Organics/Recycling CA AB 827, SB 1383, Ordinance 1428-22 2019, 2022

 Self-bussing food-service vendors must provide three color-coded bins, clearly labeled for food scraps (green), recyclables (blue), and garbage (black).

Self Hauling of Organics and Recycling CA SB 1383, Ordinance 1428-22

- Self-haulers shall source separate all recyclable materials and organic waste generated on site from solid waste.
- Self-haulers shall haul their source separated recyclable materials to a facility that recovers those materials and haul their source separated green container organic waste to a solid waste facility, operation, activity, or property that processes or recovers source separated organic waste. Alternatively, self-haulers may haul organic waste to a high diversion organic waste processing facility.
- Self-haulers that are commercial businesses shall keep a record of the amount of organic waste delivered to each solid waste facility, operation, activity, or property that processes or recovers organic waste; this record shall be subject to inspection by the City. The records shall include delivery receipts and weight tickets; cubic yards or tons transported by the generator to each entity.
- Self-haulers that are commercial businesses shall provide information collected to the City.

Edible Food Recovery for Tier I & II Markets/Distributors Wholesale CA SB 1383, Ordinance 1428-22

- Recover the maximum amount of surplus edible food to feed people.
- Keep a written agreement/contract with the local food recovery organizations/services that pick up or receive edible food from your business to be inspected by the city.
- Maintain records of type, frequency, and pounds of food recovered and donated each month to be reported to the City upon inspection.

Single-Use Food Accessories and Standard Condiments by Request Only CA AB 1276, 2022 & Ordinance No. 1389-19, 2021

- Full-service restaurants are prohibited from providing the following single-use items unless requested by customers:
- Plastic straws, utensils, and standard condiment packets.
- Straws provided must not be wrapped in plastic.

Single Use Bag Ban Ordinance No. 1284-12

- ◆ Charge \$.25 per bag provided to customers. Keep records of this charge. Businesses shall retain the \$.25 fees.
- Customers with EBT and WIC shall be exempt from the charge. Does not apply to produce or take out.
- Paper carryout bags provided to customers shall contain a minimum of 40% post-consumer recycled paper.
- Plastic bags must be thicker than 4 mls.
- Encourage reuse of bags.

Disposable Cup Fee Ordinance 1389-19, 2021 & AB 619

Businesses must follow these guidelines regarding disposable cups:

- Charge customers \$0.10 per single-use cup. Customers with EBT and WIC shall be exempt from the charge. Businesses shall retain the \$0.10 fees.
- Clearly identify fees pre and post-sale on any ordering platforms and receipts for customers.
- Businesses may accept the use of clean reusable containers.

BPI / Compostable Ordinance 1389-19, 2022

- ♦ All disposable take-out & dine-in food-service ware including cups, utensils, straws and containers must be compostable.
- Clearly labeled with the BPI compostable logo.

Foam Ban Ordinance No. 1389-19

 The sale and use of plastic foam (Styrofoam) products is prohibited including: food service ware, packaging, coolers, containers, boxes, packaging peanuts, pool or beach toys.
