Statutory & Regulatory Obligations

1. Public Resources Code (PRC) section 42060.5

- Requires all Local Jurisdictions (LJs – as defined in [PRC 42041\(m\)](#)) and Recycling Service Providers (RSPs) to collect all covered materials deemed *Recyclable* and *Compostable* on the Covered Material Categories (CMC) List
- Requires CalRecycle to establish an exemption process for materials “not practicable” to include in collection/recycling programs.
- Allows a county board of supervisors of a *Rural County* or *Rural Jurisdiction* (as defined in PRC 42649.8) to adopt a resolution to exempt those entities from the requirements of this section.

Statutory & Regulatory Obligations

1. 14 CCR section 18980.11

- Requires all LJs and RSPs to collect material no later than the date CalRecycle approves the PRO's Plan.
- Any updates to the CMC List do not impact collection obligations until at least 1-year after the update was made.
- LJs or RSPs can either use 1-year time to get ready to comply or apply for an extension or exemption for those new CMCs.

Statutory & Regulatory Obligations

1. 14 CCR section 18980.11.1

- Describes the exemption process for LJs and RSPs.
- Requires exemption to first be submitted to PRO for up to 90-day review.
- Following PRO review, exemptions are submitted to CalRecycle.
- If approved, exemptions are valid for 2-years (and can be renewed).

Statutory & Regulatory Obligations

1. 14 CCR section 18980.11.2

- Requires a *Rural County* or *Rural Jurisdiction* that has adopted a resolution to exempt that entity from collection requirements to provide a copy to CalRecycle within 14 calendar days of the adoption date.
- If those entities do not meet the definition of a *Rural County* or *Rural Jurisdiction*, they shall not be exempt from collection requirements.

Exemption Process

All under one location - PEPRS

- **Packaging Extended Producer Responsibility System (PEPRS) will allow LJs or RSPs to**
 - **Provide an exemption request to PROs and independent producers**
 - **Submit an exemption application to CalRecycle**

LJ or RSP submits

- 1) 14 CCR section 18980.11.1(d) requires LJs or RSPs to submit the application first to all PROs and independent producers (if any).
- 2) LJ or RSP submits the request pursuant to 14 CCR section 18980.11.1(c)(1) to (4) requirements.

PRO and Independent
Producers (if any)

- 1) Pursuant to 14 CCR section 18980.11.1(d) PRO and IPs to review the request in 90 days.
- 2) 14 CCR section 18980.11.1(d)(3) allows all the parties to extend the review period if agreed upon which is allowed in PEPRS.
- 3) 14 CCR section 18980.11.1(c)(5) dictates LJs or RSPs to include the written notices and comments, if any, from PROs and IPs.

1) LJ or RSP will have access to the original extension or exemption request to edit or submit.

2) LJ or RSP submits the request pursuant to 14 CCR section 18980.11.1(c) including the written notices and comments, if any, received from PRO or IPs and an explanation of how the applicant addressed them or why it did not do so.

* If LJ or RSP concludes that the request is no longer required to be submitted because the alternative pathway that is provided by PRO pursuant to PRC 42060.4(b) provides a compliance pathway, then LJ or RSP can withdraw the application in PEPRS by providing a reason.

Application Requirements

- **To demonstrate something is *impracticable* for collection, we recommend reviewing 14 CCR, section 18980.11.1(c). This requires a description with supporting documentation of the following:**
 - *The specific local conditions, circumstances, and challenges that make it impracticable for the local jurisdiction or recycling service provider to include the specified covered material or covered material categories in their collection and recycling programs.*
 - *The description must demonstrate that the identified material cannot practicably be included in the collection and recycling programs.*
 - *The description must also address, at a minimum, the necessity of the exemption with respect to the following considerations: program efficacy; technological or economic limitations; legal restrictions or requirements; effects on the environment, environmental justice, worker health and safety; public health; hazardous waste generation; and transportation safety.*

Requirements of Recycling Service Providers

- Pursuant to 14 CCR 18980.11.1(c)(2), if the applicant is a recycling service provider, it must notify each local jurisdiction to which it provides services that would be affected by the extension or exemption of its intent to request the exemption. The applicant shall obtain the following information and include it in the application:
 - Contact information (name, phone number, and email address) for an individual representing the local jurisdiction. The individual identified must be authorized by the jurisdiction to receive all communications regarding the request.
 - A description of each local jurisdiction's involvement in the application process, including, at minimum, when the applicant notified the local jurisdiction of the intent to submit the application.

Exemption Submissions to CalRecycle

- Once the previous steps are completed PEPRS will assist LJs or RSPs to,
 - Edit the original request reviewed by the PRO or independent producers, if necessary.
 - LJs or RSPs to submit the application to CalRecycle or withdraw it with a justification.
- CalRecycle
 - May request additional information, if necessary.
 - Will notify all interested parties about the status of the application.
 - And will provide a list of approved exemptions on public website.

Bulk Exemption Submissions

- **PEPRS provides flexibility for LJs or RSPs to submit bulk exemptions in any format they need, if all the following applies.**
 - The applicable Covered Material Categories (CMCs) and related covered materials are the same for each Jurisdiction.
 - The applicable CMCs and related covered materials listed clearly in the bulk application document.
 - The necessity and justification of the exemption request for each LJ per each CMC or covered material are the same.
 - Lastly, all the information required under 14 CCR section 18980.11.1(c)(3), (4) and (5)* included in bulk submission document.

Packaging EPR Contact Request

Packaging Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) Contact: These individuals may include local jurisdiction employees, joint powers of authority (JPA) staff, and also other external partners of the jurisdiction. These individuals may receive correspondence regarding requirements of California's [Plastic Pollution Prevention and Packaging Producer Responsibility Act](#). Each local jurisdiction or regional agency (RA) can submit two contacts as a Packaging EPR Contact who will be required to create an account in PEPRS.

RA members may jointly select a Packaging EPR Contact by selecting the Regional Agency and selecting all included local jurisdictions.

Forms need to be completed and submitted to CalRecycle per local jurisdiction or RA. All fields must be completed and required.

Local Jurisdiction is defined as a City, county, city/count, regional agency or a special solid waste district.

- CalRecycle is requesting local jurisdictions to identify a Packaging EPR representative to be assigned in PEPRS.
- Submit a Packaging EPR Contact Request form to identify an authorized local jurisdiction representative who:
 - May submit an exemption request and the exemption application (as well as renewal);
 - Get application notifications and updates;
 - For an application submitted by the local jurisdiction or
 - For an application submitted by a recycling service provider
 - Will review the submitted application with the PRO.

Verification of Packaging EPR Contact

- For validation purposes, CalRecycle will verify the information provided in the forms and assign the Packaging EPR Contacts to local jurisdiction.
- Once assigned, the following notification email will be sent out to each contact.

Hello [Contact Name and Last Name],

This email address has been associated with the **Packaging Extended Producer Responsibility System (PEPRS)**. With this association, you may log in to PEPRS using your CalRecycle WebPass and manage all local jurisdictions linked to your account. Once available in PEPRS, the **Local Jurisdiction/Recycling Service Provider Extension or Exemption Application (Application)** may be submitted either by the Packaging EPR contact or by a Recycling Service Provider (RSP), pursuant to 14 CCR, section 18980.11(c). If an RSP submits the Application, the Packaging EPR Contact will serve as the "individual representing the local jurisdiction," as required under 14 CCR, section 18980.11.1(c)(2)(A), and will receive notifications regarding the application status. PEPRS will assist local jurisdictions throughout the process—from providing the Application to the Producer Responsibility Organization and Independent Producer, through submission to CalRecycle.

RSP– Packaging EPR Contact

➤ How RSPs can benefit from LJs using Packaging EPR Contact Form:

- Allows the RSP filling out an application to identify the appropriate LJ contact when submitting an application on their behalf.

List all local jurisdictions to which the applicant provides services that would be affected by the exemption. For each local jurisdiction, provide contact information for an individual representing the local jurisdiction and a description of their involvement in the application process, including, at a minimum, the date on which the applicant gave notice of its intent to submit this exemption application.

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Exemption Process in PEPRS

- Communication between the parties can be carried out using the portal, if choose to do so.
- Documents can be shared between the parties via PEPRS, if choose to do so.
- Documentation of the final comments received from the PRO including the alternative means per objection will be recorded in PEPRS.
- Notification of next steps will be sent to applicant when the review is completed or the review timeline ends whichever comes first.
- LJ and RSPs will have a database for list of requests and the final status of requests on their dashboard.
