

# Guidance for Submitting a Categorically Excluded Materials Notice For Food and Agricultural Packaging

(Under 14 CCR section 18980.2(a)(2))

Plastic Pollution Prevention and Packaging Producer Responsibility Act

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## Purpose of This Document

This document explains how to prepare and submit a **Categorically Excluded Materials Notice** specific to food and agricultural packaging through CalRecycle's online Packaging Extended Producer Responsibility System (PEPRS) portal. Entities can use the portal to submit written notices under 14 CCR section 18980.2(a)(2).

For purposes of this notice, "excluded" means that packaging or packaging components are excluded from the definition of "covered material" pursuant to the exclusion set forth in 14 CCR section 18980.2(a)(2).

This document is divided into three parts:

- **Part I** outlines what information is required in the notice form.
- **Part II** presents step-by-step guidance for each question.
- **Part III** provides next steps once the notice is submitted.

An example notice form is also attached to this document.

## Part I. Before You Begin: What You Must Include

Noticing entity (the entity that submits this form) will need information about:

- The packaging or packaging components claimed to qualify for an exclusion (if only certain components of packaging qualify for the exclusion, packaging must be identified on a component-by-component basis).
- The products associated with each component
- The requirements of federal food and agricultural regulations, rules, or guidelines and requirements of the Plastic Pollution Prevention and Packaging Producer Responsibility Act (Act) that are in conflict (i.e., requirements that cannot be complied with simultaneously)
- An explanation of how it is not reasonably possible to use an alternative that resolves the conflict

All supporting materials must be **clearly labeled and organized** to correspond with the form's questions.

### ***Note on Submissions for Multiple Packaging or Products***

Entities that may submit notices include individual companies with food and agricultural products or packaging products as well as industry associations representing multiple such companies.

Entities may submit one form for multiple packaging types and packaging components, provided the notice is sufficient to specifically identify the packaging or packaging components for which the exclusion is noticed. Such a notice may describe classes of products that use the packaging or packaging component and explain why the justification for the exclusion applies to all such products.

## Part II. How to Complete the Notice

The notice form will be submitted via the PEPRS online portal. The attached notice form is provided as an example. Follow the structure described in the following steps to complete the notice.

### **Step 1 — Get your PEPRS WebPass — Provide entity and contact information**

Noticing entity must follow the steps on the [Create a WebPass Account Webpage](#).

An activation email will be sent to your email address. Once you open the email, you need to click on the link to activate your WebPass. You may log back into your account to submit the notice form any time after activation of your WebPass.

On PEPRS landing page the 'Noticing entity' option needs to be selected to continue with the form.

After responding to the question on the pop-up screen, supply the following information

- Legal name of the submitting entity
- Contact information of the entity
- Contact person name, title, mailing address, and email

## **Step 2 — Identify each packaging or packaging component**

Specifically identify the packaging and packaging components claimed to qualify for the exclusion. Examples of packaging include containers, plastic bottles, pouches, plastic wrap or film, plastic cups or tubs, and molded fiber. Examples of packaging components include seals, liners, inserts, composite closures, lids, valves, caps, and fitments (spouts, pumps, sprayers).

The identification must include the packaging or packaging component's **function**, such as cross-contamination prevention, microbial barrier, oxygen protection, structural integrity, temperature or humidity control, storage, etc.

If a packaging system includes multiple parts (e.g., container + seal + cap), list each item separately.

## **Step 3 — Select if identified packaging and/or packaging components are food or agricultural commodity**

From the drop-down menu, select one of two options to identify if the packaging and/or packaging component are used for a food or agricultural commodity.

## **Step 4 — Describe the material of each component**

Provide a description of the packaging and packaging components to be excluded. The description must ensure that the notice clearly identifies the particular packaging or packaging components to be excluded from the definition of "covered material."

You may describe materials using material class, type, or form. You can review the [CalRecycle's Covered Material Categories Reporting Guidance](#), as reference, but descriptions do not need to follow a specific classification format.

## **Step 5 — Identify the products associated with each component**

Provide sufficient information for CalRecycle to match components to specific products or classes of products. Such information may include the following or may more generically describe a category of products (e.g. leafy greens, blueberries):

- Brand name

- SKU - Stock Keeping Unit
- UPC – Universal Product Code
- EAN – International Article Number
- GTIN – Global Trade Item Number

### **Step 6 — Identify the legal conflicts justifying the exclusion**

For each component, provide:

- The relevant requirements of the Act, or its implementing regulations, including the specific Public Resource Code sections or regulations sections containing the requirements.
- The food and agricultural requirements in federal regulations, rules, or guidelines that conflict with those provisions of the Act or implementing regulations.
- A brief description of the conflict if it is not obvious from the citation.

Examples may include federal food safety or packaging-sterility requirements.

Entities submitting a notice may reference guidance, best practices, and recommendations for the specific type, format, and material, or components of food or agricultural commodity packaging, issued by government agencies, industry associations, standards development organizations, or academic institutions, to support the identification of the conflict in Step 6, provided the underlying mandatory standard in the federal regulations, rules, or guidelines is also clearly identified.

### **Step 7 — Demonstrate that no reasonable alternative exists**

This demonstration must explain how the three conditions set forth in 14 CCR section 18980.2(a)(2)(B)(i) through (iii) regarding availability of alternatives were considered.

If necessary to demonstrate that use of such an alternative is not reasonably possible, upload any supporting documentation. (This may be necessary in the event the character limit in the provided text boxes is exceeded, or visuals need to be provided). Entities may reference guidance, best practices, and recommendations for the specific type, format, and material, or components of food or agricultural commodity packaging, issued by government agencies, industry associations, standards development organizations, or academic institutions, to support the demonstration that no reasonable alternative exists.

### **Step 8 — Upload any supporting documentation (if applicable)**

If demonstration requires any necessary supporting documentation, check the confirmation box after ensuring all supporting documents are included.

For any trade-secret claims pursuant to 14 CCR sections 18980.2(a)(G) and 18980.14(c), attach a document specifically identifying such information and providing the legal basis for the exemption.

- **Step 9 — Certify and submit**

To complete your notice:

- Check the certification statement affirming the information is true and correct
- Submit the form through the online PEPRS portal

## **Part III. What Happens After Submission**

CalRecycle will review the notice to confirm that:

- The notice is for a food or agricultural commodity
- All required elements have been provided: specific description of the packaging and packaging components to be excluded, associated products, identification of the laws that are in conflict, and explanation of the basis for determining that there is no reasonably possible alternative packaging or packaging components.
- Whether CalRecycle is aware of any unconsidered, feasible alternatives not considered in the notice that would avoid the legal conflict cited in the notice.

Once the submission is confirmed to be complete, CalRecycle will identify on its Plastic Pollution Prevention and Packaging Producer Responsibility webpage the packaging and packaging components and associated products identified in the notice and the date the notice was deemed complete.

A notice may, but is not required to, identify associated products by brand, universal product code, or other method. However, once a notice is deemed complete for a packaging or packaging component in association with a product or class of products, the exclusion applies without the need for each company or brand to notice the exclusion individually.

If CalRecycle determines that the notice is incomplete, CalRecycle will notify the noticing entity within 90 days of receipt of the notice form that the notice is incomplete and requires resubmission via PEPRS as required by 14 CCR 18980.2(a)(2)(A) and (B). After the resubmission, the resubmitted notice will be evaluated in the manner described previously in this document.

**Note:** At any time following a determination that a notice is complete, CalRecycle may request additional information to support the noticing entity's determination as described in 14 CCR section 18980.2(a)(E). The entity must provide the requested information

within 60 days via PEPRS. If the information is not submitted, or if CalRecycle finds it incomplete or insufficient, CalRecycle will notify the entity. The entity will then have 60 days to provide the missing or corrected information, again via PEPRS.

After reviewing the submitted information, CalRecycle will determine whether the packaging or packaging component qualifies for the exclusion. If CalRecycle determines that certain packaging or packaging components do not qualify for the exclusion, CalRecycle will provide notification to the noticing entity and CalRecycle will update the publicly available list on the website to show that the packaging or packaging components do not qualify for the exclusion. Those packaging or packaging components will be designated as covered material 180 days after the notification.

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*A notice will be deemed incomplete if it does not contain all the required elements or if CalRecycle identifies it requires resubmission as described in 14 CCR 18980.2(a)(2)(C).*

## **Requirements of this form:**

Use this form to submit exclusion notices under 14 CCR section 18980.2(a)(2). “Excluded” means that packaging or packaging components are excluded from the definition of “covered material” set forth in Public Resources Code section 42041(e).

Pursuant to 14 CCR section 18980.2(a)(2)(B), the notice must identify the specific provisions of the Act and the mandatory federal regulations, rules, or guidelines that are in conflict, specifically describe all packaging and packaging components to be excluded and the associated products, and demonstrate that it is not reasonably possible to use any alternative packaging or packaging components that would avoid the conflict.

The notice must explain the basis for claiming that the exclusion applies. The explanation must consider the following conditions for when use of such alternatives is not reasonably possible:

- (i) There is no such alternative that satisfies all applicable mandatory standards for safety and structural integrity of packaging, creates no new unavoidable legal conflict with any law, and otherwise is lawful to use in California
- (ii) It is not possible to avoid all legal conflicts by eliminating or replacing the components that cause the conflict cited in the notice; and

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(iii) It is not possible to avoid all legal conflicts by redesigning or replacing the packaging as a whole.

The notice may refer to and attach non-mandatory guidelines, guidance, best practices, and recommendations for the specific type, format, material, or components of food and agricultural commodity packaging, issued by government agencies, industry associations, standards development organizations, or academic institutions. Such documents may demonstrate that the packaging or packaging component meets a mandatory federal standard. They may also show whether agencies, industry, standards development organizations, or academic institutions have identified any alternatives that meet that federal standard.

If, upon reviewing the explanation, CalRecycle identifies packaging or packaging components that the notice did not address but that would avoid the cited conflict, CalRecycle will deem the notice incomplete. A notice addressing the packaging identified by CalRecycle (i.e., explaining why use of such packaging cannot serve as an alternative) may then be submitted.
