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12. Legal Description of Facility:

The legal description of this facility is contained in Section 2 of the Joint Technical Document (JTD), revised March 30, 2020.

13. Findings:

- a. This permit is consistent with the Ventura County Integrated Waste Management Plan, which was approved by the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) on 8/11/2010. The location of the facility is identified in the Countywide Siting Element, pursuant to Public Resources Code (PRC), Section 50001(a).
- b. This permit is consistent with the standards adopted by CalRecycle, pursuant to PRC 44010.
- c. The design and operation of the facility is consistent with the State Minimum Standards for Solid Waste Handling and Disposal as determined by the enforcement agency, pursuant to PRC 44009.
- d. The project is in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). On 7/19/2011, the Ventura County Board of Supervisors approved a modification to Conditional Use Permit (CUP) 3142 (Case No. LU07-0048) and certified the Environmental Impact Report (EIR). A Notice of Determination was filed with the State Clearinghouse (SCH #2007121148) on 7/20/11 in compliance with PRC Sections 21152. On 3/23/2020, the Ventura County Planning Director adopted the Addendum to the EIR, granting Minor Modification to CUP 3142 (Case No. PL19-0043), as modified by LU07-0048. The EIR and Addendum to the EIR describes and supports the design and operation, which will be authorized by the issuance of this permit.
- e. The Ventura County Board of Supervisors, by approving Major Modification No. 8 of CUP 3142, and certifying the Environmental Document has adopted a mitigation and monitoring plan pursuant to Public Resources Code (PRC) Section 21081.6.
- f. This facility shall comply with all mitigation measures given in any certified or adopted environmental document that are within the authority of the LEA pursuant to the PRC Section 21081.6 Nothing in this permit shall prevent the operator from complying with any notices and orders issued by any responsible agency designated by the Lead Agency to monitor the mitigation measures contained in any of the documents referenced within this permit.

14. Prohibitions:

The permittee is prohibited from accepting the following wastes: Hazardous, radioactive, medical, liquid, designated, or other wastes requiring special treatment or handling, except as identified in the JTD and approved amendments thereto and as approved by the enforcement agency and other federal, state, and local agencies.

Any changes in the design or operation of this facility that may result in an activity or condition that may have a significant effect on the public health, safety, and the environment is prohibited.

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16. Self Monitoring:

The owner/operator shall submit the results of all self monitoring programs to the Enforcement Agency within 30 days of the end of the reporting period (*for example, 1st quarter = January – March, the report is due by April 30, etc. Information required on an annual basis shall be submitted with the 4th quarter monitoring report, unless otherwise stated*).

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17. Local Enforcement Agency (LEA) Conditions:

A. Standard Requirements:

1. This facility shall comply with state minimum standards for solid waste handling and disposal pursuant to applicable sections of Titles 14 and 27 of the California Code of Regulations (CCR). Nothing in this permit shall prevent the facility operator from complying with any other pertinent federal, state, or local requirement or enactment. Nothing in the conditions listed herein shall be construed as relieving the facility operator, or designee from the obligation of obtaining any required permits, licenses, or other clearances or complying with any orders, laws, regulations, reports or requirements mandated by any other regulatory or enforcement agency.
2. Additional information concerning the design and operation of the facility shall be furnished upon request and within the time frame specified by the LEA.
3. The use of Alternate Daily Cover (ADC) for use as daily cover shall be limited to materials as outlined in the JTD and as defined in CCR Title 27, Section 20690 et al. and must be approved by the LEA in writing prior to use.
4. This permit is subject to review by the LEA and may be temporarily suspended or revoked at any time for sufficient cause.
5. The LEA reserves the right to suspend or modify waste receiving and handling operations when deemed necessary due to an emergency, a potential health hazard, or the creation of a public nuisance.
6. Any change that would cause the design or operation of the facility not to conform to the terms and conditions of this permit is prohibited. Such a change may be considered a significant change, requiring a permit revision. In no case shall the operator implement any change without first submitting a written notice of the proposed change, in the form of an RFI amendment, to the LEA at least 180 days in advance of the change.
7. A copy of this permit and current JTD shall be maintained at the facility.

B. Particular Requirements:

1. Approved materials used as ADC shall be stockpiled and utilized in a manner that will prevent the creation of excessive dust.
2. At the discretion of the LEA, compacted soil or approved ADC shall be used as daily cover when high winds make it impractical to use geosynthetic tarps as ADC.
3. At the discretion of the LEA, additional landfill gas monitoring probes shall be installed for detection of landfill gas and gas migration. If on-site landfill gas or offsite subsurface landfill gas migration occurs in concentrations in excess of allowable limits set forth in CCR Title 27, Section 20918 et seq. the operator shall institute additional landfill gas control measures as approved by the LEA.
4. The operator shall maintain a log of special/unusual occurrences. This log shall include, but is not limited to, fires, explosions, the discharge and disposition of hazardous or unpermitted wastes, and significant injuries, accidents or property damage. Each log entry shall be accompanied by a summary of any actions taken by the operator to mitigate the occurrence. The log shall be available to site personnel and the LEA at all times.
5. The maximum permitted daily tonnage for this facility is 12,000 tons per day (TPD) for all incoming materials, with a maximum permitted weekly tonnage of 64,750 tons per week. Of the 12,000 TPD of incoming materials, Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) is limited to 8000 TPD and Recyclables are limited to 8000 TPD. The facility shall not receive more than this amount without a revision of this permit.
6. The CDI processing facility shall comply with CCR Title 14, Section 17380 et seq. and the CDI Transfer Processing Report found in Appendix H of the JTD.
7. The green waste processing operation shall comply with CCR Title 14, Section 17850 et seq. and the Greenwaste Operations

Plan found in Appendix H of the JTD.

8. Operator shall implement operational controls consistent with the Odor Impact Minimization Plan at the greenwaste processing areas to minimize odor generated as a result of greenwaste processing activities or as directed by the LEA.
