Based on the findings contained in the City of Nevada City (Jurisdiction) Compliance Evaluation Findings Report, and as required by Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations (14 CCR) Section 18996.2, CalRecycle is issuing the Jurisdiction a Notice of Violation (NOV) for the following requirements:

Article 8

14 CCR Section 18989.2. Model Water Efficient Landscape Ordinance

The Jurisdiction failed to provide evidence of adopting a compliant Model Water Efficient Landscape ordinance.

Article 12

14 CCR Section 18993.3. Recycled Content Paper Procurement Requirements

The Jurisdiction failed to provide evidence of compliance with recycled content paper procurement requirements.

14 CCR Section 18993.4. Recordkeeping Requirements for Recycled Content Paper Procurement

The Jurisdiction failed to include all records required in 14 CCR Section 18993.4 in the Implementation Record.

Article 14

14 CCR Section 18995.2. Implementation Record and Recordkeeping Requirements

The Jurisdiction failed to include all records required in 14 CCR Section 18993.4 in the Implementation Record.

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14 CCR Section 18995.3. Jurisdiction Investigation of Complaints of Alleged Violations

The Jurisdiction failed to provide evidence that it met all complaint and complaint investigation requirements.

The Jurisdiction is required to comply with the noted requirements within 90 days of the date of issuance of the NOV. Please note that if the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) finds that additional time is necessary for the Jurisdiction to come into full compliance, CalRecycle shall grant an extension for up to a total of 180 days from the date of issuance of the NOV.
