Call the most sweeping law to phase out single-use plastics and other packaging waste, California set the nation 's toughest rules to reduce single use plastics by requiring that by 2032 25% of plastic packaging is cut, 65% of single use packaging is recycled, and 100% of all packaging in California is recyclable or compostable.

The new law could eliminate over 20,000,000 tons of plastic waste in the next decade, accelerating California move to a circular economy with sustainable product design to protect our communities, restore our oceans, and safeguard our clean healthy future for our children and their children.
