## Recycling and Organics Recycling Guide for Schools

If you are receiving this, you have been identified as subject to California's mandatory recycling laws.

### Mandatory Recycling and Organics Recycling (MCR, MORe, and SB 1383)

- K-12 public and charter schools and school districts are required to recycle.\*
- Educate employees and students about organic waste prevention and how to properly recycle food and green materials, such as landscaping.

# SB 1383: Educating and Involving Schools to Achieve California's Recycling Goals and Feeding Hungry Californians

 This new requirement benefits local communities by diverting food to hungry Californians, including the 1 in 5 children in the state who do not have enough to eat.

### Requirements

 Starting January 1, 2024, local education agencies with an on-site food facility (like a school cafeteria) will be required to donate all edible food, that would otherwise be thrown away, to a food recovery organization.
