Project Summary: CalRecycle has edited the following summary to reflect the approved grant project: The City of Lancaster currently operates a Recycle-Only household hazardous waste collection facility and are in the process of becoming a permanent household hazardous waste collection facility. As we have crossed the threshold into a large quantity generator status we are in need of updating our infrastructure. To maximize the efficiency of our existing facility, the City is requesting grant funds to add a large concrete foundation area with curbing to the middle of our facility and add five outdoor hazardous waste storage bays to the area as well. Adding concrete to this space and creating the five HHW storage bays will maximize the potential of our existing property and meet the large quantity generator requirements for HHW collection, packing, and storage.

Project Summary: CalRecycle has edited the following summary to reflect the approved grant project: The proposed project will construct a permanent Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) facility for Corona and Riverside County residents to drop off waste not suitable for landfill disposal. The items to be collected include oil, paint, grease, batteries, medical "sharps," and electronic waste such as TVs, computers, and monitors. The City of Corona Maintenance Services Dept. (City), will be responsible for all site-improvements and construction activities and costs. The City owns the site and has approved zoning clearance and use of the site for a HHW facility. The Riverside County Dept. of Waste Resources (RCDWR) will be an operational partner, with oversight of equipment purchasing and funding for long-term facility operation (staff) and maintenance. The facility is targeted to collect more than 23,600 pounds of HHW each month.
