<p><b>Tier 1 Commercial Edible Food Generators</b> are one of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>(A) Supermarket.</li><li>(B) Grocery store with a total facility size equal to or greater than 10,000 square feet.</li><li>(C) Food service provider.</li><li>(D) Food distributor.</li></ul>	<p><b>Tier 2 Commercial Edible Food Generators:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>(A) Restaurant with 250 or more seats, or a total facility size equal to or greater than 5,000 square feet.</li><li>(B) Hotel with an on-site food facility and 200 or more rooms.</li><li>(C) Health facility with an on-site food facility and 100 or more beds.</li><li>(D) Large venue/Event.</li><li>(F) A state agency with a cafeteria with 250 or more seats or a total cafeteria 36 facility size equal to or greater than 5,000 square feet.</li><li>(G) A local education agency with an on-site food facility.</li></ul>	<p><b>Food Recovery Organizations</b> include, but not limited to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>(A) Food bank as defined in Section 113783 of the Health and Safety Code;</li><li>(B) Nonprofit charitable organization as defined in Section 113841 of the Health and Safety code; and,</li><li>(C) Nonprofit charitable temporary food facility as defined in Section 113842 of the Health and Safety Code.</li></ul>
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
