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PMDP Three-Tier Payment Structure

- Beginning with the first quarter of 2024, payments will be calculated using the three-tier payment structure.
- Payment restructuring will incentivize participants who claim PET #1 or use PET #1 for new beverage containers.
- The \$47.0 million appropriation has been allocated as follows:
 - \$5.0 million 2023 third quarter (July 1, 2023 September 30, 2023) and fourth quarter (October 1, 2023 December 31, 2023) payments
 \$40.0 million tiered payment structure
 \$2.0 million reserve

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 Reclaimer Payment Tiers

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Manufacturer Payments Manufacturer PMD per-ton payments are based on the use of PET #1 to produce new beverage containers or other PET #1 products. To receive the maximum per-ton payment, manufacturers must use PET #1 to produce beverage containers that exceed the postconsumer recycled plastic minimum content standard specified in Public Resources Code (PRC) Section 14547 (Assembly Bill 793).

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

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Supporting Documentation

For Reclaimers:

- Copies of the invoices or other supporting documents from the certified entity to the plastic product manufacturer(s) must be submitted with claim forms and must include:
 - claim forms and must include:
 A description of the plastic material sold or transferred and the weight of the material sold or transferred.
 - The manufacturer's name and contact information
 - The identification number of each plastic product manufacturer
 - purchasing the empty plastic beverage container material for use in California manufacturing.

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Supporting Documentation, cont.

For Manufacturers:

Copies of the bill of sale(s) or invoice(s) indicating the weight of the plastic beverage container material purchased from a certified entity, or other supporting documents must be submitted with claim form.
The bill of sale or other supporting documents must include the name of the seller and the certification number.

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
