As required by SB-212, UltiMed, Inc. is submitting this 2022 Annual Report. This Annual Report covers 2022 activities and complies with our responsibilities required by California Law.

During 2022, UltiMed accomplished various activities to fully implement and comply with all elements of the stewardship plan. Given that 2022 was the first full year of the plan, these activities mainly focused on building awareness and providing education. Program highlights include achieving 100% accessibility for the covered products in this plan by pharmacies. Also, awareness activities generated 8000 page views on the dedicated website and serve as an indicator of success in education and awareness. Due to the fact that SB212 is the first state-wide legislation and regulations that includes home-generated sharps, the main challenge during the 2022 program year was working to have home-generated sharps included in conversations alongside pharmaceutical disposal given that safe disposal of pharmaceuticals has been an important topic and present for many years already. This challenge will change over time as awareness and adoption of programs for home-generated sharps increases.

The mail-back program is centered on the all-in-one product solution that provides a sharps waste container and mail-back materials included with the sharps dispensed to the ultimate user in a single kit. After using all the sharps, the ultimate user returns the used sharps utilizing the provided mail-back materials included in the kit. This product solution was made available through distribution to pharmacies and other retailers. In addition to the product solution, UltiMed put in place the processes for managing the program as described in the approved Stewardship Plan.

Additionally, as discussed with CalRecycle, UltiMed evaluated the options for stewardship plan coverage of UltiMed's full product portfolio. UltiMed made the decision to contract with The Foundation. Effective January 1, 2023, UltiMed's covered products are included in The Drug Takeback Solutions Foundation's Stewardship Plan for Home-Generated Sharps Waste. Therefore, the UltiMed stewardship plan was terminated and withdrawn for 2023 and beyond.

Ultimate users had the opportunity to acquire the UltiMed all-in-one sharps kit and dispose of the home-generated sharps waste utilizing the mail-back kit provided. The mail-back kit includes all materials needed to return the used sharps including a pre-paid postage label.

During the reporting period:

- Education and outreach for the 2022 Plan Year was focused first on Retailers and Distributors as detailed in the Stewardship Plan to provide information about the new legislation and the importance of safe sharps disposal. Multiple points of outreach including customer meetings, tradeshow, and advertising were implemented. 26 advertisements were run with over 650,000 impressions. There were 1,500 users and 8,000 page views on the disposemyneedles.com website which was the primary outreach for ultimate users in the Plan Year. The website was enabled with translation capabilities as shown in the attachment. For electronic examples of these activities, please see **Appendix A: Promotional Marketing Materials Examples**.
- There were no education and outreach activities to promote the disposal of a covered product in a manner inconsistent with the services offered to ultimate users as part of our stewardship plan.
- 104 pharmacy locations stocked the UltiMed mail-back kit.

Program Metrics:

- Program Usage Metric: Units returned through the USPS, divided by units distributed. Metric = .0005%.
- Accessibility Metric: Number of pharmacy locations that have access to the approved product, divided by the total number of pharmacy locations in the State of California. Metric=100%.
- Penetration Metric: Number of pharmacy locations that distribute the approved product, divided by the total pharmacy locations that have access to it. Metric = 1.1%.

The metrics achieved are within performance expectations for the first several months of a new program. It is noteworthy that 100% of pharmacies have access to the approved products covered by this stewardship plan. Education and outreach efforts require time and repetition to build awareness and adoption of new programs. It can be expected that the metrics will build to higher levels in future years as awareness of options for safe disposal of home generated sharps grows among ultimate users.

DID YOU KNOW?

Home-generated sharps disposal regulations have changed in California effective January 7th, 2022.

CALIFORNIA SENATE BILL 212

What is the requirement for home-generated sharps?

Requires providing or initiating distribution of a sharps waste container and mail-back materials at the point of sale.




Figure 3: Website Home Page (December 2022)
