

Packaging Extended Producer Responsibility System (PEPRS)

Guidance on Registration and Application Submittals

Plastic Pollution Prevention and Packaging Producer Responsibility Act

May 19, 2026

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Guidance Document Purpose

The following actions must be taken by producers to comply with the requirements under [14 CCR section 18980.5](#):

- If participating in the approved producer responsibility organization (PRO) plan, register with Circular Action Alliance (CAA) and submit supply data to CAA.
- If complying individually, register with CalRecycle and apply to be an independent producer.
- If qualifying for an exemption for small producer, register with CalRecycle and apply for the small producer exemption.

This document explains how to register and submit an application in the Packaging Extended Producer Responsibility System (PEPRS)¹. If a producer prefers to comply individually and submit an independent producer application or qualifies for the small producer exemption, an authorized representative will need to:

¹ Producers that selected CAA as their 'reporting entity', or selected CAA to register on their behalf, do not need to register separately in PEPRS.

1. **Create** a [WebPass Account](#) using an individual email address.
 - If your email changes, a new WebPass account will be required.
2. **Activate your WebPass** by following the instructions in the confirmation email.
3. **Log in to [PEPRS](#)** with your WebPass credentials.
4. **Complete your registration information in [PEPRS](#).**
5. **Submit an application, and/or update information in [PEPRS](#).**

Step 1 — Create and Activate a CalRecycle WebPass

All online portals under CalRecycle’s management require a WebPass. Producers must follow the steps on the [Create a WebPass Account](#) webpage.

After submitting information on the WebPass webpage, an activation email will be sent to your email address. Click the link in the email to activate the WebPass. You may log in to PEPRS any time after activation of your WebPass.

Step 2 — Log in to PEPRS

PEPRS webpage: secure.calrecycle.ca.gov/PEPRS. Log in to PEPRS using your WebPass account information. After signing in, you will be taken to a welcome page.

Select your entity type. A ‘noticing entity’ is any entity that notifies CalRecycle about the categorically excluded materials for food and agricultural commodity packaging. Noticing entities may not have reporting requirements, while producers with reporting or registration obligations can access the notice form in their profile under the ‘Application Submission’ tab. Step 3 — Register as a Producer in PEPRS

Start your Packaging EPR Producer Registration. Provide information in line with [14 CCR section 18980.10\(a\)\(1\)](#) such as legal entity name, **Federal Employer Identification Number (EIN)**² or a **Customs Assigned Importer Number (CAIN)**³, primary contact information, and business and mailing addresses. If preferred, also provide alternative contact information.

² If the producer does not hold a Federal EIN, visit [Internal Revenue Service | get an EIN Webpage](#) for more information.

³ CAIN is a unique identifier issued by U.S. Customs and Border Protection if a foreign importer without a Federal EIN is the producer.

Step 4 — Submit an application

After registration, producers should acknowledge that they have read the information regarding the California Public Records Act and protection of trade secrets (see Figure 1).

Any information submitted through PEPRS are public records subject to disclosure under the California Public Records Act (Division 10 of Title 1 of the Government Code, commencing with Section 7920.000). Applicants may, however, include an attachment identifying portions of their application that they contend contain trade secrets entitled to protection against disclosure, and contact information for the person to be contacted regarding disclosures as described in Section 18980.14 of Title 14, CCR. All portions that do not contain trade secrets (including portions improperly claimed to do so) will be subject to mandatory disclosure under the Public Records Act.

After checking the box, options to comply with the Act will be available to the producer. Once the information is submitted and acknowledgement of the Public Records Act is checked, the producer registration process is complete.

After checking the box, review the options listed for the next steps to comply with the Act. Select one that applies or navigate to the Application Submission tab in the Producer Profile and click the applicable option to start your application process.

Information on Application Submissions

PEPRS Application Limitations:

PEPRS does not allow a producer to submit both Small Producer Exemption, and Independent Producer applications at the same time. Likewise, if you clicked “affiliated with PRO” because you are a participant producer and opted to be a ‘reporting entity’ to complete your own registration with CalRecycle, you cannot submit a Small Producer Exemption or Independent Producer application.

Once you start an application, you can either save and edit it later, delete it if it is no longer needed, or submit it to CalRecycle with all the required information.

Information Required for Small Producer Exemption and Independent Producer Applications:

The following lists summarize the required information for Small Producer Exemption and Independent Producer applications, as seen on the forms, but are not exhaustive lists:

Small Producer Exemption Application

1. If applicable, provide California Corporation or LLC number.
2. Provide contact information for the person completing the application.
3. Enter the amount of total gross annual sales (U.S. dollar) in California, as found on the most recent calendar year's tax returns.

Note 1: Provide proof of sales: Upload CDTF-401-A, or any form filed with the federal (IRS) or State of California (Franchise Tax Board) taxing authority for the most recent calendar year. If you do not have a recent tax return, provide audited financial statements. Acceptable documentation may include:

- An Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) report or ledger report identifying sales attributed to California (ship-to or benefit received in California).
 - Corroborating documents such as carrier delivery records, marketplace-generated California summaries, and/or payment processor reports.
 - Balance sheets.
 - Income and/or cash flow statements.
 - A signed attestation (or CPA letter) certifying the California-only gross sales and the methodologies used to determine those amounts.
4. Enter type of business activities: retail, wholesale, other. If 'other' is checked describe the business activities.
 5. Enter and describe how the business is conducted; online and/or physical location.
 6. Describe the types of products the business sells, offers for sale, or distributes in the state.
 7. Describe the extent to which the business acquires products from out-of-state suppliers.
 8. Describe the degree to which you own the brands or trademarks associated with the products your business sells, offers for sale, or distributes.

Note 2: May include any documentation, such as trademark registration certificates.

9. Upload any necessary documentation to justify the basis of qualification for the small producer exemption. If applicable, upload a document regarding protection of trade secrets (see Figure 1).

Independent Producer Application

1. Provide contact information for the person completing the application.
2. Provide information on the type of business activities conducted.
3. If a licensee, provide the necessary information regarding the license, such as: mark, serial number, license number, registration number, registration date, and status.
4. Enter and describe how the business is conducted, online and/or at a physical location.

5. Identify covered material categories (CMCs) for all covered material that the business sells, offers for sale, or distributes in California.

Note 1: The latest published CMC list will be available in the system.

Note 2: For details on how to identify material class, type and form, review the latest Covered Material Categories Producer Reporting Guidance document on the [SB 54 Covered Material Categories List Webpage](#).

6. To qualify as an Independent Producer, the producer must meet criteria described under [Public Resources Code section 42051\(b\)\(2\)\(A\)\(i\) through \(iii\)](#) or demonstrate a recycling rate of 65% for three consecutive years prior to January 1, 2027, and on and after that date demonstrate a recycling rate of at or over 70% annually. The producer will select the option that satisfies the requirement. Upload any necessary justification.

Note 3: If your covered material and CMC are made exclusively of plastic or are a nonplastic material with a plastic component, you can choose to demonstrate either option. If your covered material and CMC are nonplastic or without any plastic component, you can only demonstrate the recycling rate requirement.

Note 4: If you choose to demonstrate the recycling rate and have more than one CMC, you must upload a document that demonstrates each CMC's recycling rate separately, as required, for three consecutive years, including calculations and methodology.

7. Upload any necessary documentation as described above. If applicable, upload a document regarding protection of trade secrets (see Figure 1).
