





# What is Extended Producer Responsibility?



- An environmental policy approach that holds producers responsible for product management through the product's lifecycle
- Extended producer responsibility (EPR) supports recycling and materials management goals that contribute to a circular economy and can also encourage product design changes that minimize environmental impacts

#### **Not Prescriptive**

- Legislation sets parameters
- Allows flexibility for industry
- Industry determines cost-effective solutions to achieve performance standards



### **Textile Impacts**

- 85% of our clothes are landfilled
- 1 garbage truck of textiles are landfilled or burned every second
- 500,000 tons of plastic microfibers wind up in the ocean each year
- 700,000 microplastics shed from one laundry load of polyester clothes
- 8% of global climate pollution is linked to fashion (from sourcing to disposal)

# Responsible Textile Recovery Act of 2024

**SB 707 (Newman, Chapter 864, Statutes of 2024) added PRC sections 42984 – 42984.27** 

Requires producers to form a PRO to establish a statewide extended producer responsibility program for apparel and textiles that emphasizes repair and reuse, minimizes generation of hazardous waste, greenhouse gases, environmental, environmental justice, and public health impacts



#### **Producer**

- (1) Manufacturer and brand owner or licensee
- (2) If no person in the state is (1), then brand owner or exclusive licensee
- (3) If no person in the state is (1) or (2), then importer
- (4) If no person in the state is (1), (2), or (3), then distributor, retailer, or wholesaler
- (5) Covered product sale is deemed to occur in the state if delivered to consumer in the state
- (6) Any entity is allowed to assume duties of the "producer"

#### **Producer Does Not Include**

- Sellers of only secondhand covered products
- Sellers with less than \$1,000,000 in annual aggregate global turnover adjusted annually pursuant to the California Consumer Price Index for all Urban Consumers for all items, as determined by the Department of Industrial Relations

# **Producer Responsibility Organization**

"Producer responsibility organization" or "PRO" means an organization that is exempt from taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the federal Internal Revenue Code of 1986, is formed for the purpose of implementing a plan to meet the requirements of this chapter and is approved by the department



#### **Products Not Covered**

- x U.S. military personal protective equipment and clothing
- x Personal protective equipment to protect from hazards
- x Reusable personal hygiene products
- x Mattresses, electronic waste, carpet, and single-use products
- x Certain window coverings that are automated or adjusted with cords

Conducting needs assessments



Providing free & convenient collection



Collecting textiles and apparel







### **Online Marketplace Requirements**




- Annually notify CalRecycle and the PRO of all thirdparty sellers with sales of covered products over \$1,000,000 on their online marketplace in the prior year
- Annually provide third-party sellers with information provided by the PRO on the requirements of the law and how to join a PRO
- Monitor CalRecycle's website where compliant producers are posted and sell only compliant products



# Producer Responsibility Organization Application and Approval

Producers form one or more Producer Responsibility Organizations (PROs)

- January 2026: PRO governing board(s) apply to CalRecycle
- March 2026: CalRecycle approves one PRO
- July 2026: Producers join the approved PRO
- January 2035: CalRecycle may approve additional PROs



# **Needs Assessment: Purpose and Scope**

- PRO funds and administers the needs assessment with interested parties
- Informs the PRO plan and budget
- Evaluates actions and investments needed across the lifecycle of covered products including:
  - Repair, reuse, recycling, collection, sorting, and hauling
  - Consumer education and behavior
  - > End markets and market development
  - Avoiding recycling contamination
  - > Eco-modulated fee structure factors
  - Funding needs and incentive mechanisms

# Needs Assessment: Submission, Approval, and Updates

- March 1, 2027: PRO submits initial needs assessment to CalRecycle
- May 30, 2027: CalRecycle reviews and approves, conditionally approves, or disapproves



• Starting 2032: PRO(s) updates every 5 years or as necessary to ensure requirements are met

### **Producer Responsibility Plan Requirements**

- Eco-modulated fee to fully fund program
- Performance standards and metrics
- Convenient collection sites
- Sort, transport, process, reuse, and recycling process
- Education and outreach program
- Incentive payments, grants, and market development
- Minimize environmental and public health impacts
- Contingency plan

#### **Eco-modulated fees**

- PRO will charge participant producers an annual eco-modulated fee beginning upon plan approval
- Per unit fee that reflects:
  - Sales volume
  - Existing collection repair, reuse, and recycling programs
  - Cost of reusing, repairing, recycling, and managing specific covered products
- Incentivizes design choices that facilitate reuse, repair, and recycling
- Disincentivizes practices and materials incongruent with the plan

#### **Convenience Standards**

PRO must provide free and convenient collection system in each county, including providing 10 collection locations per county or 1 per 25,000 people, whichever is greater, except:

- 8 collection locations in counties with 50,001-100,000 residents
- 4 collection locations in counties with 18,001-50,000 residents
- 3 collection locations in counties with <18,000 residents</li>



# **PRO's Roles and Responsibilities**

- Apply to CalRecycle
- Prepare needs assessments
- Submit covered product lists
- Develop and fully implement plan
- Fully fund program
- Educate public
- Undergo annual financial audit
- Prepare and submit annual reports
- Achieve performance standards
- Keep records



### **CalRecycle Roles and Responsibilities**

- Approve a PRO
- Adopt regulations
- Guide and approve needs assessments
- Evaluate producer responsibility plans
- Post lists of compliant producers and brands
- Evaluate annual reports
- Receive annual online marketplace information
- Establish, review, and adjust performance standards
- Conduct audits and enforcement

March: CalRecycle approves PRO





#### **Rulemaking Process**

From Broad Strokes to Detailed Rules



Regulations are rules, orders, and standards that implement, interpret, and make specific the law.

The rulemaking process is the process by which a governmental agency develops regulations. Generally, the rulemaking process must follow the requirements of the Administrative Procedure Act (Government Code 11340-11361).




