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12. Legal Description of Facility:

Approximately 70 acres in the E ½ of Section 32 and all of Section 31; T.S.R.2.W, S.B.B. & M. Approximately 147 acres in the N ½ of the W ½ of Section 5, approximately 218 acres in the E ½ Section 5, and approximately 83 acres in the W ½ of Section 4; T.3.S.R.2.W, S.B.B. & M.

13. Findings:

- a. This permit is consistent with the Riverside County Integrated Waste Management Plan, which was approved by CalRecycle and amended on September 23, 1998 and August 4, 2004. The location of the facility is identified in the Countywide Siting Element, pursuant to Public Resources Code (PRC), Section 50001(a).
- b. This permit is consistent with the standards adopted by CalRecycle, pursuant to PRC 44010.
- c. The design and operation of the facility is consistent with the State Minimum Standards for Solid Waste Handling and Disposal as determined by the enforcement agency, pursuant to PRC 44009.
- d. The Riverside County Fire Department has determined that the facility is in conformance with applicable fire standards, pursuant to PRC, 44151.
- e. Addendum No. 1, Badlands Landfill Solid Waste Facility Permit Revision, Mitigated Negative Declaration for Environmental Assessment for "Badlands 2010-01" was approved the Riverside County Board of Supervisors on December 15, 2015 and filed with the Riverside County Clerk Recorder on December 15, 2015.

14. Prohibitions:

The permittee is prohibited from accepting the following wastes:

Hazardous, radioactive, medical, designated, or other wastes requiring special treatment or handling, except as identified in the JTD and approved amendments thereto and as approved by the enforcement agency.

The permittee is additionally prohibited from the following activities:

- a. Disposal of waste beyond the maximum daily tonnage
- b. Acceptance of any material after the proposed grade is met
- d. Burning of wastes
- e. Scavenging

16. Self Monitoring:

The owner/operator shall submit the results of all self monitoring programs to the Enforcement Agency within 30 days of the end of the reporting period. For reports due monthly, the report is due on the 10th day of the following month or the first working day thereafter. For reports due quarterly, the report is due by the end of the 30th day of the following month. Information required on an annual basis shall be submitted within 45 days of the end of the reporting period.

d. Copies of all written complaints regarding this facility and the operator's actions taken to resolve these complaints.	Monthly
e. Results of the landfill gas monitoring program.	Quarterly
f. Wet weather preparedness report/winter operations plan.	Annually
g. Fill sequencing plan for the coming year.	Annually
h. Remaining site capacity.	Annually
i. Maintain Daily tonnage records for ADC	Monthly

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17. Enforcement Agency (EA) Conditions:

- a. The operator shall comply with all State Minimum Standards for solid waste handling and disposal as specified in Title 27 California Code of Regulations.
- b. The operator shall maintain a log of special/unusual occurrences. This log shall include, but is not limited to, fires, explosions, the discharge and disposition of hazardous or unpermitted wastes, and significant injuries, accidents or property damage. Each log entry shall be accompanied by a summary of any actions taken by the operator to mitigate the occurrence. The log shall be available to site personnel and the EA at all times.
- c. Additional information concerning the design and operation of the facility shall be furnished upon request and within the time frame specified by the EA.
- d. The maximum permitted daily tonnage for this facility is 4500 tons per day and shall not receive more than this amount without a revision of this permit. Up to 300 tons per day may also be processed for beneficial reuse.
- e. This permit is subject to review by the EA and may be temporarily suspended or revoked at any time by the EA for sufficient cause, in accordance with Division 30 of the Public Resource Code, Part 4, Chapter 4, Article 2, Sections 44305 et seq and associated regulations.
- f. Any change that would cause the design or operation of the facility not to conform to the terms and conditions of this permit is prohibited. Such a change may be considered a significant change, requiring a permit revision. In no case shall the operator implement any change without first submitting a written notice of the proposed change, in the form of an RFI amendment, to the EA at least 180 days in advance of the change.
- g. A copy of this permit and the current Joint Technical Document shall be maintained at the facility.
- h. This facility may accept tires for recycling. Single tires comingled in waste stream and not easily removed from the waste stream are allowed to be buried.
- i. This facility is permitted to accept the following waste types as described in the JTD.
- j. This facility may accept scrap metal, white goods/appliances, E-waste, Universal waste, sharps and Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) collection for recycling.
- k. The operator shall utilize specific safety procedures and implement health and safety measures as described in the JTD.
- l. This site shall maintain a formal hazardous waste monitoring program as stated in the JTD. The operator shall provide an employee training program to address the recognition, and proper response to hazardous material incidents.
