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12. Legal Description of Facility:

SE ¼ of Section 23 and Northern ½ of Section 26 T13N R7W Mount Diablo baseline & meridian including assessor parcels as described in Section 2/1 and Table 1 of the Joint Technical Document dated March 2021.

13. Findings:

- a. This permit is consistent with the Lake County Integrated Waste Management Plan, which was approved by CalRecycle in 1996.
- b. The location of the facility is identified in the Countywide Siting Element, pursuant to Public Resources Code (PRC), Section 50001.
- c. This permit is consistent with the standards adopted by CalRecycle, pursuant to PRC 44010.
- d. The design and operation of the facility is consistent with the State Minimum Standards for solid waste handling and disposal as determined by the local enforcement agency (LEA).
- e. The environmental documentation (CEQA Notice of Determination dated June 23, 2020, State Clearinghouse #2020010546) is consistent with and supports the proposed permit and joint technical document (JTD dated March 2021).

14. Prohibitions:

The permittee is prohibited from accepting the following wastes:

Hazardous waste, radioactive waste, medical waste (as defined in Chapter 6.1, Division 20 of the Health and Safety Code), liquid, designated, dead animals, or other wastes requiring special treatment or handling, except as identified in the Joint Technical Document (dated March 2021) and approved amendments thereto and as approved by the enforcement agency.

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16. Self Monitoring:

- a. The owner/operator shall submit the results of all self monitoring programs to the Enforcement Agency within 30 days of the end of the reporting period (*for example, 1st quarter = January – March, the report is due by April 30, monthly reports are due by the end of the next month, etc.. Information required on an annual basis shall be submitted with the 4th quarter monitoring report, unless otherwise stated.*)

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17. Local Enforcement Agency (LEA) Conditions:

- a. The operator shall comply with all State Minimum Standards for solid waste handling and disposal as specified in Title 27, California Code of Regulations.
- b. The operator shall maintain a log of special/unusual occurrences. This log shall include, but is not limited to, fires, explosions, the discharge and disposition of hazardous or unpermitted wastes, and significant injuries, accidents or property damage. Each log entry shall be accompanied by a summary of any actions taken by the operator to mitigate the occurrence. The log shall be available to site personnel and the LEA at all times.
- c. Additional information concerning the design and operation of the facility shall be furnished upon request and within the time frame specified by the LEA.
- d. The maximum permitted daily tonnage for this facility is 200 tons per day (daily average calculated weekly), and shall not receive more than this amount without a revision of this permit.
- e. This permit is subject to review by the LEA and may be temporarily suspended or revoked at any time by the LEA for sufficient cause, in accordance with Division 30 of the Public Resource Code, Part 4, Chapter 4, Article 2, Sections 44305 et seq and associated regulations.
- f. The LEA reserves the right to suspend or modify waste receiving and handling operations due to an emergency, a potential health hazard, or the creation of a public nuisance.
- g. Any change that would cause the design or operation of the facility not to conform to the terms and conditions of this permit is prohibited. Such a change may be considered a significant change, requiring a permit revision. In no case shall the operator implement any change without first submitting a written notice of the proposed change, in the form of a JTD amendment, to the LEA at least 180 days in advance of the change.
- h. A copy of this permit shall be maintained at the facility.
