- 12. Legal Description of Facility:** The legal description of this facility is contained in the Report of Facility Information, dated January 23 and is identified as Stanislaus County Assessor's Parcel Number 050-006-026; Section 22, Township 5 South, Range 10 East, Mount Diablo Base and Meridian.

13. Findings:

- a. The location of the facility is identified in the Nondisposal Facility Element, pursuant to Public Resources Code (PRC), Section 50001(a).
- b. This permit is consistent with the standards adopted by CalRecycle, pursuant to PRC 44010.
- c. The design and operation of the facility is consistent with the State Minimum Standards for Solid Waste Handling and Disposal as determined by the enforcement agency, pursuant to PRC 44009.
- d. Upon a significant change in design or operation from that described herein, this permit is subject to revocation or suspension. The permit findings and conditions are integral parts of this permit and supersede the conditions of any previously issued solid waste facility permit.
- e. A Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND), SCH #1990021078, was adopted by the Stanislaus County Department of Environmental Resources on December 18, 1990. A Notice of Determination was filed with the State Clearinghouse on December 18, 1990. A Mitigated Negative Declaration, SCH #2008042089, was adopted by the City of Turlock on June 20, 2008. A Notice of Determination was filed with the State Clearinghouse on June 20, 2008. The MNDs describe and support the design and operation which will be authorized by the issuance of this permit.

14. Prohibitions: The permittee is prohibited from accepting the following wastes:

Hazardous, radioactive, medical, liquid, designated, or other wastes requiring special treatment or handling, except as identified in the Report of Facility Information and approved amendments thereto and as approved by the enforcement agency.

16. Self-Monitoring: The owner/operator shall submit the results of all self-monitoring programs to the Enforcement Agency. Quarterly reports shall be submitted within 30 days of the end of the reporting period unless otherwise stated.

- a. The types and quantities (in tons) of waste, including separated or comingled recyclables, entering the facility each day. Reporting Frequency – Quarterly
- b. The number and types of vehicles using the facility per day. Reporting Frequency – Quarterly
- c. Results of the hazardous waste load checking program, including the quantities and types of hazardous wastes, medical wastes or otherwise prohibited wastes found in the waste stream and the disposition of these materials. Reporting Frequency – Quarterly
- d. Notification to the enforcement agency via telephone or electronic mail of any special occurrences, such as fires, explosions, earthquakes, significant injuries, accidents or property damage, and all measures taken to address the incident. Reporting Frequency – Within 24 hours of the Event
- e. Copies of all written complaints regarding this facility. Reporting Frequency – Within 24 hours of the Complaint

17. Enforcement Agency (EA) Conditions:

- a. The operator shall comply with all State Minimum Standards for solid waste handling and disposal as specified in Title 14, California Code of Regulations (CCR).
- b. The operator shall maintain a log of special/unusual occurrences. This log shall include, but is not limited to, fires, explosions, the discharge and disposition of hazardous or unpermitted wastes, significant injuries, accidents, and property damage. Each log entry shall be accompanied by a summary of any actions taken by the operator to mitigate the occurrence. The log shall be available to site personnel and the EA during operating hours.
- c. Additional information concerning the design and operation of the facility shall be furnished upon request and within the time frame specified by the EA.
- d. The maximum permitted daily tonnage for this facility is 1,872 tons per day and shall not receive more than this amount without a revision of this permit.
- e. This permit is subject to review by the EA and may be temporarily suspended or revoked at any time by the EA for sufficient cause, in accordance with Division 30 of the Public Resources Code, Part 4, Chapter 4, Article 2, Sections 44305 et seq. and associated regulations.
- f. The EA reserves the right to suspend or modify waste receiving and handling operations when deemed necessary due to an emergency, a potential health hazard, or the creation of a public nuisance.
- g. Any change that would cause the design or operation of the facility not to conform to the terms and conditions of this permit is prohibited. Such a change may be considered a significant change, requiring a permit revision. In no case shall the operator implement any change without first submitting a written notice of the proposed change, in the form of a Report of Facility Information amendment, to the EA at least 180 days in advance of the change.
- h. A copy of this Solid Waste Facility Permit and the most current approved TPR, and any approved amendments, shall be readily available to site personnel and EA upon request.
