A. Stewardship Organization

PaintCare Inc., a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization, was formed to serve as the representative stewardship organization of architectural paint manufacturers to fulfill their obligations under the California Paint Stewardship Law. PaintCare was created by the American Coatings Association, the primary trade association of the paint and coatings industry. PaintCare's Board of Directors consists of eleven non-paid representatives of architectural paint manufacturers.

PaintCare representation is open to all architectural paint manufacturers. A current list of participating manufacturers and their mailing addresses is included in the appendix.

A. California Paint Stewardship Law and Annual Report

In September 2010, Governor Schwarzenegger signed Assembly Bill 1343 (Huffman), the California Paint Stewardship Law. This law requires manufacturers of architectural paint to develop and implement a program to reduce the generation of postconsumer architectural paint, promote the reuse of postconsumer architectural paint, and to provide a system for the management of postconsumer architectural paint in an environmentally sound manner that includes collection, transportation, processing, recycling, and proper disposal.

The California program began October 19, 2012. PaintCare, on behalf of participating paint manufacturers, submits an annual report to the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle). Annual reports cover the period July 1 – June 30. As prescribed in Section 48700 of the California Public Resources Code and further detailed in Title 14, Section 18954 of the California Code of Regulations, the information submitted in an annual report shall be organized according to this standard outline:

B. Year Eleven Program Highlights

B1. Sites and Services

Drop-Off Sites. The program had 868 year-round paint drop-off sites at the end of the report period. Of the 868 year-round sites, 660 were paint retailers. The remaining sites included 55 transfer stations, eleven reuse stores, 121 household hazardous waste (HHW) facilities, four recycling centers, seven landfills, three paint recyclers, and seven other sites (e.g., fire stations and public works yards).

The program also managed paint from supplemental drop-off sites that included 11 seasonal HHW facilities, 277 HHW events, 11 sites that accepted paint for part of the year, and 11 paint-only events.

During the report period, 99.1% of California residents lived within 15 miles of a drop-off site.

Services. The program provided 755 direct large volume pickups (LVP) from businesses and others that had accumulated more than 100 gallons of paint at their locations and serviced 73 locations set up as recurring large volume pickup (RLVP) sites. PaintCare also partnered with 18 HHW door-to-door (D2D) collection programs.

B2. Collection Volume

Paint Collection Volume. The program collected 3,364,885 gallons of postconsumer paint.

Paint Processing. Latex paint was 88% of the paint processed: 5% was reused, 79% was made into recycled-content paint, 3% was used as a component in lightweight aggregate, <1% was used as a component in alternative daily landfill cover, and 13% that was dry paint was landfilled. Oil-based paint was 12% of the paint processed: 3% was reused, 55% was processed for energy recovery, and 42% was incinerated.

Paint Recovery Rate. The recovery rate—the volume of postconsumer paint collected divided by the volume of new paint sales in the same period—was 5.2%.

Container Recycling. The program recycled approximately 1,897 tons of plastic and metal paint cans.

B3. Operations

PaintCare continued a multi-year pilot program to explore the feasibility of expanding reuse activities, including holding events to give away reuse paint. Three free paint giveaway events were held—one in Merced and two in Redlands. A total of 6,533 gallons of paint was given to 420 participants.

Paint reuse tables were provided at seven of the eight PaintCare paint collection events. In addition, the program added four new reuse stores including three Habitat for Humanity locations in Riverside County and one in Yuba County. PaintCare had 29 reuse partners, which included HHW facilities and reuse stores. PaintCare also partnered with Yolo County and the City of Lancaster on public art murals using reuse paint at their public facilities.

PaintCare continued efforts to establish partnerships with municipal and county programs through engagement at conferences, Environmental Services Joint Powers Authority (an organization of rural counties) and Household Hazardous Waste Information Exchange (HHWIE) meetings, in-person site visits, and conference calls.

PaintCare continued to grow the use of reusable plastic bins for the collection of latex paint at HHW facilities.

B4. Outreach and Education

Public outreach activities included the distribution of point-of-sale print materials, fact sheets, and signage, as well as messaging delivered via direct mail, digital ads, streaming audio, radio, social media, and online video.

PaintCare began a three-year effort to visit non-drop-off site paint retailers in California. The site visits focus on educating store staff about the PaintCare program, providing point-of-sale materials, and discussing the retailers' obligations under the stewardship law, including monitoring the registered brands list and charging the correct fee on program products.

In May, PaintCare received the Environmental Initiative Award at the SEAL (Sustainability, Environmental Achievement and Leadership) Business Sustainability Awards, recognizing businesses that demonstrate environmental and sustainability initiatives.

A. Paint Drop-Off Sites and Services

A1. Site Types

PaintCare continued to grow its paint collection system in both urban and rural communities. The sites and services used to collect paint from the public include the following:

- Paint retailers, including paint, hardware, and building supply stores
- HHW collection facilities and events
- Solid waste transfer stations, recycling centers, and landfills
- Material reuse stores (e.g., Habitat for Humanity Restores)
- Paint-only drop-off events
- Large volume pickup service for sites that have accumulated more than 100 gallons of postconsumer paint (most commonly painting contractors). [Note: Sites that receive a single or infrequent pickup (less than three per year) are referred to as “large volume pickups” (LVP), while sites that receive pickups on an ongoing basis are called “recurring large volume pickup” (RLVP) sites.]
- Partnership with door-to-door HHW programs

PaintCare had 868 year-round drop-off sites in California at the end of the report year. For the purpose of defining convenience, PaintCare defines a site (including an event site) by its physical address and considers it to be “year-round” if the site is open at least one day per month, every month of the year. Sites that are open less frequently are considered supplemental sites. Sites that close permanently or stop participating in the PaintCare program during the year are also considered supplemental and are noted as being partial year only.

The program managed paint from 277 HHW drop-off events, held 11 paint-only drop-off events, partnered with 18 HHW door-to-door collection programs, had 22 other supplemental sites, completed 755 LVP appointments, and served 73 RLVP sites.

Paint-only event locations were chosen to provide recycling opportunities in underserved areas with either high local demand or limited access based on existing drop-off locations. In lieu of holding a paint-only event, PaintCare also consults with communities on alternative means of paint recovery, such as LVP/RLVP services.

The following tables summarize PaintCare sites and services during the year, with a comparison to the previous two years. An error was caused by the way PaintCare classified site types and services during FY2022. The sites and services table reflects the corrected FY2022 site count.

[Notes regarding the tables above: (1) Only stand-alone door-to-door programs are counted in the table above. While PaintCare also partners with HHW facilities that host door-to-door operations, such as the city of Folsom, they are not included in the Door-to-Door Programs category to avoid counting multiservice HHW programs twice. (2) The Other Sites category in the upper table includes fire stations, public works yards, and other miscellaneous types of paint drop-off sites that do not fall into the primary categories. The

Other Sites category in the lower table is a catch-all category for sites other than retail stores that closed or left the program during the year. As such closures rarely occur, they are grouped together to keep the table compact.]

The locations of the year-round sites, supplemental sites, and LVP/RLVP sites are shown in the maps in section 4 of the report. A full list of all sites and door-to-door program partners is provided in the appendix.

A2. Site Configuration

Nearly all PaintCare drop-off sites accept both latex paint and oil-based paint. LVP/RLVP sites may also manage both latex and oil-based paint through PaintCare, but with some limits on oil-based paint volumes.

Retail drop-off sites and paint-only drop-off events accept paint from both households and qualifying businesses, while HHW programs, transfer stations, and some other locations may limit participation to their normal service area and customers, which may or may not include businesses. LVP/RLVP sites may be households, businesses, or others (i.e., government agencies or nonprofits).

PaintCare pays for paint collection bins, training materials, transportation of paint from the site, and paint processing for all drop-off and LVP/RLVP sites. Spill kits are provided to most sites. PaintCare also negotiates payment for additional services with HHW sites, transfer stations, and some other sites. Additional services include:

- Paint reuse
- Latex paint reprocessing
- Oil-based paint bulking
- Internal transportation (from remote sites to a primary location)

B. Paint Transportation and Processing

B1. Paint Transportation

PaintCare contracted with: Clean Harbors Environmental Services, Clean Earth, and ACTenviro to pick up from most drop-off sites in California. PaintCare also contracted with waste companies that held existing agreements with HHW programs, such as Veolia Environmental Services, Waste Management, US Ecology, and Visions Paint. Acrylatex also serviced some of the LVP customers. Several HHW programs provided transportation services for PaintCare.

Transporters schedule pick up appointments in two ways: (1) by request as needed or (2) on a set schedule (e.g., every Monday). Transporters are responsible for delivery of empty collection bins and program supplies and for picking up full bins from drop-off sites.

Transporters provide PaintCare all data on the transportation and processing of PaintCare

products taken from all sites to their final destination. Shipments of PaintCare products from HHW facilities that have partnered with PaintCare are arranged between the facilities and transporters, typically to coincide with the sites' regular shipments of other HHW. Contracted transporters and their downstream processors are subject to audit by PaintCare.

Various paint collection containers are used in the program. Most drop-off sites pack paint cans into cubic yard bins. A few sites pack paint cans into 55-gallon drums and large shipping containers (20 cubic yards or larger), and some bulk (pour off) paint into drums. Full collection bins of commingled paint (latex and oil-based paint cans in the same collection container) are transported to the transporters' facilities for sorting by type. From there, latex paint is transported to a latex paint recycler and oil-based paint is transported to downstream processors. Collection containers of paint sorted by type at drop-off sites (typically by HHW programs) are either shipped to the transporters' facilities for transportation efficiency or are shipped directly to downstream processors.

Containers are shipped using either a bill of lading or a hazardous waste manifest as appropriate.

B2. Latex Paint Processing

The following describes how latex paint was processed:

Reuse. Latex paint was sold or given away in its original labeled containers without any alteration of the container contents.

Paint-to-Paint Recycling. Latex paint was sorted, blended, and sometimes re-tinted into recycled-content latex paint for local use or domestic or international sale. In addition, the following HHW programs reprocessed paint during the year: Kern, Lake, San Bernardino, San Francisco, Santa Cruz, and Sonoma. Recycled paint was given away to the local community by HHW programs and sold through domestic and international markets by private recyclers.

Lightweight Aggregate. A portion of latex paint was used by Visions Environmental in Oroville, CA, as a component of lightweight aggregate. The lightweight aggregate was then offered for sale as lightweight aggregate, used to produce landscape products, or used as a component in various precast concrete products.

Alternative Daily Cover. The County of Santa Cruz used a small portion of latex paint as a component of alternative daily cover (ADC) for their landfill.

Disposal. Dry and unusable latex paint was sorted by Acrylatex, GDB International, and Visions and sent to various permitted landfills.

B3. Oil-Based Paint Processing

The following describes how oil-based paint was processed:

Reuse. Oil-based paint was sold or given away in its original labeled containers without any alteration of the container contents.

Energy Recovery. Oil-based paint was processed for energy recovery at the following facilities: Ash Grove Cement in Chanute, KS, Ash Grove in Foreman, AR, Buzzi Unicem in Cape Girardeau, MO, Buzzi Unicem in Greencastle, IN, Green America in Hannibal, MO, Lehigh Cement in Logansport, IN, and Systech in Fredonia, KS.

Incineration. A portion of the oil-based paint was incinerated at Clean Harbors' facilities in Grantsville, UT and Kimball, NE.

B4. Container Recycling

Downstream paint processors and HHW programs sent empty metal and plastic paint containers for recycling when possible. Commodity market conditions have an impact on the extent to which container recycling is feasible.

The program recycled approximately 1,897 tons of plastic and metal paint cans.

C. Best Management Practices for Drop-Off Sites

PaintCare has contract agreements with all its drop-off sites, as well as door-to-door programs, and RLVP sites. For county and municipal sites that do not operate their own sites, PaintCare contracted either directly with the county, municipality or with their site operator.

PaintCare requires all sites to be staffed during operating hours, store PaintCare products in a secure location, and follow all procedures covered in site trainings and PaintCare site guidelines.

C1. Site Training and Guidelines

With the exception of HHW programs for which it is optional, all other sites received on-site, in-person training. These sites receive a binder that includes program guidelines, a training presentation, record-keeping forms, and signage. The binder is required to be kept on-site and readily available. The training and guidelines cover:

- Identification of program and non-PaintCare products
- Acceptable containers
- Whom to accept paint from and how much
- Screening procedure for Very Small Quantity Generators (VSQGs) and the required log form
- Proper storage
- Spill response procedures and reporting requirements
- How to schedule a pickup
- Required paperwork and retention schedules

Variations of these guidelines are provided to retail stores, reuse stores, transfer stations, RLVP sites, and others. The current version of the site guidelines is in the appendix.

Retailers and other non-HHW drop-off sites are not allowed to accept PaintCare products without original labels or not in original containers. However, HHW programs often receive unlabeled containers and products not in their original containers in the course of normal operations and have the skills and tools to identify whether the material is an acceptable program product.

C2. Site Visits

Drop-off sites typically receive site visits throughout the year by PaintCare regional coordinators to check on operations, answer questions, and provide additional program outreach materials. PaintCare has six regional coordinators in California.

PaintCare also conducted educational site visits to paint retailers that are not active drop-off sites. The purpose of these visits was to educate the retailers on the program, recruit new drop-off sites, and offer point-of-sale educational materials.

C3. Paint Collection Bins

Drop-off sites are equipped with collection bins to store PaintCare products, with sites required to ship a minimum of two bins unless otherwise granted an exception by PaintCare. Sites are required to keep collection bins in a secure location that is not directly accessible to the public. Depending on the location of the bins, and preference of the site,

PaintCare supplies two types of bins: fiber bins (made of corrugated cardboard) and reusable bins (plastic).

C4. Paint Acceptance Limits

PaintCare requires sites to accept at least 5 gallons of paint per customer per day. Some drop-off sites voluntarily accept more than 5 gallons; many accept up to 20 gallons per customer. A few stores accept up to 100 gallons, while some recyclers, transfer stations, and HHW sites accept unlimited volumes of latex paint.

C5. Scheduling Bin Pickups

All drop-off sites are advised to order a bin pickup before they reach their storage capacity. Sites in urban areas receive pickups within five business days of a request; sites in rural areas receive pickups within ten business days. Many sites in high volume areas have also been placed on an automatic pickup schedule.

D. Coordination with Existing HHW Programs and Retailers

D1. HHW Programs and Solid Waste Facilities

PaintCare continued its efforts to partner with all HHW programs and maintained all existing HHW partnerships. Kings County is the only HHW program in the state collecting paint that does not partner with PaintCare. Imperial County has chosen not to collect paint at their HHW facility and refers households and businesses to local PaintCare retail locations. PaintCare reached out to Kings and Imperial counties periodically to discuss joining the program.

D2. Paint Retailers and Reuse Stores

PaintCare maintains a comprehensive list of California paint retailers and reuse stores, including independent and corporate stores. PaintCare recruits new sites through in-person site visits and coordination with corporate contacts at paint retailers. PaintCare continues its efforts to recruit and retain retail and reuse store drop-off sites. While some retail and reuse stores closed or moved within the year, PaintCare gained a net of 21 retail and reuse store drop-off sites in FY2023.

A. Program Goals

The California Paint Stewardship Law requires PaintCare to establish goals to reduce the generation of postconsumer paint, to promote the reuse of postconsumer paint, and for the proper end-of-life management of postconsumer paint, based on current household hazardous waste program information.

This section of the report addresses architectural paint recovery and recycling goals. Section 6 (Education and Outreach) addresses postconsumer paint reduction and reuse goals.

B. Program Convenience

As described in the Program Plan approved in January 2022, to ensure adequate collection coverage, Geographic Information System (GIS) modeling was used to determine the number and distribution of drop-off sites needed to provide a convenient program. The following convenience criteria were applied and resulted in a goal of 790 drop-off sites:

Distribution Criterion. To provide statewide coverage, establish sites within 15 miles of 95% of the state's population.

Population Criterion. To ensure proper site density, establish at least one drop-off site for every 50,000 of the population of California. For transfer stations, HHW sites and events in California, PaintCare continually updates defined service areas for each location (typically confined to a city or county). Only the population within a 15-mile radius (the “distribution” criterion) of each location, and that are also within a given location’s known service area, are counted. Service area updates may produce slight changes in the distribution criterion results from year to year. Population is based on the US Census Bureau decennial (2020) Census Block level data.

California had a fair number of HHW programs prior to implementation of the PaintCare program. However, service levels varied across the state, and many HHW programs did not accept paint (and other hazardous waste) from businesses. With the addition of more than 700 additional year-round paint drop-off sites, PaintCare has made it significantly more convenient to recycle paint in the state, especially for businesses.

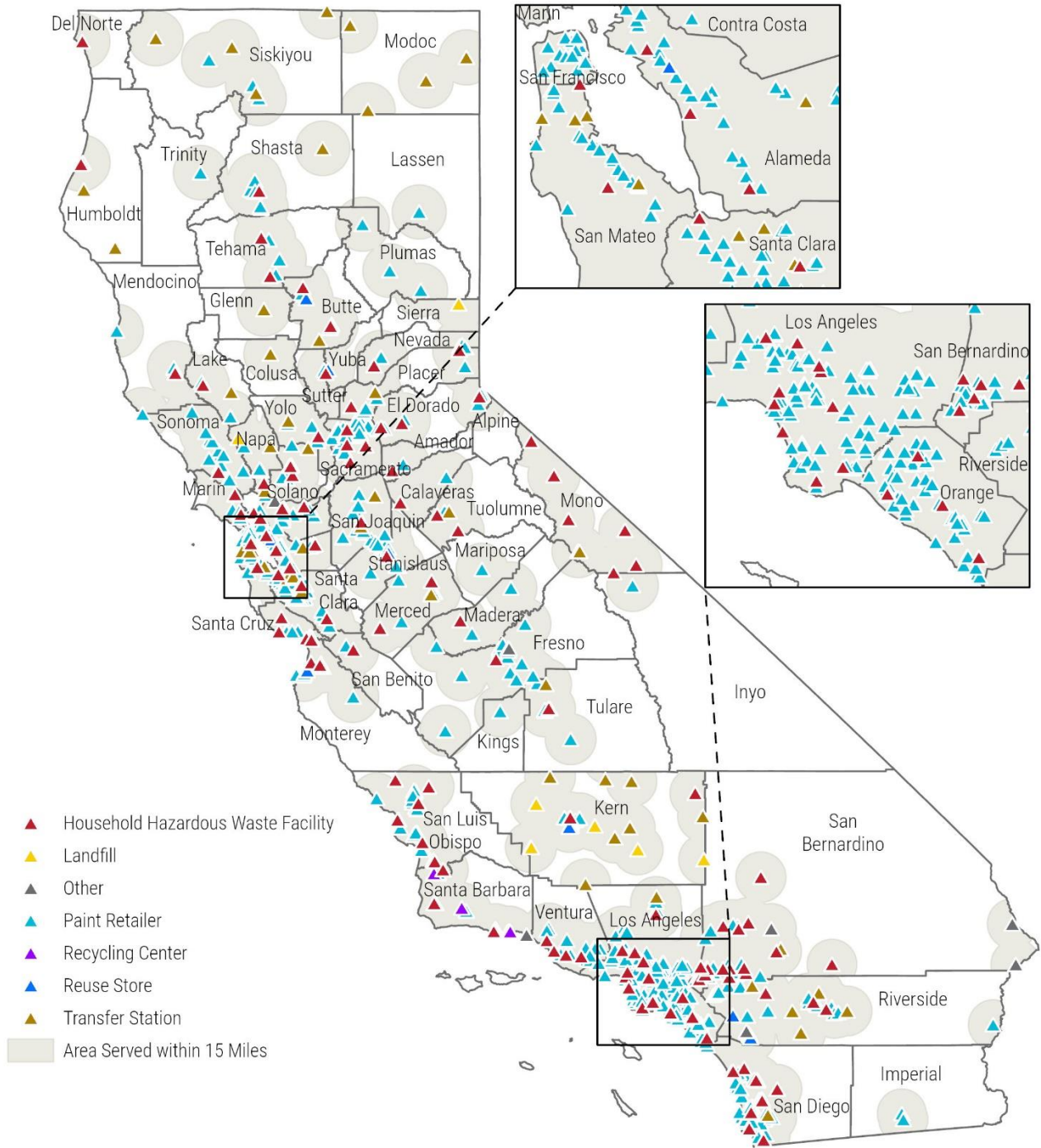
The combination of additional year-round drop-off sites (primarily paint retailers) and partnerships with the existing year-round HHW programs provided a site within 15 miles of 99.1% of the state’s population, satisfying the distribution target of the program. When including supplemental sites and events in the distribution analysis, population coverage increases to 99.3%.

Retailers and other potential drop-off sites are typically located in or near population centers. The population of California is 39,538,223 as of the 2020 U.S. Census data, resulting in a baseline of 790 sites needed to meet the population criterion. As of June 30, 2023, the program provided 868 year-round sites – achieving the population criterion of the program.

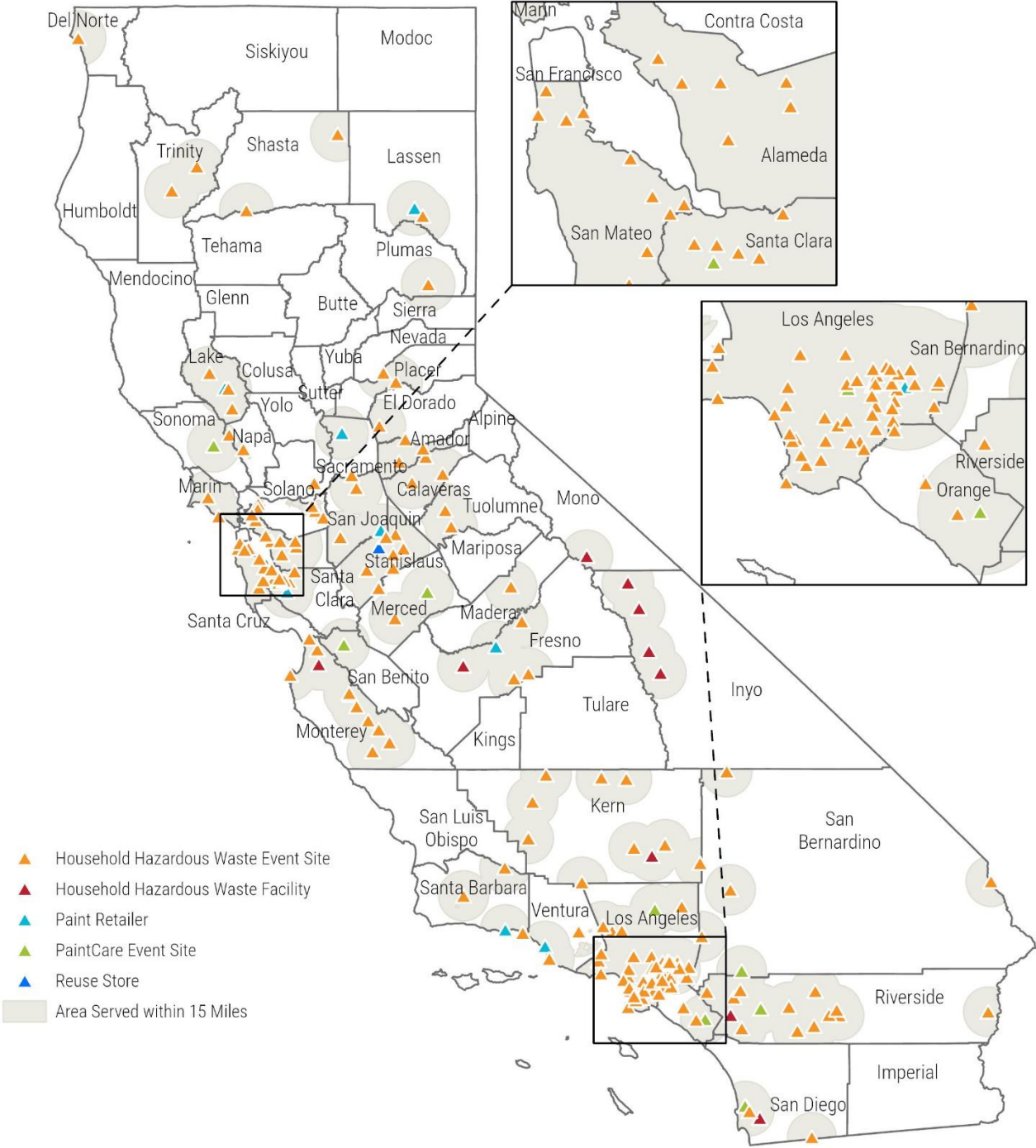
Section 3 of this report described the number and types of paint drop-off sites offered by the program. The maps on the following pages show their locations. Appendix Section A includes a list of sites used to generate these maps with site types and city names.

- Map 1 shows the locations of year-round drop-off sites and their service areas within a 15-mile radius.
- Map 2 shows the locations of supplemental sites and their service areas within a 15-mile radius.
- Map 3 shows both year-round and supplemental sites and their service areas within a 15-mile radius.
- Map 4 shows the locations of LVP and RLVP sites. Though the LVP/RLVP service provides tremendous convenience for its users, these sites are not included in any convenience analysis because they are not public drop-off sites and therefore do not add to the program’s convenience level for the public. Similarly, door-to-door programs are also not included in any convenience analysis, nor are they included in any map since we do not track their service area.

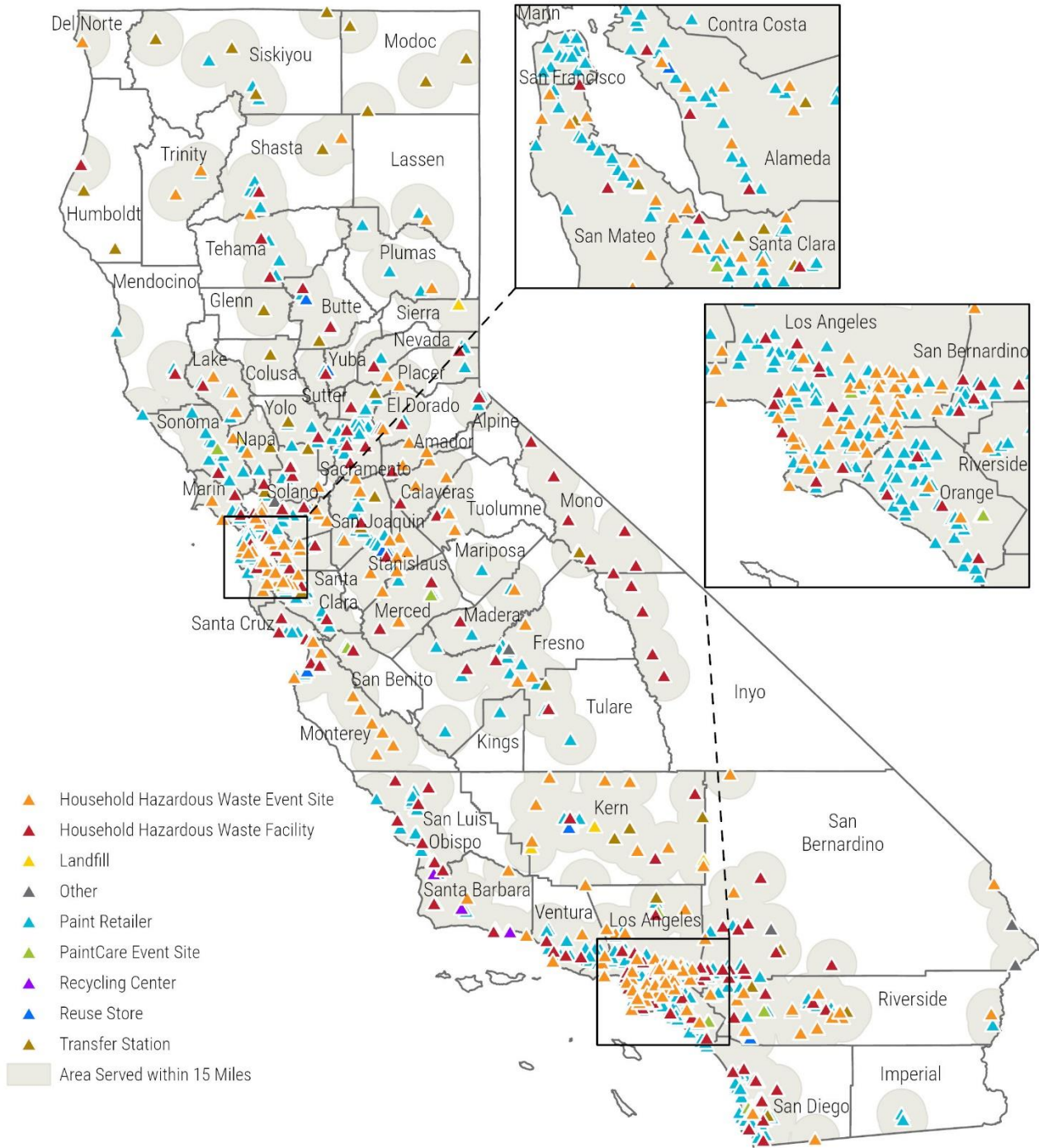
Map 1. Year-Round Drop-Off Sites



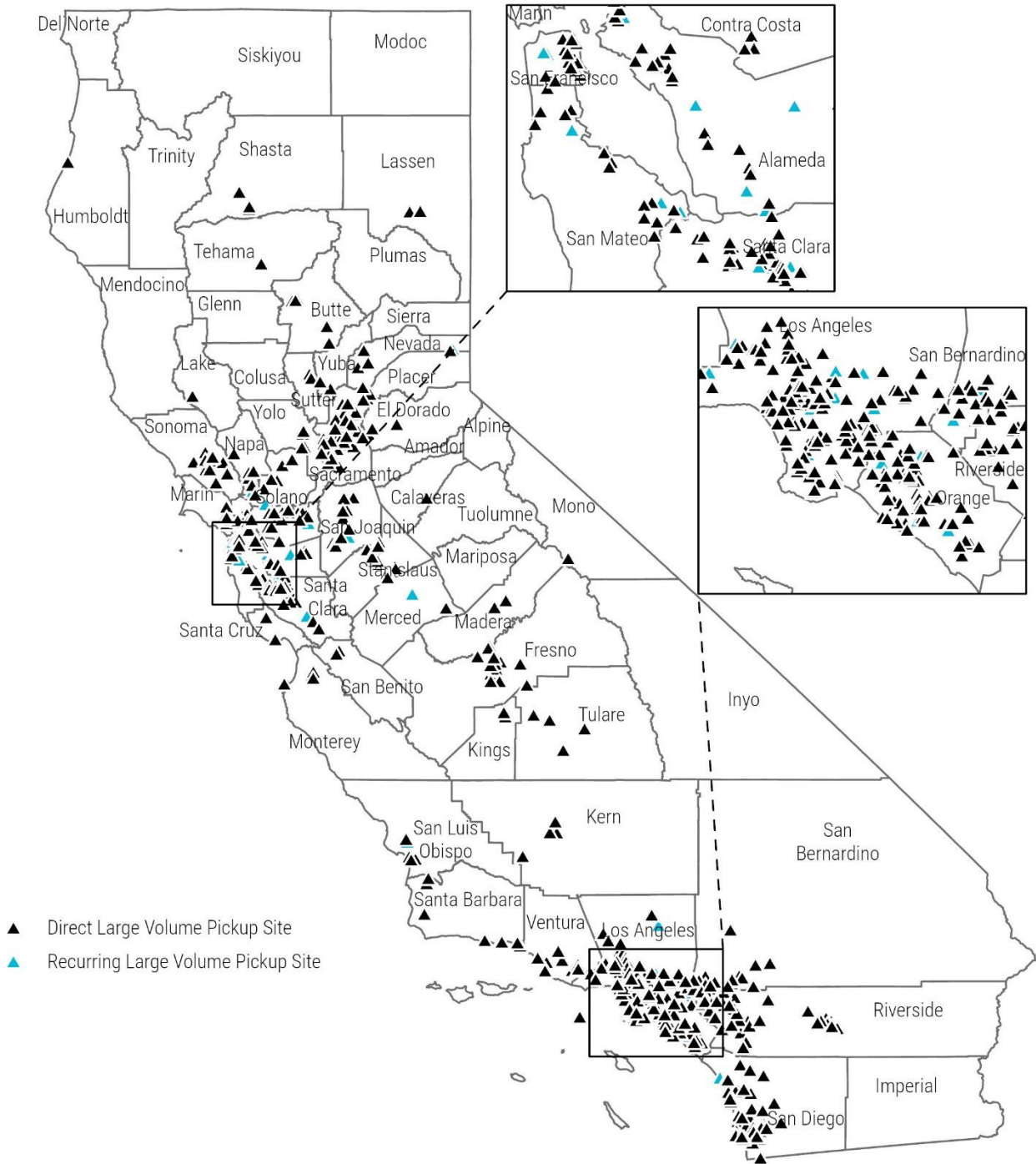
Map 2. Supplemental Drop-Off Sites

C. Paint Sales

The volume of architectural paint sold in the year fell to approximately 64 million gallons. The following table shows paint sales, broken out by container size categories, in the last three program years.

D. Paint Processed and Recovery Rate

A total of 3,103,173 gallons of postconsumer architectural paint was processed during the year. A gap in the time between collection and processing occurs every year and generally balances out from year to year. The following tables provide the breakdown of the volume of paint processed by type and the recovery rate for each of the past three years.

Recovery rate is the volume of paint processed compared to the volume of paint sold in the same year.

The first table also shows year-over-year changes in the volume of paint processed.

This year, 52% of paint processed came from local government programs (this includes HHW facilities and events, as well as transfer stations and other local government sites that collect paint). Paint from retail and reuse stores made up 35% of the volume, LVP/RLVPs claimed an 8% share, paint recyclers received 4% and paint-only drop-off events accounted for <1% as shown in the following table:

E. Methodology for Determining Volumes

PaintCare was provided aggregated data by each service provider for total paint reused and processed.

For transporters, one of two methods were applied: (1) For data where the weight of paint processed was provided by recyclers to transporters, packaging weight assumptions were made by each transporter and removed from the total weights. Next, a conversion factor of 10 pounds per gallon was applied to weight data to obtain volume. (2) For data where actual volume of paint processed was provided by recyclers to transporters, no conversions were applied, and volume was reported without modification.

For HHW programs that reprocessed latex paint, data provided to PaintCare was the volume of paint reprocessed and given out to the public. If the paint was not given away in the year, even if reprocessed during the year, it was not counted in the year.

Data for reuse was calculated by measuring the fullness of the container, which determined the volume of paint inside. Documentation supporting the volume of paint given away for reuse is provided to PaintCare upon request.

F. Paint Disposition and Processors

PaintCare contracts for processing and proper end-of-life management of all PaintCare products either directly or through the program's transporters. In addition, to support the waste hierarchy of reduce, reuse, recycle, PaintCare encourages and provides financial compensation for reuse and reprocessing.

As described previously, paint was managed in the following ways:

Latex Paint. Reuse, paint-to-paint recycling, lightweight aggregate, alternative daily landfill cover (ADC), and disposal.

Oil-Based Paint. Reuse, energy recovery, incineration.

The following tables show latex and oil-based paint disposition for the most recent and previous two years:

A. Financing Mechanism

PaintCare maintained its financing mechanism and fully covered the cost of continuing to implement the program through the year. The funding system places an assessment (PaintCare fee) on every container of architectural paint sold in California. The fees were set at a rate to cover but not exceed the cost of implementing the California program.

The PaintCare fee was reduced due to the reserve balance exceeding PaintCare’s reserve policy. The new fee structure below was approved by CalRecycle in 2022 and took effect July 1, 2022.

A1. PaintCare Fee

A2. Total Program Cost

Total program cost for the year was \$35,351,544.

The independent financial audit of the California PaintCare program (referred to in the financial audit by its formal name, the California Architectural Paint Recovery Program) is in the appendix. Detailed information on program costs are included in the audit.

A3. Capital Costs

There were no capital costs during the year.

A4. Cost per Capita

The cost per capita for the year was \$0.91

Cost per capita was calculated using the July 1, 2022, US Census Bureau California population estimate of 39,029,342.

A5. Cost per Gallon

The cost per gallon (of the 3,364,885 gallons of paint collected) during the year was \$10.51, compared to \$9.35 the previous year.

Note that PaintCare reports and uses collected gallons in its calculation, rather than processed volume, because PaintCare is charged for all services (transportation and processing) when the paint is collected rather than when it is actually processed.

A6. Education/Outreach

Education/outreach cost for the year was \$4,783,807—14% of total program costs.

A7. End-of-Life Materials Management

Transportation cost for the year was \$4,042,428—11% of total program costs.

Processing cost for all disposition methods was \$17,863,740 for the year—51% of total program costs.

Actual cost broken down by specific disposition is not available due to the format of transport and processing vendors' contract pricing, which maximizes (and charges the program for) highest-best use, generally considered to be paint-to-paint recycling at this time.

A8. Administrative Costs

Administrative costs (also called indirect costs or corporate expenses) are those that are shared by all jurisdictions that have passed a paint stewardship law, such as salaries for corporate staff who work on activities for all states. Other examples of corporate expenses include construction of data management systems, legal fees, and general communications.

The corporate allocation for each PaintCare jurisdiction is the proportion of its population relative to the population of all PaintCare jurisdictions combined. California's share of the corporate activity allocation was 44%. Administrative costs were \$3,174,735 or 9% of total program costs.

Service payments to CalRecycle are not presented as an administrative expense in the audited financial statements, but rather as a direct California operational expense. Payment to CalRecycle was \$449,277 or 1% of total program costs.

A9. Surplus Funding

The net assets of the California program at the end of the year were \$53,943,285. Net assets are also referred to as reserves. The following tables summarize program revenue and expenses for three years.

B. Reserves Policy

Reserves represent the accumulated surplus (cash and investments) of PaintCare's programs. The reserves provide each program with a balance that is sufficient to pay its bills in times of either higher than expected paint collection (higher expenses), lower than expected paint sales (lower revenue), or a combination of the two.

PaintCare's Reserves Policy has a target reserve as a percentage of annual expenses. It also sets a range with minimum and maximum thresholds. If the reserves fall below the minimum threshold or rise beyond the maximum threshold, an evaluation of the program's expenses and revenue will be performed to determine if changes are needed in operations, outreach, and/or the fee structure to bring the reserve balance within range.

The PaintCare Board of Directors has established a target reserve of 100% of annual expenses. The minimum threshold is 75% (i.e., nine months) of expenses and the maximum is 125% (i.e., 15 months).

At the end of FY2023, the California program had built a reserve of \$53,943,285, 153% of FY2023 operating expenses. The reserve declined more rapidly in FY2023 than previous years, due to decreased paint sales and the reduced PaintCare fee, which went into effect on July 1, 2022.

C. Investment Activity

PaintCare invests a portion of its reserves (from most PaintCare programs) in a financial portfolio. PaintCare maintains investments for all programs in a single portfolio. Claim of ownership in the investment portfolio was shared by all participating programs and allocated among them based on relative net asset balances. Programs that have positive net asset balances have a claim on the assets invested in the portfolio; programs with negative net asset balances carry a liability representing an amount due to the portfolio.

D. Formation of Limited Liability Companies

In 2015, to better separate each state program in terms of liability and financial independence, PaintCare Inc. began implementing a plan to establish sole-member limited liability companies that are each dedicated to administering the paint stewardship program in a particular state. As of the date of this report, PaintCare programs now operate under an LLC format in Colorado, Connecticut, District of Columbia, Maine, Oregon, Rhode Island, Washington, and New York. The remaining programs continue as before. While this process has taken longer than expected, PaintCare still plans to transition the remaining jurisdictions to sole-member limited liability companies over the course of the next one to two years.

Introduction

PaintCare’s education and outreach efforts focus on building awareness of the program and encompass four primary messages: reduce, reuse, recycle, which PaintCare has modified to “Buy right, Use It Up, Recycle the Rest” and proper disposal. PaintCare is committed to providing robust and successful education and outreach using a variety of communication tools. The main objective of outreach was to drive the public to PaintCare’s website to find a drop-off site using PaintCare’s site locator search tool.

PaintCare continued efforts to educate retailers about the new fee structure. In August through October, PaintCare surveyed paint retailers to learn how many were aware of the correct fee. Staff sent email blasts and placed phone calls to paint retailers in the state to remind them about the new fee structure. From September to December PaintCare ran digital and social media ad campaigns targeting retailer audiences with messaging alerting them to the recently changed fee.

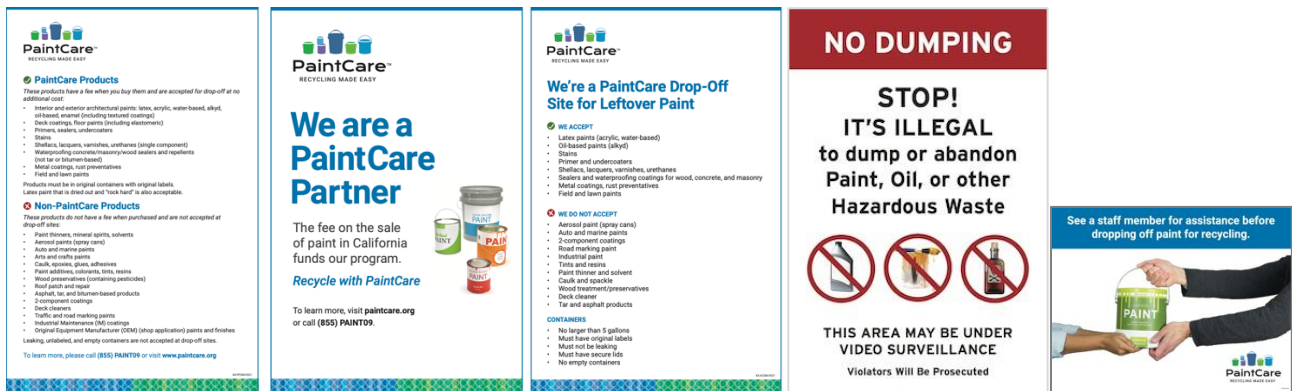

A. Signage Displayed to Customer

PaintCare developed a number of signs for drop-off sites to help inform the public about the program, screen PaintCare products, and address concerns about illegal dumping. Drop-off sites may order the following signs: PaintCare products (English/Spanish), Program Partner, Combination (program partner with simplified products list), No Dumping, and Please Wait for Assistance. B. Print Materials

B1. Point of Sale Print Materials

PaintCare continued to distribute print materials to retailers for them to make available to consumers in their stores to educate them about the PaintCare program. Staff fulfilled requests for materials by mail, distributing a total of 95,813 brochures, mini cards, fact sheets, posters, and other materials during the year. Program staff also delivered additional materials in person during site visits.

PaintCare provided counter mats to retailers for use in the paint department to reference when customers have questions. The counter mat is popular with retailers and more likely than the poster to be seen by customers while they wait for their paint to be mixed.

Larger versions of the materials shown below are included in the appendix of this report and are available on the PaintCare website.



In November, PaintCare sent letters and fact sheets to 60 paint retailers known to sell paint online. The letter provided a summary of PaintCare program information for retailers and a reminder that online paint sales are included under the paint stewardship law.

B2. Fact Sheets

Several fact sheets are available on PaintCare's website for different target audiences, and printed versions are distributed upon request. Minor updates are made throughout the year. Current versions of the fact sheets on PaintCare's website include:

B3. Translations

PaintCare translates program brochures and fact sheets into languages other than English upon requests from paint retailers and other stakeholders. PaintCare has translated its program brochure into Amharic, Arabic, Armenian, Bengali, Chinese, Farsi, French, Haitian Creole, Hawaiian, Hmong, Italian, Japanese, Khmer, Korean, Lao, Polish, Portuguese, Russian, Somali, Spanish, Tagalog, Thai, Turkish, Ukrainian, Vietnamese, and Yiddish. Two widely used fact sheets that provide information about the LVP service and guidance for painting contractors are also available in the 27 languages listed above. PaintCare maintains a Spanish language translation button on its website, making the site fully bilingual. Additionally, live interpretation in Spanish and other languages is available on PaintCare's telephone hotline by request. PaintCare provides information on how to access translations and hotline interpretation at www.paintcare.org/language-assistance/.

C. Promotional Materials/Activities Explaining Product Stewardship

C1. Press Releases and Earned Media

PaintCare issued press announcements throughout the year that resulted in the program being mentioned in at least 20 press stories, including coverage in the Antelope Valley Press, Our Weekly Los Angeles, PaintSquare News, San Diego Magazine, San Diego Reader, SFGate, The Press Democrat, Valley Press, Ventura County Star, Winter Express, Vida en la Valle, and El Popular.

C2. Digital Advertising

Monthly in July to October and February to June, PaintCare ran digital ad campaigns on numerous websites promoting its key messages. Ads in a variety of dimensions were used, and some ads were translated into Spanish language. An example of the digital ads is shown below:



PaintCare also ran a digital ad campaign throughout the year promoting its individual paint retail drop-off sites. The campaign consisted of an interactive digital banner ad displayed on websites and apps on smartphones. When viewers touch the banner, it opens to full screen displaying PaintCare's image and message. Using the phone's location settings, it also displays the PaintCare drop-off site nearest to the viewers at that time. This ad allows viewers to click through to the PaintCare website to learn more or call the store directly by clicking on the store phone number.

Monthly throughout the year, PaintCare ran "native display" digital ads in English and Spanish, which are ads that appear to be embedded within a web article. Native display ads were used to promote paint reuse messaging. The following images show examples of PaintCare's native display ads in English and Spanish:

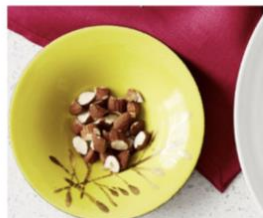

C3. Streaming Audio

In July to August and April to August, PaintCare utilized streaming audio services to run 15- and 30-second commercials that were geotargeted to service users throughout the state. The ad script features a dad clearing out garage storage space and throwing things away. The dad's teen child informs them that paint can be recycled through a PaintCare drop-off site and should not be thrown in the garbage.

C4. Social Media

Throughout the year PaintCare continued to grow its Facebook and Instagram presence and posted messaging to audiences on those platforms as well as Pinterest and TikTok. Social media messages included promotion of PaintCare's three key messages: buy the right amount of paint, use up leftover paint, and recycle the rest with PaintCare. The following image shows a PaintCare Instagram post about better storing leftover paint to ensure it retains its usability and eligibility for recycling:



C5. Video

From July to October 2021 and February to June 2022, PaintCare ran online video and connected television device commercials. The commercial used shows a woman whose child had drawn on the wall. When she gets some of the paint she had been saving for touchups, she sees that she has much more leftover paint than she would need and recycles the rest. C6. Radio

Monthly throughout the year PaintCare sponsored KQED-FM's California Report program. Since the California Report is picked up by numerous public radio stations throughout the state, PaintCare's message ran thousands of times on 19 public radio organizations in over 70 cities. Additionally, an accompanying digital banner advertisement was placed on KQED's website. The following script was used:

The website is easy to navigate and features content on buying the right amount of paint, storage and reuse tips, and recycling. It contains special pages for manufacturers, retailers, contractors, waste facilities, products covered by the program, and the California program. PaintCare’s website is updated throughout the year. The most frequently visited part of the website is the PaintCare site locator.

E. Awareness Survey

In October PaintCare ran its annual public awareness survey to measure the ongoing effectiveness of its outreach activities with the assistance of market research firm KB Insights. KB Insights analyzed the data to help PaintCare better understand trends and guide future outreach targeting.

Following are some highlights from the survey results:

- 562 surveys were completed by California residents, allowing 90% confidence in the accuracy of the measured results for the population within +/-3%.
- Over half of respondents (59%) purchased paint in the last year. Of those, 55% reported taking measurements in order to purchase the right amount of paint and 46% reported seeking help from paint retail staff to purchase the right amount.
- 89% of respondents said they were “extremely likely” or “likely” to drop off paint for recycling the next time they have leftover paint to dispose of.
- 56% of end-consumers who had purchased paint in the last year were aware that paint can be recycled, of available drop-off opportunities in the state, or both.

Section 18954. Annual Report Compliance Criteria.

(a) The annual report must contain the following:

(7) Audits. The annual report shall include an independent financial audit of the California Architectural Paint Recovery Program funded from the paint stewardship assessment. The audit shall be conducted in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, and standards set forth in Government Auditing Standards issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. The financial audit submitted to the department shall be prepared by an Independent Certified Public Accountant (CPA). The CPA shall not perform non-audit services for the manufacturer or stewardship organization that would impair independence as defined in the Government Auditing Standards issued by the Comptroller General of the United States (e.g., accounting services, development of internal controls, management decisions). The independent financial audit shall include:

- (A) California Architectural Paint Recovery Program financial statements, as required by GAAP.
- (B) An opinion on the manufacturer or stewardship organization's compliance with the financial aspects of PRC §48700 and Title 14, Division 7, Chapter 11, Article 2 of the California Code of Regulations.
- (C) Findings and recommendations as they relate to the financial aspects of the Architectural Paint Recovery Program.
- (D) Management Letter, if issued, by the manufacturer or stewardship organization's CPA.

Audit

An independent financial audit was conducted of the California PaintCare program by Rogers & Company PLLC. This independent CPA firm conducted the audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that the firm plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatements. The audit process includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. In Rogers & Company's opinion, the financial

statements of the California PaintCare program present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position as of June 30, 2023, and the changes in its net assets and its cash flows for the year then ended in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

The independent financial audit report of the California PaintCare program is in the appendix and addresses all requirements of Title 14, Section 18954(a)(7) of the California Code of Regulations as listed above.

Notes to Financial Statements

PaintCare Inc. California Architectural Paint Recovery Program - June 30, 2023

1. Nature of Operations

The California Architectural Paint Recovery Program (“the Program”) is authorized by Public Resources Code Section 48700 to implement measures to require paint manufacturers to develop and implement a program to collect, transport, and process postconsumer paint to reduce the costs and environmental impacts of the disposal of postconsumer paint in California. The Program is administered by PaintCare Inc. (“PaintCare”).

PaintCare, a not-for-profit 501(c)(3) organization, was created in October 2009 by the American Coatings Association (ACA), who, working with state and local government stakeholders, passed the first ever paint product stewardship law in the United States in the state of Oregon in 2009. The paint stewardship legislation guides an industry-led, end-of-life management program for post-consumer paint, which PaintCare operates. The PaintCare Board is made up of architectural paint manufacturers and participation in PaintCare is not limited to ACA members, but open to all architectural paint manufacturers. There are no dues or registration fees associated with PaintCare.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting and Presentation

The Program’s financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting. Net assets without donor restrictions represent funds that are not subject to donor-imposed stipulations and are available for support of the Program’s operations. There were no assets with donor restrictions as of June 30, 2023.

Accounts Receivable

Accounts receivable are recorded at net realizable value and represent amounts due for post-consumer paint recovery fees. The Program provides an allowance for bad debts using the allowance method, which is based on management’s judgment considering historical information. Accounts are individually analyzed for collectability, and will be reserved based on individual evaluation and specific circumstances. When all collection efforts have been exhausted, the accounts are written-off against the related allowance. At June 30, 2023, an allowance of \$20,041 was recognized.

Accounts Receivable (continued)

As discussed in the subsequent event section of this footnote, the Program entered into a settlement agreement with a manufacturer to convert accounts receivable to a structure note receivable. Management of the Program expects full collectability on these receivables. Refer to the subsequent event disclosure for more information.

Investment Allocation

PaintCare invests a portion of its accumulated surplus in a portfolio with Bank of America/Merrill Lynch. The sole objective of the portfolio is to earn a return equal to the rate of inflation and thus preserve the purchasing power of its capital. Interest, dividends, changes in market value, and other investment activities are allocated to each state program based on the relative net asset balances of each state program. Oversight of the investments is provided by the PaintCare Budget and Finance Committee and by the PaintCare Board of Directors.

Revenue Recognition

The Program recognizes revenue from post-consumer paint recovery fees at the time the architectural paint product is sold by a manufacturer participant of the paint product stewardship program. Manufacturer participants in the Program pay the PaintCare recovery fee to PaintCare based on the amount of program products they sell on a monthly basis.

Program participants report their monthly unit sales of paint through a secure, HTTPS online system using their unique user ID and password. The participant must pay a paint recovery fee per unit sold, based on container size, according to the established fee schedule. As the PaintCare recovery fee is added to the wholesale price of paint and passed through uniformly to the retail purchase price of paint—so that the manufacturer, distributor, and/or retailer is made whole—in some cases, distributors or retailers have elected to undertake the obligation of the manufacturer for these fees. Thus, PaintCare has allowed remitter agreements in the Program, whereby a distributor or retailer reports and remits directly to PaintCare on behalf of a participant manufacturer's brand or brands. Reports and payment are due by the end of the month following the reporting period.

Functional Allocation of Expenses

The costs of providing the various program and supporting activities have been summarized on a functional basis in the accompanying financial statements. The statement of functional expenses presents the natural classification detail of expenses by function. Accordingly, certain costs have been allocated among the programs and supporting services benefited.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Subsequent Events

In preparing these financial statements, the Program has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure through September 29, 2023, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Effective September 20, 2023, PaintCare entered into a settlement agreement with a manufacturer who participates in the post-consumer paint recovery program. PaintCare and the manufacturer agreed to convert \$2,041,552 of outstanding paint recovery fees due to the Program as of June 30, 2023 to a structured note receivable. The terms of the note require the manufacturer to make 36 monthly payments of principal and interest commencing on October 1, 2023, with two additional payments of principal only due on July 1, 2024 and July 1, 2025. The note bears an interest rate of 6.6% and accrues monthly on the outstanding balance.

3. Liquidity and Availability

At June 30, 2023, financial assets available for general expenditures, that is, without donor or other restrictions limiting their use, within one year of the statement of financial position date, consist of net accounts receivable totaling \$6,813,890. There are additional liquid assets available to the Program that are the liquid assets of PaintCare as a whole. PaintCare strives to maintain liquid financial assets sufficient to cover 90 days of general expenditures for the Program. Financial assets in excess of daily cash requirements are handled and invested in money market funds and highly liquid securities by PaintCare.

4. Related Party Transactions

ACA, a related party, is a separate, 501(c)(6) nonprofit organization working to advance the needs of the paint and coatings industry and the professionals who work in it. ACA

serves its members as an advocate on legislative, regulatory, and judicial issues at the federal, state, and local levels. ACA also provides members with such services as research and technical information, statistical management information, legal guidance, and community service project support, and acts as a forum for the exchange of information and ideas among the industry and its business partners. ACA incorporated PaintCare for the sole purpose of implementing programs for post-consumer architectural paint, including the recovery program pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 48700. ACA maintains a controlling interest in PaintCare through the ability to appoint its Board of Directors.

In February 2011, ACA and PaintCare entered into an affiliation agreement whereby ACA charges PaintCare an administrative fee, annually, to cover the following expense categories: allocation of time incurred by PaintCare officers, allocation of other direct labor, and allocation of occupancy and infrastructure costs. The term of the agreement is for one year and automatically renews for one-year terms unless canceled by either party.

For the year ended June 30, 2023, total administrative fees charged by ACA to PaintCare were \$3,677,562, and of this amount, \$1,607,094 related to the Program. At June 30, 2023, PaintCare owed the Program \$40,169,655 related to paint recovery fees and \$10,899,813 related to investment allocation that are being held on behalf of the Program and are included in the accompanying statement of financial position.

5. Methods Used for Allocation of Expenses from Management & General Activities

The financial statements report certain categories of expenses using the direct allocation method. Each expense is assigned to a functional category based on direct usage.

6. Income Taxes

The Program itself is not subject to income taxes. The steward of the Program, PaintCare, is recognized as a tax-exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, and is exempt from income taxes except for taxes on unrelated business activities.

We have audited, in accordance with the auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in Government Auditing Standards issued by the Comptroller General of the United States, the financial statements of PaintCare Inc. (“PaintCare”) California Architectural Paint Recovery Program (“the Program”), which comprise the statement of financial position as of June 30, 2023; the related statements of activities, functional expenses, and cash flows for the year then ended; and the related notes to the financial statements; and have issued our report thereon dated September 29, 2023.

Report on Internal Control over Financial Reporting

In planning and performing our audit of the financial statements, we considered PaintCare’s internal control over financial reporting (“internal control”) over the Program as a basis for designing audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of PaintCare’s internal control over the Program. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of PaintCare’s internal control over the Program.

A deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, misstatements, on a timely basis. A material weakness is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control, such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the entity’s financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected, on a timely basis. A significant deficiency is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control that is less severe than a material weakness, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies. Given these limitations, during our audit we did not identify any deficiencies in internal control that we consider to be material weaknesses. However, material weaknesses or significant deficiencies may exist that were not identified.

Report on Compliance and Other Matters

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether the Program's financial statements are free from material misstatement, we performed tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements, noncompliance with which could have a direct and material effect on the financial statements. However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions was not an objective of our audit, and accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. The results of our tests disclosed no instances of noncompliance or other matters that are required to be reported under Government Auditing Standards.

Purpose of this Report

The purpose of this report is solely to describe the scope of our testing of internal control and compliance and the results of that testing, and not to provide an opinion on the effectiveness of the organization's internal control or on compliance. How do paint stewardship laws affect painting contractors?

PaintCare
 PaintCare is a nonprofit organization established by the American Coatings Association to implement manufacturer-led paint stewardship programs in states that pass paint stewardship laws. PaintCare currently operates programs in California, Colorado, Connecticut, District of Columbia, Maine, Minnesota, New York, Oregon, Rhode Island, Vermont, and Washington.

Paint Drop-Off Sites
 The primary requirement of paint stewardship laws is for paint manufacturers to set up paint drop-off sites at retailers and other locations where households and businesses can take postconsumer (leftover) architectural paint, free of charge. Most drop-off sites are paint and hardware stores; others are waste transfer stations, recycling centers, landfills, and household hazardous waste (HHW) facilities. Participation as a drop-off site is voluntary. There are more than 2,400 drop-off sites across all PaintCare programs. To find a drop-off location, visit paintcare.org/drop-off-sites.

Fee and Funding
 As required by laws in PaintCare jurisdictions, the program is funded by a fee (known as the PaintCare fee) that must be added by manufacturers to the wholesale price of all architectural paint sold in the state, including paint sold in stores and online. This fee is paid by manufacturers to PaintCare to fund program operations including paint collection and recycling, consumer education, and program administration. Displaying the fee on receipts is optional for retailers; however, PaintCare encourages retailers to show the fee to inform consumers about the program. (See reverse for complete listing of fees by state.)

Recommendations for Contractors
Preparing Estimates
 When preparing bids, contractors should take the PaintCare fee into account by checking with suppliers to make sure their quotes for paint products include the fee.

Pass Fee to Customers
 PaintCare suggests that painting contractors pass on the fee to customers in order to recoup the fee they pay. Tell customers that quotes include the PaintCare fee and that the fee funds a statewide paint recycling program.

Convenient Paint Drop-Off Sites
 With paint drop-off sites conveniently located throughout PaintCare states, anyone can drop off their leftover paint year-round. Many contractors report clearing out their storage spaces and no longer stockpiling paint. Contractors now have an answer for customers who ask what to do with old paint they no longer want; they can recommend that they use PaintCare drop-off sites too. Most drop-off sites take 5 gallons per customer per trip, though some take more. All retail drop-off sites take paint from businesses, although some transfer stations and household hazardous waste programs only serve households. Always call a drop-off site ahead of visiting to make sure they have space for your volume and to confirm they take paint from businesses.

Pickup Service for Large Volumes
 Painting contractors with at least 100 gallons of leftover paint to recycle may qualify to have their paint picked up by PaintCare for free. To learn more about this service or to request an appointment, visit www.paintcare.org/pickup or call (855) PAINT09.

Business Limits
 To use the PaintCare program for oil-based paint, a business must qualify as an exempt generator under federal and any analogous state hazardous waste generator rules. If your business does not qualify as an exempt generator, it will not be able to use the program for oil-based paint, but it can still use the program for latex products. (Non-exempt generators may use the pickup service in New York. Contact PaintCare for details.)

PaintCare currently operates programs in California, Colorado, Connecticut, District of Columbia, Maine, Minnesota, New York, Oregon, Rhode Island, Vermont, and Washington.

Paint Drop-Off Sites

The primary requirement of paint stewardship laws is for paint manufacturers to set up paint drop-off sites at retailers and other locations where households and businesses can take postconsumer (leftover) architectural paint, free of charge. Most drop-off sites are paint and hardware stores; others are waste transfer stations, recycling centers, landfills, and household hazardous waste (HHW) facilities. Participation as a drop-off site is voluntary. There are more than 2,400 drop-off sites across all PaintCare programs. To find a drop-off location, visit paintcare.org/drop-off-sites.

Fee and Funding

As required by laws in PaintCare jurisdictions, the program is funded by a fee (known as the PaintCare fee) that must be added by manufacturers to the wholesale price of all architectural paint sold in the state, including paint sold in stores and online. This fee is paid by manufacturers to PaintCare to fund program operations including paint collection and recycling, consumer education, and program administration. Displaying the fee on receipts is optional for retailers; however, PaintCare encourages retailers to show the fee to inform consumers about the program.

Recommendations for Contractors

Preparing Estimates

When estimating jobs, contractors should take the PaintCare fee into account by checking with suppliers to make sure their quotes for paint products include the fee.

Pass Fee to Customers

PaintCare suggests that painting contractors pass on the fee to customers in order to recoup the fee they pay. Tell customers that quotes include the PaintCare fee and that the fee funds a statewide paint recycling program.

Convenient Paint Drop-Off Sites

With paint drop-off sites conveniently located throughout PaintCare states, anyone can drop off their leftover paint year-round. Many contractors report clearing out their storage spaces and no longer stockpiling paint. Contractors now have an answer for customers who ask what to do with old paint they no longer want; they can recommend that they use PaintCare drop-off sites too.

Most drop-off sites take 5 gallons per customer per trip, though some take more. All retail drop-off sites take paint from businesses, although some transfer stations and household hazardous waste programs only serve households. Always call a drop-off site ahead of visiting to make sure they have space for your volume and to confirm they take paint from businesses.

Pickup Service for Large Volumes

Painting contractors, property managers, and others with at least 100 gallons of leftover paint to recycle may qualify to have their paint picked up by PaintCare for free. To learn

more about this service or to request an appointment, visit www.paintcare.org/pickupor call (855) PAINT09.

Business Limits

To use the PaintCare program for oil-based paint, a business must qualify as an exempt generator under federal and any analogous state hazardous waste generator rules. Please visit www.paintcare.org/VSQG for more information on exempt generator rules. If your business does not qualify as an exempt generator, it will not be able to use the program for oil-based paint, but it can still use the program for latex products. (Non-exempt generators will be able to use the program under development in New York. Contact PaintCare for details.)

Large Volume Pickup (LVP) Service

Updated — May 2022

PaintCare offers a free pickup service to painting contractors, property managers, and others with large amounts of leftover architectural paint.

Who Is PaintCare?

PaintCare is a nonprofit organization established by the American Coatings Association to operate paint stewardship programs on behalf of paint manufacturers in states that pass paint stewardship laws.

In states with a paint stewardship program (see www.paintcare.org/states), PaintCare's primary effort is to set up conveniently located drop-off sites—places where households and businesses may take their unwanted paint for no charge. Sites set their own limits on the volume of paint they accept from customers per visit, usually from 5 to 20 gallons. To find a drop-off site near you, please use PaintCare's site locator at www.paintcare.org or call (855) PAINT09.

Large Volume Pickups

In states here PaintCare operates a paint stewardship program, those who have accumulated a large volume of paint may be eligible for PaintCare's large volume pickup service (LVP). Large volume means 100 or more gallons, measured by container size, not liquid volume. On a case-by-case basis, PaintCare may approve a pickup for less than 100 gallons. After two or three pickups, you may be switched to a repeat pickup service (see next page).

Drums and Bulked Paint Are Not Accepted

PaintCare only accepts paint in containers that are 5 gallons or smaller in size. Leave paint in original cans with original labels; do not combine or bulk paint from small cans into larger ones. If you have unwanted paint in drums or containers larger than 5 gallons, please contact a paint recycling company or a hazardous waste transportation company to assist you.

HOW TO REQUEST A LARGE VOLUME PICKUP

1. Sort and count your paint

Tally the number of each container size and the type of products you have, sorted into two categories: (1) water-based paints and stains, and (2) oil-based paint and stains and any other program products (sealers and clear top-coat products, such as varnish and shellac).

2. Fill out the LVP Request Form

Fill out the Large Volume Pickup Request Form on our website at www.paintcare.org/pickup. Call PaintCare at (855) PAINT09 if you have any difficulty using the web form.

Scheduling

After reviewing your form, PaintCare staff will either approve your site for a pickup or inform you of the best place to take your paint if you do not meet the requirements. If approved, you will be put in contact with our licensed hauler to schedule a pickup. It may be several weeks before your pickup occurs.

On the Day of Your Pickup

Sort your products into the two categories as noted above and store them in an area that has easy access for the transporter. If the paint is far from where the transporter parks, the path between should be at least four feet wide to accommodate movement of the paint collection bins.

The transporter is responsible for packing the paint into the bins. Once your paint is properly packed and loaded onto the transporter's truck, you will sign a shipping document and receive a copy for your records. Your paint will then be taken to a state authorized processing facility for recycling.

Recurring Service for LVPs

For businesses that generate large volumes of unwanted paint on a regular basis, a service for recurring direct pickups is available. With this service, you will be provided with reusable collection bins and can request a pickup when at least three bins are filled. Your full bins will be swapped with empty bins each time a pickup occurs. You will be required to sign a contract with PaintCare, and PaintCare will provide onsite training on how to properly pack the paint.

Business Limits

To use the PaintCare program for oil-based paint, a business must qualify as an exempt generator under federal and any analogous state hazardous waste generator rules. Please visit www.paintcare.org/VSQG for more information on exempt generator rules. If your business does not qualify as an exempt generator, it will not be able to use the program for oil-based paint, but it can still use the program for latex products. (Non-exempt generators may use the pickup service in New York. Contact PaintCare for details.)

Retailer Guidelines Section 1. Training and Safety

Training

For the safety of the program and your staff, all employees handling PaintCare products must receive training in product identification, acceptance, handling, packaging, inspection, and emergency response procedures before collecting PaintCare products or engaging in any PaintCare program activities.

Training helps ensure that employees conduct PaintCare products collection activities in a safe manner that protects workers and the environment.

Ensure that drop-off site employees are equipped for and understand hazards associated with PaintCare products.

Maintain training plans and records for each employee. Record staff training using the form included in the PaintCare training binder.

Safety

Store personal protective equipment (PPE) and spill response equipment in an accessible location adjacent to the collection bins. Ensure those materials are protected from the weather.

The drop-off site must be equipped with appropriate emergency response equipment including a fire extinguisher, spill kit and PPE. Monthly inspections of equipment are recommended.

PaintCare products collection activities need to follow general safety practices including proper lifting techniques.

Post emergency procedures and emergency contact numbers including police, fire department and emergency services by a phone — in close proximity to the drop-off site area, if possible.

If applicable, develop and maintain an emergency action plan as required by OSHA.

If required by federal, state or local law, familiarize police, fire departments, and emergency response teams with the layout of your facility, properties of PaintCare product(s) handled at your facility, and evacuation routes.

For your convenience, a form for recording emergency contacts is included in the PaintCare binder.

Retailer Guidelines Section 2. General Guidelines

PaintCare Provides Your Site

- Operations binder with recordkeeping forms/logs
- Signage identifying your site as a PaintCare drop-off site
- Educational print materials for the public

PaintCare's Hauler Provides Your Site

- Paint collection bins

General Guidelines for Drop-Off Sites

Each PaintCare drop-off site has unique logistical and operational considerations. Each drop-off site must make its own decisions and use its best judgment to operate in the safest manner possible in accordance with applicable law. To ensure the highest standards of safety for you and your staff, drop-off sites must:

- Have appropriate signage that informs the public of the hours of operation

- Accept PaintCare products from participants during your regular advertised or posted operating hours
- Display PaintCare signage to identify you as a drop-off site – signage should be posted in a highly visible area, at the entrance of your site
- Assist and supervise participant when they come to drop off PaintCare products. Drop-off site staff should greet participants and must verify eligibility of the participant and their leftover paint products as PaintCare products (see Section 5 for a description of PaintCare products)
- **IMPORTANT:** Never allow a participant to open a PaintCare product container
- Have adequate space, staffing, and training to collect and store PaintCare products
- Provide a secure space for empty and full collection bins
- Except for PaintCare products that you choose to manage on-site (e.g., via direct reuse), place all PaintCare products immediately in collection bins approved for use by PaintCare and provided by its contractors
- Pack only PaintCare products into collection bins
- Schedule shipments of PaintCare products from your drop-off site
- Maintain all records relating to the program (see Section 9)
- Train staff to be familiar with the requirements and practices of this guide
- Follow state-specific guidelines (located in this binder, following the cover page)

Retailer Guidelines Section 3. Collection Bins and Storage Area

Storage Area and Collection Bin Placement

Establish a dedicated storage area for collection bins and PaintCare products.

Place collection bins on an impermeable surface (e.g., sealed wood floor) at all times.

Place collection bins away from ignition sources, storm drains and floor drains.

Ensure there is adequate ventilation if stored indoors.

Protect collection bins from precipitation and temperature extremes. If stored outdoors, keep collection bins under cover (to prevent exposure to precipitation) and move indoors at times to protect against temperature extremes. If you store collection bins outdoors, you may need approval from your local fire or hazardous materials oversight agency.

Comply with any local fire codes or other regulations that might pertain to your storage of collection bins at your site.

Maintain enough space around collection bins to inspect for leakage and emergency access.

Use good housekeeping standards; keep paint storage areas clean and orderly.

Setting Up, Packing and Maintaining Collection Bins

Collection bins must be set up, used, and closed according to the manufacturer's closure instructions. PaintCare's haulers should set up the collection bins that they provide, unless otherwise requested by the drop-off site staff.

Ensure cardboard bins have liners. The liners provide secondary containment to contain liquids in the event a can leaks while in storage or transit. Reusable plastic bins that are leak-proof by design don't need liners. PaintCare's haulers are responsible for including secondary containment with all collection bins they provide to the drop-off site staff.

Collection bins must be structurally sound. If you see any evidence of damage that may cause a leak or spill, notify PaintCare immediately.

Mark the collection bin with the date the first PaintCare product is placed in it.

Place paint containers in bins immediately. Keep collection bins closed except when adding PaintCare products.

Pack 5-gallon buckets on the bottom layer of the collection bins for stability.

Pack all PaintCare products (cans, buckets) upright and as tight as possible in the collection bins to protect contents from shifting and leaking in transit.

Do not open containers to verify product.

Do not overfill collection bins; allow enough space for a lid to fit securely.

Do not take PaintCare product out of the bin.

Security

The drop-off site and collection bin storage area must be secured and locked when closed or not attended.

Only drop-off site staff should have access to the collection bins and storage area until the collection bins are ready for pick-up by PaintCare's hauler. Never allow "self-serve," public access to the collection bins.

Retailer Guidelines Section 4. Accepting PaintCare Products

What are PaintCare Products

PaintCare drop-off sites should accept only PaintCare products (architectural paint products) for management under the PaintCare program.

Listed below are the primary examples of architectural paint products accepted by the PaintCare program and paint or paint-related products not accepted by the PaintCare program.

Generally, PaintCare products include latex and oil-based house paint, stains, and clear coatings (varnish, shellac, etc.). The program excludes anything that is:

- in an aerosol spray can
- intended and labeled “for industrial use only”
- mostly used in the manufacture of equipment
- on the list of specifically excluded products for some other reason

PaintCare products are classified as either latex (water-based) or oil-based (alkyd) and the classification is important in order to decide how the product should be handled and processed. Knowing how to tell the difference between latex and oil-based products is also important in determining which types of businesses/organizations can use the PaintCare program (if your site accepts paint from this audience).

PaintCare Products and Non-PaintCare Products

Acceptable products (PaintCare products)

- Interior and exterior paints: latex, acrylic, water-based, alkyd, oil-based, enamel (including textured coatings)
- Deck coatings and floor paints (including elastomeric)
- Primers, sealers, undercoaters
- Stains
- Shellacs, lacquers, varnishes, urethanes (single component)
- Waterproofing concrete/masonry/wood sealers and repellents (not tar or bitumen-based)
- Metal coatings, rust preventatives
- Field and lawn paints

Unacceptable products (Non-PaintCare products)

- Paint thinner, mineral spirits, solvents
- Aerosol paints (spray cans)
- Auto and marine paints
- Art and craft paints
- Caulking compounds, epoxies, glues, adhesives
- Paint additives, colorants, tints, resins
- Wood preservatives (containing pesticides)
- Roof patch and repair
- Asphalt, tar, and bitumen-based products
- 2-component coatings
- Deck cleaners
- Traffic and road marking paints
- Industrial Maintenance (IM) coatings
- Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEM) (shop application) paints and finishes

If non-PaintCare Products end up in a drop-off site's bin, such products will not be returned to the drop-off site and will be managed by PaintCare's hauler. Haulers identify Non-PaintCare Products and report all instances to PaintCare. PaintCare staff will notify the site of any contamination in the bins. If the problem persists, additional training may be provided.

Who Can Drop Off PaintCare Products

The program accepts PaintCare products from the following:

Households. Households may drop off any volume of PaintCare product, subject to the volume limit set by the site.

Businesses/Organizations. Non-households may also drop off any volume of latex PaintCare product, subject to the volume limit set by the site. Non-households may only drop off oil-based PaintCare products if they comply with federal and state hazardous waste generator rules that, among other criteria, require that the business/organization (1) generates no more than 100 kilograms (about 25 gallons or 220 pounds) of hazardous waste per calendar month, and (2) does not accumulate more than 1,000 kg of hazardous waste at any time. Painting contractors and commercial property owners typically meet these criteria. For more information about these criteria, please see:

How to Know If a Business/Organization Qualifies

Each business or organization is responsible for determining its own generator status under applicable law.

When a business/organization has oil-based PaintCare product to drop off at your site, it must sign the Paint Drop-Off Log included in this binder to verify that it qualifies to use the program for oil-based paint. The log includes an explanation of the requirements. (If a business/organization has only latex paint, it does not need to sign the log.)

Once a business/organization signs the Paint Drop-Off Log, you may accept oil-based paint from that business/organization to the extent permissible under applicable law. Paint Drop-Off Logs may be reviewed by PaintCare or government agencies and compared with a list of registered hazardous waste generators to verify that only qualified businesses/organizations are using the program for their oil-based paint.

Acceptable Containers vs. Unacceptable Containers

Before accepting products from participants for management under the PaintCare program, drop-off site staff must (1) check the condition of the container for acceptance in the program, and (2) check the product label to verify that it contains a PaintCare product.

Acceptable

- The PaintCare product must be in its original container*
- The container is labeled as containing one of the designated PaintCare products listed below*
- The container must be in good condition and not leaking*
- The container must be 5 gallons in size or smaller
- The container contains dry latex paint

Not Acceptable

- The container is not original (e.g., paint was transferred into a jar)*
- The container does not have an original label (Drop-off sites permitted to accept household hazardous waste may accept unlabeled and leaking containers by following the procedures described below.)
- The container is leaking or has no lid*
- The container is larger than 5 gallons
- The container is empty

Unlabeled and Leaking Containers

A drop-off site permitted to accept household hazardous waste may, at its discretion, choose to accept unlabeled and/or leaking containers if it follows the protocols below and otherwise complies with all applicable laws:

Unlabeled Containers: A drop-off site may accept containers that do not have an original label if a staff person appropriately trained in identifying unknown wastes (1) identifies the material in the container as a PaintCare product, and (2) applies a label identifying the contents to the container before placing it in a collection bin.

Leaking Containers: A drop-off site may accept a leaking container or a container with no lid if an appropriately trained drop-off site staff person (1) verifies that the container contains a PaintCare product, (2) places the contents of the leaking/open container into an appropriate substitute container (which can include bulking such PaintCare products into 55-gallon drums), and (3) applies an appropriate label to the substitute container.

Refusing an Unacceptable Product or Container

Do not accept non-PaintCare products from any participant unless they are accepted as part of normal site operations and are not placed in PaintCare collection bins. Do not accept into the PaintCare program any PaintCare products in unacceptable containers unless your site is permitted to manage household hazardous waste as described on the previous page.

When refusing a PaintCare product, drop-off site staff must explain why the PaintCare product cannot be accepted (e.g., material is not part of the program, cannot accept material from non-exempt generator). If you have a participant with products that your location cannot manage, refer the participant to their local hazardous waste disposal program, garbage hauler, environmental health agency, or public works department. Local contact information is provided following the cover page of the binder.

Retailer Guidelines Section 5. Limit per Participant

How to Handle Storage Limitations

While the PaintCare program intends to collect as much PaintCare product as possible, we recognize that your drop-off site may have storage limitations. PaintCare drop-off sites, in agreement with PaintCare, may limit the amount of PaintCare products they accept per participant.

If your collection bins are completely full, inform the participant that you are temporarily unable to accept PaintCare products and redirect them to the nearest alternative PaintCare drop-off site (refer to the site locator at www.paintcare.org or contact PaintCare hotline at 855-724-6809) or ask them to come back at a later date. Contact the PaintCare hauler immediately to have your collection bins picked up and replaced.

If you have a participant with a significant amount of PaintCare products that your location cannot manage, ask the participant to contact PaintCare directly for additional assistance. We may direct the participant to another PaintCare drop-off site that can manage the large load or offer a direct pickup.

Large Volume Pickups (LVP)

PaintCare offers a free pick-up service to painting contractors, property managers, households and others with a large volume of leftover PaintCare products. Typically, a minimum of 200 gallons (by container size) is required to qualify for the LVP service.

To refer a participant to the LVP service:

- Provide the participant an LVP fact sheet
- Ask the participant to request a pick-up using the online LVP form
- The LVP fact sheet and online form are available at www.paintcare.org (select the “Large Volume Pickup” button on the homepage)
- For additional questions, refer the participant to PaintCare for assistance

Retailer Guidelines Section 6. Working with Haulers

PaintCare contracts with haulers for the delivery of supplies, delivery of empty collection bins, and pick-up of full collection bins.

Scheduling the Hauler to Pick Up Collection Bins

When you anticipate your collection bins will be full within your site’s pick-up timeframe (generally 5 business days in urban areas, 10 business days in rural areas), call your hauler to schedule a pickup, or use their online order system if they have one. The name and contact information of your hauler is provided at the front of your training binder.

When establishing an appointment for pick-up, please indicate:

- Your site is a PaintCare drop-off site
- Name of drop-off site and address
- Your name
- Your phone number
- Number of full collection bins to be picked up
- Number of empty collection bins needed for replacement

Preparing Collection Bins for Pickup

On the scheduled pickup day, collection bins and your loading area must be readily accessible to the hauler for quick and efficient loading.

- Identify which bins are full and ready for pickup
- Make sure the path between your bins and the hauler's vehicle is clear and at least 4 feet wide to accommodate movement of bins

The hauler will bring the necessary shipping documents and labels for the collection bins. The hauler is responsible for labeling, loading and off-loading collection bins, and will provide a copy of the shipping documents to the drop-off site. Sign and keep a copy of the shipping documents for your records.

Retailer Guidelines Section 7. Spill Response

Spills

The information in this section will assist with spills from damaged or leaking program containers. It is important that all drop-off site staff understand corrective actions to minimize exposure to people and the environment.

Collection bins must be kept in a clean, accessible area. Clean up any spill or release of PaintCare product immediately and place spill residue in a sealed container, label it and place sealed container in a collection bin. Contact the hauler or PaintCare to replenish spill kit materials as needed.

Reporting

Report spills as required by law, summarized in the state-specific guidelines at the front of this binder. Contact PaintCare within 24 hours of making such a report.

Prominently post emergency contact numbers including police, fire department, and emergency services.

Spill Response Procedures

Always follow all applicable spill response procedures set forth in your operating permit or as otherwise required by applicable law.

If a spill is small enough to be managed by drop-off site staff, follow these steps:

- Isolate the area and restrict access to the spill
- Ensure personal safety, put on protective gear (glasses and gloves) provided in the spill kit
- Stop the movement of paint by placing the leaking container upright or in a position where the least amount will spill, and place leaking container in plastic bags provided in spill kit, or into the spill kit container

- Contain the spill by placing absorbent pads or granular absorbent around and on the spill – if outdoors, place barriers around storm drains to prevent a release to the environment
- Collect the contaminated absorbent material and place it in plastic bag(s) or spill kit container, along with the leaking container and contaminated PPE, seal the bag(s) and place in the collection bin
- Remove any clothing that may be contaminated, wash thoroughly to remove spilled material from your hands or body
- Replace any used spill control supplies
- Document the date, location, and amount and type of material spilled

Retailer Guidelines Section 8. Inspections and Records

Inspections and Record Keeping

Drop-off site staff are responsible for regularly inspecting collection bins and spill kits to ensure that such materials are in proper working order, include any necessary labeling, etc. Please report any damaged materials or other problems to PaintCare immediately so PaintCare may arrange for prompt replacement or repair.

Maintain the following records for a minimum of 3 years:

- Internal and external inspection records
- Paint Drop-Off Logs (provided in PaintCare training binder)
- Direct Reuse and Reprocessed Paint Waivers (provided in PaintCare training binder)
- Employee training records (provided in PaintCare training binder) – discussed in Section 1
- Bills of lading and/or other documentation required by applicable law for outgoing shipments of PaintCare products

Retailer Guidelines Section 9. Direct Reuse and Paint Processing

Direct reuse is an additional service permitted for certain site types. These guidelines only apply to sites with a contract with PaintCare to engage in direct reuse. Paint retailers are not direct reuse sites.

Requirements for Direct Reuse

PaintCare encourages reuse of leftover paint through direct reuse (also known as a “paint exchange” or “swap shop”). Reuse sites return good quality unused paint to the local community at low or no cost.

When selecting products to place in the direct reuse area, products must be in their original container, have an original label, and be in good physical and aesthetic condition. Contents must be liquid and relatively new. The container must be closed securely before placing it in the reuse storage area. Containers must never be opened by participants at the drop-off site. Direct reuse products must be displayed by drop-off site staff in a storage area separate from the PaintCare collection bins.

Requirements for Paint Reprocessing

PaintCare also encourages on-site latex paint reprocessing. On average, 30-60% of latex paint brought to the site is reprocessed back into usable paint available for return to the community. Containers of reprocessed paint offered to the public at a drop-off site must not display any unauthorized third-party branding; generally new containers are used to pack reprocessed paint.

A household hazardous waste facility permitted to conduct paint reprocessing must have and follow its own procedures for sorting and reprocessing paint. At a minimum, these procedures will include:

- Open each container to visually inspect the contents
- Determine if the contents are latex, oil-based, or other paint
- Determine if the condition of the paint is suitable for recycling (e.g., not moldy, rusty, etc.)
- Sort containers according to type, quality, and color

For containers of products suitable for paint reprocessing:

- Bulk contents into larger container (e.g. drum) for mixing
- Mix paint until homogenous
- Repackage paint into 5-gallon or smaller containers
- Label as reprocessed paint

For containers of products unsuitable for reprocessing, either:

- Close container and pack in a collection bin (must be completely resealed and not leaking)
- Sort and bulk the contents into a drum

Participant Waiver

Participants taking paint from a drop-off site must sign the Direct Reuse and Reprocessed Paint Waiver log included in the training binder (or an approved equivalent thereof) explaining that the paint is taken “as-is” with no guarantee of quality or contents. The participant must read, complete, and sign the form and the staff must verify what has been taken by the participant. The staff must record on the log the volume taken by each participant and the total volume.

Appendix F. Awareness Survey

Awareness Survey

Introduction

In October 2022, PaintCare surveyed 548 individuals throughout California in order to measure consumer behavior, paint recycling awareness, and effectiveness of outreach activities. Surveys were conducted via web survey using a panel of respondents reflective of the demographic composition of California. The sample size provides 90% confidence in the accuracy of the measured results for the population within +/-3%.

The results were analyzed by KB Insights to help PaintCare better understand trends in the data and help guide future targeting. Data from all PaintCare state programs were included in the analysis, providing the additional benefit of comparing results between programs throughout the nation. The following report focuses only on California outcomes for FY2023.

FY2023 California results are presented below in four categories: behavioral outcomes, awareness outcomes, marketing outcomes, and recycling intentions.

A. Behavioral Outcomes

- Almost two thirds (60%) of California respondents purchased paint in the last year. Of those, about half (48%) reported seeking help from paint retail staff and more than half (57%) reported taking measurements themselves in order to purchase the right amount of paint and reduce the amount left over.
- Two thirds (66%) of respondents who knew that paint can be recycled said they had taken paint to be recycled in the past, a key performance index used to track recycling success.
- The percentages of people who store paint at their home/business vs. those who do not are also used as a barometer for recycling success. In FY2023, 79% of respondents said they were storing paint at home; 21% were not. Among those who were storing paint, the median amount stored was “less than a gallon.”

- About two thirds (68%) of stored paint is left over from jobs that consumers did themselves or that a contractor/painter left behind. 22% said they intentionally kept paint for future touch-ups.

- In FY2023, we saw some shifts in behavioral outcomes, most notably a reduction in pre-project measurements and store assistance.

- New in FY2023, we also analyzed the segment of end-consumer respondents who purchased in the last year. This analysis excludes professional painters and those who have not recently purchased paint so that we can more accurately examine consumer behavior. Note that this segment is represented by 329 respondents; thus, our margin of error at a 90% level of confidence is +/-4.5%.
- Among end consumers who purchased in the last year, we saw an increase in paint purchases in FY2023 and a decrease in store assistance. All other changes were statistically insignificant.
- Fewer respondents in this segment were storing paint at home than in the full respondent base. This infers that recent painters dispose leftover paint rather quickly compared to those who painted years ago.

B. Awareness Outcomes

- About half (48%) of respondents were aware of paint disposal opportunities in California, such as drop off locations at paint stores and hazardous waste facilities (new question in FY2023).
- 14% were aware of the availability of free on-site pickup services for those with 100+ gallons of leftover paint (new question in FY2023).
- Almost a third (30%) knew that paint could be recycled (disposed in such a way that it may be re-used). This question was placed after the new questions above in order to differentiate between knowledge of drop off/pick up opportunities and recycling.

- Of those who knew about paint recycling, 71% knew where to take it and 54% knew about the fee added to paint purchases to support future recycling.

Trend data is affected by the new awareness questions added or reworded in FY2023. We learned that there are some consumers who are aware of drop off/pick up opportunities but not recycling, and vice versa. Going forward, the new clarifying questions will enable PaintCare to more accurately differentiate customer understanding.

C. Marketing Outcomes

- 6% of all respondents said they had heard of PaintCare before completing the survey.
- 3% remembered a PaintCare advertisement.
- 4% had heard of PaintCare via other means, such as from a friend/relative/colleague, brochure/card at a paint retail store, sign/poster at a paint retail store, from a local hazardous waste center, received information in the mail, Facebook/social media, and/or online research.
- FY2023 results for each of the aforementioned marketing measures were dramatically lower than in FY2022 and much closer to the same measures in prior years. Further analysis showed that the percentage of professional painters was much higher in FY2022, creating an unusual increase in results due to their higher awareness levels. 35% of respondents said they had heard of PaintCare before completing the survey.

D. Recycling Intentions

- In order to contrast future recycling intentions to past behavior, questions were asked both about how consumers have disposed of paint in the past and what they intend to do in the future.
- Almost a third of respondents reported that they chose a sustainable option for paint disposal in the past, including: dropping it off at a paint retail store (7%) or HHW (18%), or giving it away to someone else who needs it (7%).
