00:18:15:02 - 00:18:20:03 That's a lot of tons to lose. Every year when a SB 498 report is posted.

988 is a study bill about what to do with the online biomass industry

from the eighties.

00:19:55:19 - 00:19:58:07 We're losing a lot of capacity, but I think some are being repowered

00:19:58:08 - 00:20:01:09 down the Rio Bravo and other places.

00:20:01:09 - 00:20:05:12 So there is some clean biomass from the old school eighties technologies

00:35:12:06 - 00:35:16:05
I think we were looking at 18, 19
billion containers sold or redeemed.

00:35:16:29 - 00:35:20:22 But we also experienced the two greatest years of container losses.

00:35:21:09 - 00:35:23:22 Close to 8 billion containers were lost.

00:35:24:16 - 00:35:26:23 If we go back to 2019,

I think the containers lost was around four and a half billion.

00:36:23:08 - 00:36:25:24 Nobody's interested in doing business in Northern California

00:36:25:24 - 00:36:31:05 because the cost structure is so much different than other parts of the state.

00:36:31:16 - 00:36:34:12 So we need some help for the Northern California

00:36:34:12 - 00:36:36:29

or the higher cost unserved areas.

00:36:37:26 - 00:36:41:18 So one of the things that I've asked for is a fast track

00:36:42:04 - 00:36:44:19 for certification,

00:36:44:19 - 00:36:47:09 for redemption centers in these unserved areas.

I also asked about CalRecycle hosting a meeting in Southern California

00:38:29:03 - 00:38:31:24 I'd still like to see if that was done,

00:38:59:12 - 00:39:03:05 bill seems to be the the can that continually gets kicked to the curb.

00:39:07:04 - 00:39:11:04 new recycling centers or pay the existing recycling centers more money.

00:39:13:07 - 00:39:16:19 hoping through your leadership comments, discussions that you're having

00:39:17:07 - 00:39:19:26 with administrative staff and legislative staff,

00:40:11:19 - 00:40:15:20 based in Paris, California, the only family business in this space.

00:40:15:20 - 00:40:18:03 Everyone, we compete with their big billion dollar

00:40:18:03 - 00:40:19:24 multinational conglomerates.

00:40:19:24 - 00:40:21:23 And then there's me. Yeah.

00:40:21:23 - 00:40:24:14 So I just kind of wanted to draw a

00:40:24:14 - 00:40:28:03 through line from what The gentleman from Guyton. Is that what

00:40:28:04 - 00:40:31:22 the company's called? Guyton? To Mings to me.

00:40:31:28 - 00:40:34:19 So it's all part of this kind of supply chain.

00:40:34:29 - 00:40:38:29 And I want you guys to kind of think of it not as like siloed segments,

00:40:38:29 - 00:40:43:00 but as the human body, you know, the arm bones connected 00:40:43:00 - 00:40:46:23 to the wrist bone raise, bones connected to the hand bone, right.

00:40:46:23 - 00:40:47:24 Same kind of thing.

00:40:47:24 - 00:40:51:13 So Bales from Guyton go to our good friend Jeff

00:40:51:13 - 00:40:53:02 at Mings. They get it

00:40:53:02 - 00:40:56:12 They they bale it, and then I buy it through PRCC,

00:40:56:14 - 00:40:58:21 who is also in attendance.

00:40:58:21 - 00:41:00:11 See, the whole gang's here.

00:41:21:12 - 00:41:24:07 First is to tell you that like

00:41:25:06 - 00:41:28:28 we need the PMDP announcement ASAP

00:41:29:12 - 00:41:33:02 because like Jeff was saying, it's just been it's been bad.

00:41:33:02 - 00:41:34:24 It's been bad for probably three quarters.

00:41:34:24 - 00:41:37:11 You know, everything just fell off of a cliff in September.

00:41:37:16 - 00:41:39:27 The market lost 80% of its value.

00:41:39:27 - 00:41:41:28 I mean, people were jumping off of buildings

00:41:41:28 - 00:41:43:20 during the Great Depression for less.

00:41:43:20 - 00:41:45:13 So it was pretty bad.

00:41:45:13 - 00:41:48:17 And things got a little better, but then it just kind of stagnated.

00:41:48:17 - 00:41:53:00 And right now we're at 12% of pound bales for A-grade, really, really low.

00:41:53:07 - 00:41:56:03 And I think that the problem I'm experiencing, it kind of trickles,

00:41:57:09 - 00:41:59:16 which is twofold. The first is that

00:41:59:16 - 00:42:02:18 we kind of had this force majeure issue with all of the storms.

00:42:02:18 - 00:42:05:26 All the wet weather came in the thermoforming industry

00:42:06:09 - 00:42:09:07 under water as all these farms are now a lake in the Central Valley.

00:42:09:14 - 00:42:11:25 Everything is too wet. Driscoll's there.

00:42:11:25 - 00:42:14:21 Their suppliers can't even harvest because it's too muddy out there.

00:42:14:29 - 00:42:20:12 So the demand shriveled simultaneously the cost to ship from East Asia

00:42:20:21 - 00:42:25:11 to the port of Long Beach or to California massively dropped

00:42:25:27 - 00:42:28:22 during COVID, it was up to 20 grand a container.

00:42:29:13 - 00:42:30:22 My buddy Irvin does a lot of exporting.

00:42:30:22 - 00:42:33:27 Irvin What was the most you paid for the ship?

00:42:34:29 - 00:42:35:07 Well,

00:42:35:07 - 00:42:38:09 how expensive, How expensive did it get?

00:42:38:09 - 00:42:39:12 No, no, no, not right now. 00:42:39:12 - 00:42:42:16 I'm saying during COVID, buddy, when it was when it was crazy expensive,

00:42:43:08 - 00:42:44:16 how much was it?

00:42:45:00 - 00:42:45:27 Yikes.

00:42:45:27 - 00:42:48:19 25,000. Just to ship from East Asia to here.

00:42:48:26 - 00:42:50:23 Now, how much is it?

00:42:53:12 - 00:42:56:09 Wow. So all of this material that was building up

00:42:56:09 - 00:42:57:21 in East Asia that couldn't get over here

00:42:57:21 - 00:43:00:02 because the cost of logistics was too high to bring it over?

00:43:00:09 - 00:43:02:12 Now it's just flooding the market.

00:43:02:12 - 00:43:06:05 And I find myself competing with companies from East Asia

00:43:06:12 - 00:43:10:04 who are selling Flake for up to \$0.10 less than I'm selling it.

00:43:10:09 - 00:43:13:29 And so that's why you've had this price just slowly go down and go down

00:43:13:29 - 00:43:17:03

and you see the misery from things and the misery from Guyton,

00:43:17:10 - 00:43:20:03 because I, you know, I was only buying half capacity

00:43:20:03 - 00:43:24:09 if that during the busy season because I didn't have the orders.

00:43:24:09 - 00:43:30:01 And so these guys who much like us, it's a very seasonal business

00:43:30:01 - 00:43:31:26 and you have your good months and you have your bad months,

00:43:31:26 - 00:43:32:29 and then at the end it balances out

00:43:32:29 - 00:43:34:21 and you hope that you turn a profit at the end of it.

00:43:34:21 - 00:43:36:17 Well, it's been nothing but bad months.

00:43:36:17 - 00:43:39:01 And so you had the weather that decreased the demand,

00:43:39:01 - 00:43:41:21 but then at the same time you had this cheap material coming in.

00:43:41:27 - 00:43:45:17 So for wet demand, there was it was all coming from East Asia.

00:43:45:27 - 00:43:50:10 So we were struggling, which means he's struggling,

which means he's struggling and it just kind of rolls downhill Now.

00:43:57:25 - 00:44:00:01 Usually June, everyone's coming to me, everyone's be a best friend.

00:44:00:01 - 00:44:01:27 Hey, Paul, what's up? I can get ten low take.

00:44:01:27 - 00:44:02:21 Can I get this?

00:44:02:21 - 00:44:04:21 I'm a popular guy. In June this year.

00:44:04:24 - 00:44:06:03 Nothing Phone

00:44:08:12 - 00:44:12:04 dead So suddenly,

00:44:12:25 - 00:44:15:22 when we came back from 4th of July, I started getting a lot of calls

00:44:15:27 - 00:44:20:12 and a lot of people started saying, Hey, I want to get some orders now.

00:44:20:12 - 00:44:25:08 What happened the last week of June to change things?

00:44:26:01 - 00:44:27:07 Any ideas?

00:44:27:27 - 00:44:29:12 It's okay. You don't know.

00:44:29:21 - 00:44:33:02

Governor Newsom signed the extra PMDP bump into law.

00:44:33:09 - 00:44:36:29 So now the people who are connected with that said, oh, wow, my,

00:44:36:29 - 00:44:39:08 my, \$0.03 a pound is now going to turn into six.

00:44:39:08 - 00:44:40:14 Turn it is seven.

00:44:40:14 - 00:44:42:29 Now, that's more of a reason for me to buy the California stuff,

00:44:42:29 - 00:44:44:12 not the import stuff.

00:44:44:12 - 00:44:48:20 So the people who are like, connected with it, they started buying overnight, boom.
