an entry in here so that the system records that cell is complete.
- 09:18:02:Presenter: And so we kind of have those instructions up here at the top of the page as well.
- 09:18:06:Presenter: But you just need to hit zeros in here.
- 09:18:18:Presenter: You can use this in additional description box, which is optional, to explain why there's zeros here have not procured yet, since this reports only covering a six month period as an example.
- 09:18:25:Presenter: And you enter save, so yes, your procurement, annual procurement would show zero compared to your procurement target.
- 09:18:29:Presenter: May still have an additional six months, and so your report on.
- 09:18:34:Presenter: All of 2022 in August of 2023.
- 09:18:44:Presenter: We want to go on and the rest of it with a B939 and MCR and more as well. Karen.
- 09:18:59:Presenter: No, I think we can hold it unless there's questions. We have plenty of questions still on so. Is there an approved conversion factor for LNG gallons to the DGE unit being used for?

09:20:47:Presenter: We'll be on this for a little bit.

09:20:52:Presenter: Is DOGE equivalent to LNG gallon?

09:21:01:Presenter: No, I would look at that reference tool that I just provided to look at those conversion factors.

09:21:07:Presenter: As renewable diesel counted in procurement.

09:21:13:Presenter: I think we need a little more information on exactly what they mean there.

09:21:19:Presenter: Whether they're talking about which grid they're talking about specifically.

09:21:33:Presenter: So again, if you can put some clarification, we'll get back to it, Andrew, on that one. I think the clerk, we need clarification to know if they're asking about.

- 09:21:46:Presenter: Using that for their reduced target or are they asking in general if renewable diesel counts as an organic waste product procurement? So if you could clarify that would be helpful.

- 09:22:03:Presenter: OK. Next procurement question. Can we include the purchase of compost from residential yard trimmings cart for a compost giveaway even though this material was not originally destined to go to landfill?

- 09:22:33:Presenter: In the procurement regulations. So as long as that material for example, was processed at an applicable facility that's identified in the regulations, for example.
- 09:22:42:Presenter: Permitted compost facility, permitted in vessel digestion facility, etcetera and then it can count so.
- 09:22:56:Presenter: Recognizing that you may have had a residential yard waste collection program for some time. So to answer the second part of the question, yes, even though you've had that program ongoing, it can still count.
- 09:23:07:Presenter: As long as the material is going through the applicable facilities and you're meeting those requirements of the rug, let us know if you have any follow up questions to that minute.

- 09:23:25:Presenter: OK. Also anyone out there asking quite since we're on the procurement screen, anyone asking questions about not procurement right now, I'm just stashing those and we'll get back to you because while we're here we're going to kind of focus on this stuff.

09:24:41:Presenter: It for organic waste products procured, it is true that those materials must meet the requirements, and again, that's ensuring that it's.

09:24:54:Presenter: Organic waste that has been processed at specific facilities. So if you are lacking in infrastructure, for example, and there's not supply of those organic waste products.

09:25:08:Presenter: That can be understandable and so two things you should add a add a note in the additional details box about the challenges that you're facing, but also we would ask that you would connect with your local assistance.

09:27:49:Presenter: It's good to hear the adjusted recover organic waste product procured.

09:27:59:Presenter: Is the purpose of. It is if your total energy usage for the previous calendar year, you would not be able to hit.

09:28:05:Presenter: You're procurement target just because you don't use enough of these products here?

09:28:16:Presenter: That's when you'd want to enter this information to adjust your procurement target to make it lower than your procurement target. That's based on your population.

09:28:20:Presenter: And it's only.

09:28:30:Presenter: This is a year to year adjustment, so it only applies for that reporting cycle and it's based on the previous year's data, so in August of 2022.

09:28:42:Presenter: You would be entering your total energy usage regardless if it's organically derived, if not for transportation, fuel, electricity, and gas used for heating applications for 2021.

09:28:48:Presenter: Does that answer your question, Rosie?

09:28:54:Presenter: Rosie, if you wanted to further clarify, please go ahead and unmute yourself.

09:29:00:Presenter: No, that answered it. Thank you. Appreciate that. You're welcome.

09:29:06:Presenter: Thank you. Moving on, Marissa? Jeweler asks.

- 09:29:18:Presenter: As a county, we thought SB13D3 required us to report all FR Pounds collected for jurisdictions in our county. However, each city is telling us that they are to report their own tonnage, which is correct.
- 09:29:34:Presenter: Hey, Andrew, I'll take that one really quick. So Marissa, each jurisdiction that has a food recovery of food service, food recovery service located in the jurisdiction is the one that's responsible for.
- 09:29:48:Presenter: Receiving those reports from those food recovery organizations and services and reporting that tonnage in their annual report so the county does not consolidate all of that information. Report it the county.
- 09:30:01:Presenter: For the unincorporated area, if there are food recovery organizations or services located in the unincorporated area and then they would be providing those reports to the county and you would include that in your report.
- 09:30:07:Presenter: And we'll go into that further. So if there's any follow ups to your question, let us know.
- 09:30:23:Presenter: Go ahead, ray. Next question. Next we're going to Colleen Weeks, who would like to confirm that the prior year procurement, procurement gas can be natural gas and electricity.

- 09:30:32:Presenter: From other sources like from the treatment plant conversion.
- 09:30:37:Presenter: So there's kind of two parts to that, Caroline. So if.

- 09:30:48:Presenter: So for let me enter the grid so you can see a little bit better.
- 09:30:54:Presenter: So in the adjusted recovered organic waste product procured for, let's see you're talking about gas.
- 09:30:59:Presenter: This would be all sources of gas used.
- 09:31:03:Presenter: Whether it's organically derived or not.
- 09:31:10:Presenter: If you're talking about, let me get out of this one and go to the other grid.
- 09:31:19:Presenter: If you're talking about recovered organic waste products procured to meet your procurement target.
- 09:31:26:Presenter: Let's see, where is gas? Gas here needs to be from gas that's organically derived.
- 09:31:34:Presenter: Does that answer your question, Colleen?

09:31:44:Presenter: Calling you have to unmute yourself if you would like to elaborate on that question.

09:31:56:Presenter: Yeah, it answers the question, but I have a lot of cities that are going to have to do some big jumping and trying to get information in a very few days.

09:32:45:Presenter: Yes, it is. So again, as we shared earlier, thank you for the questions. It's that food recovery organization in the jurisdiction in which it's located regardless of where it collects.

09:32:55:Presenter: Edible food from is reporting that tonnage to the jurisdiction and then that jurisdiction is reporting that information to calorie cycle.

09:35:54:Presenter: I'm not familiar with that one carrier. Do you have anything to say Evanna could could we do a follow up because I'm not sure we're familiar enough with that, but again, anything that meets the requirements.

09:36:09:Presenter: Of the regulation, again produced at certain facilities it was organic waste, etcetera. Can count if it doesn't fit the what's laid out in Article 12 of the regulations.

- 09:44:59:Presenter: Do we include information for green like yard to yard trimming carts and blue mixed recycling minute you are unmuted you need to unmute yourself.

09:54:22:Presenter: For the 200 generators that have gray and blue and the waiver.

09:54:26:Presenter: Plus the 300 generators that have gray, blue and green.

09:54:29:Presenter: As opposed to reporting 1000.

09:54:34:Presenter: And then in your additional description box you can make that note.

09:54:40:Presenter: To add that additional clarity, if you wanna specify, does that answer your question?

09:54:51:Presenter: Marianne, you'll have to unmute yourself if you have anything else to that piece. If not, we'll move on to your next question.

- 10:11:51:Presenter: I'll just check them all so it's easy to tell.
- 10:11:54:Presenter: If they are clear or not.
- 10:11:59:Presenter: And then you hit save.
- 10:12:02:Presenter: It should be saved.
- 10:12:05:Presenter: And then.
- 10:12:08:Presenter: If you add it again.
- 10:12:16:Presenter: I don't know where, I don't know exactly where Colleen the edit the air is curing, but I'll step through a few things and tell me if it's something different.

- 10:12:26:Presenter: So each of these grids is almost like going to another page. So if you've activated the page by clicking that edit button up here at the top of the page.
- 10:12:29:Presenter: Then come down and select these.

- 10:13:16:Presenter: Is not. You mark them there, no problem. You put the same the way you're doing it, and you're doing it no problem. Suppose you go into the additional tab and then you go into, say, for example.

- 10:32:05:Presenter: Yeah. You have a few layers there, but I think I got them all. So I'm going to start with residential versus commercial.

- 10:44:15:Presenter: That would wouldn't have a green container as an example, or potentially a blue container if that's the only way they can divert cardboard and paper.

- 10:44:32:Presenter: So my question is, I want to get confirmation what exactly a compliance review is. I looked through the code, it sounded like that a compliance review means I need to make sure that.

- 10:45:29:Presenter: So I guess there's like multiple thing I wanna get confirmation like what does it mean that I have done my compliance review that will be up to your standard. Secondly, can I just have like over compassing thing because we have a?
- 10:45:42:Presenter: Ordinance in place and thirdly is if or do I have to only find out how many accounts has 2 + 2 yard plus service and how you clarify that the two yard plus?
- 10:45:45:Presenter: Includes blue, green and black.
- 10:45:55:Presenter: Got it. OK. So compliance reviews is referring to a desk audit, so you don't actually have to go out to these businesses to verify they have all the containers?
- 10:46:09:Presenter: Kind of what we mean here, and no, ignorance alone may not be enough to say they're all in compliance here. So as an example, what you'd be doing here is looking at kind of an Excel spreadsheet.
- 10:46:19:Presenter: Your generators identifying those that are two plus cubic yards for the collective gray, blue and green containers.

- 10:46:29:Presenter: And then kind of being able to verify from that desk audit that those that meet that threshold do indeed have, at least on paper.

- 10:46:46:Presenter: Or however many containers you have in your particular collection system. Hey Andrew, can we add on though I think to one of the questions was all points. Andrew spot on.
